

otorsports has always played a central role in the Rocky Mountain Chapter, BMW CCA. Our chapter driver's schools are legendary, with literally hundreds of club members having participated at one time or another. There's also a dedicated (some might say fanatical) smaller group of club racers,

with quite a few BMW racers also being card-carrying SCCA (Sports Car Club of America), PCA (Porsche Club), RMVR (Rocky Mountain Vintage Racing), or MRA (Motorcycle Racing Association) members. Our primary local venue for motorsports events for the last few years has been Second Creek Raceway (SCR), which has been co-operated under a lease agreement by the aforementioned clubs. RMC BMW CCA is one of eight members of the fifth SCR charter club called the "Multi-Car Club Alliance," or MCCA.

If you've followed this newsletter for a while, you probably already know that we're losing our lease on SCR at the end of 2004; in fact, sad to say, the Spring driver's school, held on May 1-2, will most likely be our last driver's school at SCR. Fortunately, the will to drive and race on a track is very strong among all of these clubs, and work is well under way to develop a new motorsports facility. In fact, it already has a name: Colorado Amateur Motorsports Park, or CAMP. Plans have already progressed to the point where an offer has been made on a 320 acre parcel of land (for comparison, SCR comprises 58 acres!) a few miles to the northwest of SCR. Key to the success of SCR has been easy access to the Front Range community, and it's significant that the new location is also readily accessible.

The five SCR charter clubs are dedicated to maintaining control and continuing to emphasize the amateur aspect of motorsports in Colorado. Thus, planning is well underway for fundraising to help build the new track. Those of you who came out for the Spring driver's school received a copy of the CAMP flyer in your packet of materials. The information is reprinted in this issue of MSR on page 26. Please take the time to read it. RMC is committed to "pulling our weight" in this endeavor, both in concert with the other clubs comprising the new organization (CAMA) as well as with internal club fundraising. Veteran RMC member Jim Jenkins has graciously stepped forward to lead the charge, and we're looking for volunteers to help with the organization and execution of this appeal. Whether you have experience with fundraising, organizing people and events, or just share the passion for amateur motorsports like many other BMW club members, we'd welcome your ideas and involvement. 

MINI Convertible Makes Its U.S. Debut In New York

Open-Top Excitement Added to MINI Brand at New York International Auto Show

New York, April 7, 2004 ... Further expanding MINI's product line, the MINI Convertible makes its U.S. debut at the 2004 New York International Auto Show. The MINI Convertible brings the fun of open-top motoring to MINI and is the next significant model introduction for the brand.

The MINI Convertible will be offered in the U.S. market in two model variations and will offer responsive power and performance already well know in the hard tops. The MINI Cooper Convertible comes with a normally aspirated 1.6 liter 4 cylinder engine and the MINI Cooper S Convertible comes with the supercharged 1.6 liter 4 cylinder engine.

Not just a convertible - a MINI Convertible

The MINI Convertible is a fully-fledged four-seater that is fun yet functional. Carrying on MINI's unmistakable design, the car has a very clean look with much of the top recessing into the rear deck area when the top is retracted. And although this car is all about open-top motoring, with the top up, the MINI Convertible also retains MINI's unmistakable signature roof silhouette.

The MINI Convertible soft top incorporates a "sunroof" feature unheard of in the segment. The first 16 inches of the soft top slides open and closed along the top rails just like a

sunroof and can be operated at speeds of up to 75 miles-perhour. Leave it to MINI to give "motorers" a choice of how they want to experience the elements.

The fully automatic soft top on the MINI Convertible makes open-top motoring quick and easy. Opening automatically in just 15 seconds, the roof columns automatically retract and the rear side windows move down simultaneously. With the single touch of a button, the intelligent top design mechanism opens and folds away without the need for a tonneau cover. The fully insulated soft top will be available in three colors - black, green and blue - and features a heated glass rear window.

