

# late-braking news

#### "Steak Your Claim"?

ith Spring just around the corner, that must mean—yes!—it's almost time for car-control clinics, autocrosses, and driver safety schools. To paraphrase Al Capone's famous line, "Register early and register often!"

Speaking of safety, if you're a BMW driver for the same reasons I am, then one of the traits you surely care about in the vehicle you drive is braking performance. After all, it's better to avoid an accident than try to survive it, right? It also makes them fun to drive. If you need proof of that, attend one of the events mentioned above. BMWs in general tend to be exemplary in the braking department—surprise, surprise. Conversely, what type of vehicle populates the other end of the stopping spectrum? It doesn't require a great leap of faith if you guess that it might be trucks and SUVs. When's the last time you heard an SUV owner say, "I bought an Excretion XLT because it has superior braking performance?" If image, first and foremost, sells this type of vehicle, then the penultimate over-compensator must be the Hummer, which one female Car and Driver (C/D) editor describes as, "The male equivalent of a push-up bra." The "all new" parts-bin-special Hummer H2, incidentally, was picked by Denver Post-News automotive writer Bud Wells as one of his '02 favorites, along with the Infiniti G35 and Mini. At least he got one out of three right.

Having just read *C/D*'s road test of the Hummer H2, I couldn't help but be taken aback by Bud Well's unqualified endorsement, "...so much softer and refined than the big Hummer, yet still plenty big and tough." How many would-be buyers are swayed by such chest-thumping praise? Big and tough apparently doesn't apply to brake discs and calipers, however. After all, who can see them to be impressed? Consider: in the October *C/D* summary of test vehicle statistics, the H2 finished—ta da!—dead last out of 139 vehicles in 70-0 mph braking distance, with a dismal recording of 244 feet. Interestingly, 16 models had 70-0 braking numbers of over 200 feet, with 75% of them falling in the "light truck" category including trucks, SUVs, and minivans. The worst BMW, out of eight models tested (including the X5, which is hardly your typical SUV), is the 745i at 175 ft.

So, is there really that much difference between 175 ft (745i) and 244 ft (H2)? 69 feet can't matter much, can it? As



If both vehicles were doing 70 mph and hit their brakes at the same time, at the point where the 745i is completely stopped the H2 would still be moving at 37 mph! Not to mention the fact that this beast also weighs *twice* as much as a 3-series Bimmer and costs as much as an M3, amazing though it may seem—on a per-pound basis, we're talking rump roast (think "big and tough") versus prime rib. Oh, and the M3's braking performance is within just two feet of the best performance of any vehicle *C/D* tested. Which one would *you* rather have behind you in a panic stop?

To put it bluntly, I consider it a disservice at best and irresponsible at worst to endorse unsafe vehicles like the H2. And what high honor did Bud Wells bestow on the M3? It won the title of, "Shiftiest move," for the SMG paddle-shifters. Fortunately, not many M3 buyers are likely to be influenced by such asinine metaphors one way or the other. If supposed "experts" like Wells can't discern such simple yet significant subtleties like this, then who in the vast sea of buyers will? With all the trucks and SUVs on the roads these days, my new motto is, "If you brake late, check your hind state!"

Looking to purchase a new BMW? You're in luck. BMW CCA has extended the Rewards Program through December 31, 2003; all vehicles qualify except the Z8. Check it out in your monthly *Roundel* or the BMW CCA website at <a href="http://www.bmwcca.org/services/svcfset.shtml">http://www.bmwcca.org/services/svcfset.shtml</a> The basic guidelines remain the same – one must be a member in good standing of the BMW CCA for at least one year continuously prior to purchase, and one must file the documentation within 60 days of taking delivery of the vehicle. We have not received the updated forms yet, but understand that BMW NA has also included the Z4 in the program. Anyone purchasing a Z4 after January 1, 2003 – and fulfilling the other program requirements can apply for the rebate.

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
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# car of the month

dealership in St. Louis, Missouri. It was a silver metallic 1999 E36 coupe with only 22,300 miles, just off lease, complete with a grey leather interior, sunroof, Harmon Kardon sound system and CD changer. To top it off, it was a Certified Pre-Owned car and still under the original factory warranty. It even had a factory extended warranty to 100,000 miles.

Gary and I decided that it looked good enough to buy a one-way plane ticket to nowhere. St. Louis here we come!

### Rocky Mountain Chapter BMW CCA 2003 Winter Autocross Series



March 22, 2003 will be the first of two, of the Rocky Mountain Chapter's winter autocrosses, at Bandimere Speedway. If you have not participated in an autocross before this will be a great opportunity to get comfortable and learn about this exciting sport. There will be no trophies, so all runs are for fun and non-competitive...unless you're looking for bragging rights. All runs will still be timed and documented, so you will know how you did on each run.

An autocross is both a social event and a driving event that will help sharpen your driving skills, it lets you compete for trophies, and explore the limits of your BMW's handling capabilities. Aside from running over a few cones, autocrossing need not be hard on your car. In fact, the fastest times come from the smoothest drivers. The real key to autocrossing is to walk the course as much as possible. Walking the course is permitted before the event begins. This will include a "rookie" walk, where an instructor will walk a group around the course and explain how to drive a good line, so show up early, if you can. We will have instructors available, though the day, to help you out.

This event is open to all BMW CCA members and their families. Beginners, convertibles and roadsters are welcome.

## Wandering...the Mali Way

alla-Yalla. Bambara (the language spoken in Mali) for "wandering about". What's so exciting about wandering around? Well, that depends upon whether or not you're in a MINI. And if you have 35 other new MINIs to wander around with, you have a downright good reason to write an article about it.

It all started at the Stegosaurus lot, the Park 'n' Ride area off of I-70 at the beginning of the foothills to the majestic Rocky Mountains. Participants showed up from all over Colorado and Wyoming. The event had been shrouded in secrecy to keep an advantage from being held by anyone, so no one really knew what we were about to embark upon. What made the morning even more mysterious was the set of directions we had received: Bring a navigator, a pen, and 51 cents. What for??

We soon found out. The morning was perfect for a mystery – brisk but not cold ... and foggy. *Very* foggy. After some social interaction among MINI owners and onlookers' awe at the ensemble of so many cars (some thought the MINIs were some sort of newfangled electric car or some other such reverse alien engineered technology), there was a brief driver/navigator meeting. The participants were given their first clue at what the day would hold in the form of 22 questions to answer while navigating a predetermined course using a separate set of directions – and I use that term loosely. The directions consisted of 26 steps with no map, just "lefts" and "rights".

The cars were sent off in pairs starting at 8:31 AM., and the confusion ensued at approximately 8:32. We motorers didn't know it, but there were two sets of instructions – a clockwise and a counterclockwise – so the cars took different tacks straight away.

Once under way, some of us headed up Lookout Mountain in search of life's answers (or the answers to 22 questions). For those of you who have never traveled this road, it is one of my all-time favorites, with switchbacks, decreasing radius, increasing radius, off-camber, gravel covered, cliffstrewn road all the way to the top. Once on the road again, the navigators searched for more of those hard-to-find life's answers – "What's Coney Island famous for?", "What does the phone number 674-0830 belong to?" ... Did I miss the last



turn?? One question continued to nag me personally, though — "What company owns the blue skyscrapers with white roofs in Tiny Town?" I know the area and for the life of me I could not think of any blue skyscrapers. I just had to have faith, though, and we pressed on with that question still niggling at the back of my mind.

Our intrepid Yallers then tested the off-road prowess of the MINI. That's right, the MINI is a regular Rubicon master! Bring on the Jeep! The spookiness continued as we left the pavement to discover who was buried beneath the flagpole in Evergreen Cemetery. A loop of dirt and rock brought us to the answer, and what an interesting sight to see MINIs all lined up in the dirt! World Rally Championship – MINI is ready.

The sun broke out, and those who haven't had the chance to explore the Rocky Mountain roads, you are missing the point of the exercise! We thought we were lost for most of it, but the driving was spectacular. And just when you thought you had it figured out, another MINI would fly by in the opposite direction. Read those directions again!

Finally we arrived at the "MINI Town" – Tiny Town. Many of the answers made themselves known, but for me, an epiphany! We walked down the main street and saw the miniature boarding house, storefronts, the theatre, and then, the SKYSCRAPERS! Port-a-potties – blue with white tops!!! The few of us who had gathered at Tiny Town (others were still lost in the woods) saw the light together and just about fell over with uncontrolled laughter on the road.

There was a final beautiful canyon drive back into Morrison to meet for lunch (which for me included a rather spirited romp with a Porsche 911 trying to keep up with the MINI – all at legal speeds, of course!).

If you are planning to drive in the Ralph Schomp BMW Spring Driving School, this is a mandatory event, unless you have previously completed the course.



If there is any doubt about the condition of your equipment, have it replaced (although brand new tires are not automatically recommended). The inspection can be completed by your mechanic (expect a charge) or there will be a free technical inspection on Saturday, April 19, from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM at the Car Control Clinic.