With its roof down, a chrome strip along the base of the window line accentuates the car's distinctive profile. MINI's upright windscreen, the absence of a B-pillar "basket handle" support, along with the high-strength aluminum roll bars behind the rear-seat backrest, and the compact, folding roof all give the MINI Convertible a clean, open look.

The MINI Convertible is also designed to optimize available storage space, despite the car's compact dimensions. MINI offers a truly unique feature by creating an expandable opening to the rear boot. With the top in the up position, the lower rear edge of the top hinges upward to expand the size of the boot opening to allow stowage of bulky or odd-shaped items.

Additionally, like MINI's first generation predecessor, the rear trunk lid is bottom-hinged to open downwards and is suspended with high strength supports that can hold up to 176 pounds. The rear compartment also incorporates 50/50 flip fold-down rear seats with a large pass-through opening to accommodate longer items. This is possible due to the car's very rigid chassis that requires no need for a bulkhead. These clever features all help to maximize the available cargo capacity for the MINI Convertible.

A Unique Interior

Befitting a car that is 'open' for all to see, the MINI Convertible comes with unique interior design elements. The

dashboard and door trim are available to coordinate with the exterior body colors, specifically the MINI Convertible's two signature exterior colors - Hot Orange and Cool Blue. Options for interior trim also include silver, anthracite and aluminum-style trim. The interior can also be



dressed with an optional Chrome Package for the rev counter surrounds, central instruments and the cup-holders.

The optional cockpit Chrono Gauge Package emphasizes the car's sporting character with the central instrument cluster featuring dials for fuel, oil and coolant temperature, as well as oil pressure. This package moves the speedometer up to the steering column along side the tachometer. Sporty motoring is further accentuated by a new three-spoke leather sports steering wheel. With the optional multi-function steering wheel controls drivers can control audio, telematics and cruise-control features.

A high standard of active safety includes four-wheel disc brakes, four-sensor ABS, Electronic Brake Force Distribution (EBD), as well as Cornering Brake Control (CBC). Also available are Automatic Stability and Traction Control (ASC+T) as well as Dynamic Stability Control (DSC) - all to help to provide superior driving and tracking stability in extreme situations.

The MINI Convertible comes with a host of options, features and exciting colors to give customers a wide array of choices to individualize their cars. Standard equipment includes a fully automatic power top with sliding roof function and a heated glass rear window, four-sensor ABS, Electronic Brake Force Distribution (EBD), Cornering Brake Control (CBC), a tire monitoring system, power windows and side-view mirrors, electro-hydraulic power steering, Park Distance Control (PDC), height adjustable front seats and tilt wheel, as well as central remote locking - just to name a few.

Phoenix, Ariz. (April 10, 2004) – Bill Auberlen and Boris Said drove the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3 to the GT class victory in today's Food City 250 at Phoenix International

Raceway. In a race marked by seven caution periods for numerous accidents, BMW Team PTG persevered and made smart pit decisions to win its second consecutive Rolex Sports Car Series race of the season. The duo completed 129 laps of the 1.51-mile circuit, finishing one lap ahead of the second place car.

BMW stands second in the GT Manufacturer Point Standings and the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3 moves up to third in GT Team Owner Points. Said is tied for second in the GT Driver Point Standings and Auberlen moves to third.

Auberlen and Said also captured their second Acxiom Grand Touring Challenge Bonus of the season after winning the race from the pole. Auberlen recorded the fastest lap of the race (1:01.338).

Auberlen took the green flag from the GT pole and he consolidated his lead as the 40-car field began to stretch out. On lap 26, the race's second caution period, Auberlen had the chance to pit. He came in for tires and fuel and rejoined the race in third. He moved quickly back to the front and continued to lead until pitting for fuel on lap 42 when the race was slowed for a fourth yellow flag. The second place Porsche was forced to stop under green on lap 68 and lost two laps to the No. 21 M3. BMW Team PTG's decision to pit Auberlen at the right time gave the No. 21 car the advantage to claim their second victory in a row.