Hotels nearest the track are located south on Tower Road near DIA. Some of the available hotels are La Quinta, Holiday Inn Express, Marriott Courtyard, Red Roof, Fairfield Inn and Hampton Inn.

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### Spring Tech Tips

W e strongly recommend that a professional workshop performs your technical inspection for the spring driving school if:

- This is your first driving school.
- You are not very mechanically inclined.
- You drive a car that has a less than perfect maintenance record.
- · You can afford a professional inspection.

Otherwise, there is a free technical inspection provided by the Rocky Mountain Chapter's volunteer tech inspectors. This is certainly less thorough than a professional inspection. For example, the volunteers cannot hoist your car up, so they cannot check the condition of wheel bearings, drive shaft, differential and the level of fluid leaks.

The responsibility to provide a safe and mechanically sound vehicle at the driver's school is totally the responsibility of the driver. The driver signs the form to that effect. The club volunteers are there merely to assist.

In recent past, Bimmer Haus (720-566-0521) has provided participants with excellent professional service for the driving school. But you can choose where to take your car for a tech inspection.

If you bring your car to the free inspection at the safety school on April 19<sup>th</sup> 2003, and you have not bled the brakes after the first of the New Year, then you will fail the inspection; guaranteed. Brake bleeding for the previous school is too long ago. So flush, or bleed your brakes.

Your brake pads must also be in good condition with more than 50% life left. Thin brake pads will fail the tech inspection and they could fail on the track too.

If you have street tires and also a set of dedicated track tires, then please bring the track tires to the tech inspection so that they can be examined.

Any questions, then please call me at (303) 426-6800. Also, if you desire to discuss club policy regarding convertibles at the driving school then I can guide you on this subject also.

# WARNING Your brakes will fail in about a month!



# 2003 Ice Gymkhana



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# High-Tech Helmet for Ralf Schumacher in 2003

n Indianapolis, the BMW Technology Office and the BMW Group's design firm Designworks/USA demonstrated an innovative miniature helmet-mounted head-up display system. Proposed for use in Formula One competition in 2003, this system will be integrated into Ralf Schumacher's helmet and will enable him to receive information visually while paying full attention to the road.

Aided by this innovative technology, the driver can be alerted, for example, to an accident on a certain stretch of the track or a patch of oil in a particular turn. "With this device, BMW has taken a further important step forward on the safety front," said Schumacher.

This pioneering technology opens up an entirely new channel of communication between the pits and the driver. A module integrated into the helmet stores various messages and images in a data set, which can be called, up from the pits and displayed to the driver. The mini head-up display projects the relevant "transparent" image through the visor. That image is level with the front of the car. The driver receives the information without being distracted from what is happening on the track.

The mini head-up display enables the projection of any number of optical messages into the driver's direct field of vision. The system is located in the peripheral vision field of the driver's dominant eye. The information is projected into the driver's field of vision without his having to actually look at the display. "The eye very quickly gets used to this small spot and ignores it as if it were a tiny insect on the windscreen," explained Jürgen Brügl, project engineer at the BMW Technology Office.

With the help of the miniature display, the F1 driver is fed a wide array of information on the race and on safety precautions straight from the pits. It means the driver is constantly informed of his position in the race and can receive instructions from the pits during a race or in training, such as "go faster", "come into the box" or "oil in turn 2." He is kept up to date on flag signals and emergency procedures by means of messages such as "pit traffic" or "oil pump." Moreover, it allows the crew chief or instructor in the pits to send the driver a message through bi-directional telemetry. This information is relayed straight to the display. Similarly, information on the engine management (e.g. oil pressure low.) can be sent directly to the driver without having to go through the pits. It all helps to save precious time.

#### What is TechFest West?

riginally established in 1981, Gateway Tech was an annual gathering hosted by the St. Louis BMW Club for those BMW enthusiasts who want to delve just a little deeper into the technology behind their Ultimate Driving Machine©. 

In addition to the wheels and tires the exterior of the 330i Performance Package is distinguished by its Aerodynamic Package, black headlight trim, high gloss shadowline trim and a new exhaust that not only appears but also sounds more aggressive.


The look and feel of the interior has been refined with cloth and Alcantara sport seats matching the Alcantara sport steering wheel. An anthracite headliner and Black cube aluminum trim complete an ambiance tailored to the enthusiast. Silver cube aluminum trim is optional. The instrumentation includes red needles while the tachometer reflects the modified engine's 300 higher rpm limit. Production of the 330i Performance Package will begin in March 2003 with the first cars arriving at BMW centers in April.

BMW ALPINA ROADSTER V8: a very special version of a very special car

This new edition of BMW's contemporary classic roadster is sure to raise eyebrows. A Z8 with an automatic transmission, powered not by the BMW M engine, but rather by a specially developed, higher-performance version of BMW's "regular" V-8 engine and featuring 20-inch wheels and tires in place of the original model's 18-inchers. A very special car indeed.

This new Z8 is not only from BMW, but also from ALPINA. ALPINA was established in 1964 as an official and approved "ennobler" of BMW automobiles. Their tradition is to take production BMWs and make them even more appealing to connoisseurs of automotive finery.

ALPINA has transformed the Z8 through a variety of refinements, some dramatic and some subtle. Most dramatically, the BMW ALPINA ROADSTER V8 replaces the Z8's BMW M engine (5.0 liters, 394 horsepower, elaborate individual throttles for each of the eight cylinders and many other racecar-like engineering characteristics) with a performancedeveloped version of BMW's "regular" V-8 engine. Remarkably, the 4.8-liter ALPINA engine comes to within 19 hp of the BMW M unit (375 hp, vs. 394), does so at lower rpm levels, and is thus suited to teaming with an automatic transmission. Its power peak comes at 5800 rpm, vs. 6600; its torque peak occurs at the same 3800 rpm but is actually higher: 383 lb-ft. (vs. 368 lb-ft). In another significant departure from the original Z8, and in harmony with the new engine, the 6-speed manual transmission is replaced by a special BMW ALPINA automatic transmission. Based on the 5-speed ZF automatic employed in



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V8-powered 5 and X5 Series, the ALPINA version features SWITCH-TRONIC.

In addition to up- and downshifting by "tipping" the shift lever rearward or forward, the driver can also shift by pressing "+" and "-" buttons near the steering-wheel rim. Directly in front of the driver, a transmission display instrument indicates the range (P, R, N, D), mode (Automatic or Manual) and the gear currently engaged.

Modifications to the beautiful exterior of the Z8 have been kept to a minimum. Special BMW ALPINA 20-inch wheels, with five clusters of four spokes each are 9.0 inches wide at the front and 10.0 at the rear. They carry Y-rated performance tires of dimensions 255/35R-20 at the front and 285/30R-20 at the rear.

Retaining the Z8's power telescopic adjustment, the BMW ALPINA ROADSTER V8 adopts a different steering wheel, with three leather-and-metal-finished spokes in place of the Z8's "banjo" spokes. An ALPINA logo replaces the BMW emblem on the steering wheel's center hub. The cockpit is upholstered in Soft Nappa (distinctive from the Z8's Nappa), with special piping and ALPINA logos in the upper seatback. Three color schemes are offered: Black/Black, Black/Crema and Black/Sport Red.

ALPINA plans to build only 555 BMW ALPINA ROAD-STER V8s. Of those approximately 450 will come to the US beginning later this month. BMW Z4 Roadster blends thoroughly modern styling, classic roadster proportions and a driving experience second to none

The winner of Automobile Magazine's 2003 Design of the Year Award, the BMW Z4 sets new standards for premium roadsters with its innovative, influential design. The new Z4, making its first appearance at the NAIAS, is a modern interpretation of all the classic roadster features - a long and sweeping hood, a long wheelbase, short overhangs and a low seating position in a cockpit that is set back. Its artfully dynamic exterior design features groundbreaking use of concave and convex lines.

The handling and responsiveness of the Z4 is unparalleled thanks to its incredibly rigid chassis, sure-footed suspension based on the much-lauded 3 Series suspension and Electric Power Steering. Both the Z4 2.5i and 3.0i offer optional Sport Packages, which include upgraded wheels and tires and Dynamic Drive Control.

The unique-folding soft-top features an integrated tonneau cover and heated glass rear window. The available fullyautomated soft-top can be raised or lowered at the touch of a button in less than 10 seconds.

Beginning with April production both the Z4 2.5i and 3.0i will be available with an optional six-speed Sequential Manual Gearbox.

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#### BMW Group NA Sales January 2003: BMW Group Begins Year With Record Month

#### January Sales Soar 24.5 Percent

WOODCLIFF LAKE, NEW JERSEY, February 4, 2003... The BMW Group (BMW and MINI brands combined) reported record sales as demand for BMW Group vehicles in 2003 climbed. The company reported its strongest January on record, with 19,823 vehicles, up 24.5 percent over the 15,923 sold in the first month of 2002.

#### BMW BRAND ALSO SETS JANUARY RECORD

BMW of North America, LLC reported its strongest January ever with sales of 17,005 automobiles and Sports Activity Vehicles, up 6.8 percent over the 15,923 vehicles sold in the same period last year.

#### BMW AUTOMOBILE SALES

BMW reported sales of 14,311 compared to the 12,778 cars sold in January 2002, an increase of 12 percent.

Two of the newest models led the way. Sales of the new Z4 roadster, introduced in late October, accounted for a 273 percent gain over Z3 sales in January 2002 and sales of the new 7 Series continued at a strong pace, recording a 15.3 percent gain over January a year ago.

#### BMW SPORTS ACTIVITY VEHICLE SALES

January 2003 sales of BMW's X5 Sports Activity Vehicles were down by 14.3 percent, to 2,694 vehicles vs. the 3,145 reported in 2002.

#### BMW CERTIFIED PRE-OWNED VEHICLES SALES

Sales of BMW CPO vehicles took off in the first month of 2003, as the company reported 5,052 vehicles in January, an increase of 40.4 percent above the 3,598 vehicles sold last year.

MINI Automobiles

Demand for the MINI brand, which went on sale March 22, continued with strong sales. The division reported sales of 1,499 MINI Cooper and 1,319 MINI Cooper S models.

#### M Engine Warranty Extended

BMW has extended factory warranties on more than 17,000 M3 six-cylinder engines—a power plant some owners have referred to as the "Engine of Damocles"—while it investigates the cause of a number of engine failures.

The standard four-year, 50,000-mile warranty is extended to six years and 100,000 miles on M3s, M coupes and M roadsters equipped with the 333-hp 3.2-liter engines. The extension covers vehicles with BMW designation "S54" engines built in model years 2001, 2002, and until further notice, 2003

In a letter sent to owners in December, BMW confirmed "cases of damage to the connecting rod bearings resulting in engine failure" in the 3.2-liter engines. The company told owners it is "conducting an in-depth engineering analysis to determine the reason for the failure."

In December, AutoWeek reported that more than 100 M3 owners had logged complaints online about potential engine problems. Some owners estimated that as many as 500 vehicles could be affected (AW, Dec. 2); BMW put the number at under 100 and said it was dealing with engine failures on a case-by-case basis.

BMW continues to urge M owners to use BMW-approved 10W60 synthetic oil instead of the usual 5W30. The company also recommends that the engine be properly warmed to normal operating temperature before full power is used, and that the accelerator should not be pumped when the vehicle is sitting still with no load on the engine.

#### BMW Group Sales January 2003: Sales rise by 2.7 percent in January 2003

BMW Group starts the New Year well Sales rise by 2.7 percent in January 2003 Positive outlook for the year

Munich, Germany. February 11, 2003... The BMW Group has started 2003 with a slight rise in sales in January up 2.7 percent to 79,900 vehicles (previous year: 77,800). The Group's growth in sales was due to the MINI, which has now been launched in all the significant markets, with 15,100 vehicles sold (previous year: 7,740).

The BMW brand recorded a decline in sales, largely due to the effect of model cycles. At 64,800 vehicles (previous year: 70,070), sales in January are 7.5 percent below the corresponding level of the previous year. The 5 Series is a central product that is coming up to a model change this year. In the 3 Series model range, the Convertible, Coupé and Compact are facing model updates at the moment. Following its model launch worldwide, the BMW Z4, which is so far only available on the North American market, will only begin to contribute to the growth dynamic of the BMW brand during the course of the year. For the year as a whole, the BMW Group remains confident, assuming that the world political situation becomes more stable. After the market launch of new models and model updates, the company is assuming that sales will rise in 2003 - with increasing energy in the second half-year for all of the Group's brands compared with the previous year.

Sales of the BMW 7 Series increased further in January. With 4,370 cars delivered to customers, sales were 12 percent higher than they had been in the same month last year. Deliveries of the BMW 5 Series fell from last year's high level of 14,040 by 23 percent to 10,870, due to the changeover. Shortly before the announced model updates, slightly fewer BMW 3 Series vehicles (6 percent decrease to 40,970) were delivered to customers. 1,390 Z4s were sold in January on the American market.

BMW of North America has been present in the United States since 1975. Since then, the BMW Group in the United States has grown to include marketing, sales and financial service organizations for the BMW, MINI and Roll-Royce brands; DesignworksUSA, an industrial design firm in California; a technology office in Silicon Valley and various other operations throughout the country, including BMW Manufacturing Corp. in South Carolina.