Boris Said entered the car on lap 87 during the fifth caution period of the race. He rejoined the race with fresh tires and enough fuel to make it to the end.

While Auberlen and Said enjoyed good fortune at the front, BMW Team PTG teammate Justin Mark's race was interrupted in the worst way. His race ended early on lap 11 after moving up to second from his fourth starting spot. Two cars spun ahead of him in turn four and blocked the track. With nowhere to go, Marks impacted the No. 9 Daytona Prototype. The heavily damaged No. 22 M3 was retired from the race.

BMW Team PTG will travel to Canada and its first visit to Le Circuit Mont-Tremblant for Round Four on May 21-23.


BORIS SAID, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3: "We had great pit strategy today. Tom called a great race. Once the No. 45 Porsche lost two laps, we just coasted home. This track does not have a lot of room and there was not much give and take out there. Luckily the pack had thinned out quite a bit by the time I got into the car."

BILL AUBERLEN, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3: "It was really, really crazy out there. On a tight track like this, everyone's speed is closer than you would think. The Daytona Prototypes can't just blow past us on the straights so you have to be very careful when they pass you. At the start of the race I was in fourth entering turn one, but they all bunched up and I was able to go around all of them. I moved ahead and stayed out of trouble. No problems at all. The M3 was running perfectly."

JUSTIN MARKS, DRIVER NO. 22 BMW TEAM PTG M3: "Racing is full of highs and lows and today was a low for the No. 22 car. I am very sorry for Joey and all the guys on the team. We clearly had a great BMW today. The start was a little mad, but it settled down and I moved up. Unfortunately, I was a victim of circumstance. The track was blocked in front of me and I had nowhere to go."

TOM MILNER, OWNER BMW TEAM PTG: "We timed all the stops just right. We got in under the yellows twice and that gained us the laps. It is too bad about the No. 22 car. Justin was just an innocent by-stander."

HERNANDO CARVAJAL, MOTORSPORT MANAGER, BMW OF NORTH AMERICA, LLC: "Congratulations again to the team. We had excellent pit strategy and everyone did a great job. We will hope for better luck for Justin and Joey next time."

Montoya annoyed, but Head looks to the future

The first lap of the San Marino Grand Prix was a controversial one due to Juan Pablo Montoya's close encounter with the World Champion, Michael Schumacher.

There weren't that many overtaking maneuvers for the spectators to enjoy over the course of the San Marino Grand Prix. Juan Pablo, however, nearly provided them with at least one on the very first lap of the race when attacking Michael Schumacher at the exit to 'Tosa'.

The reigning Champion defended his position which led to Juan Pablo falling off the track and onto the grass. The BMW WilliamsF1 Team driver was anything but delighted with his opponent's maneuver. "I understand that Michael has to defend his position," said the Colombian, "But how far can he be allowed to do this?"



"At Indianapolis last year I was given a drive-through," added Juan Pablo, "which restricted my chances of winning the championship. The regulations should be the same for every competitor."

The stewards, together with FIA race director, Charlie Whiting, examined the incident after the race and came to the conclusion that it was a normal race incident.

BMW Motorsport Director, Mario Theissen, said, "It's time for the FIA to introduce clear-cut regulations for these kinds of incidents and use these regulations in a uniform way," said Theissen, "I recommend comparing today's incident with the one that happened last year at Indianapolis between Juan Pablo and Rubens Barrichello. That time, Juan Pablo was penalized by a Drive-Through-Penalty. Nevertheless, I respect the FIA's decision."

Patrick Head, WilliamsF1's Technical Director, supported Theissen, but at the same time he made it clear that it's time to draw a line under this discussion. "Charlie Whiting did review it and his view is that Michael's maneuvers were perfectly okay," said Head, "Of that we take the decision that we get on with trying to make our car quicker rather than bleating on about the past."

After Imola, the BMW WilliamsF1 Team will act on Patrick Head's advice and focus on the preparations for the next

round of the 2004 season, the Spanish Grand Prix, which takes place at Barcelona on 9th May.



Another difficult weekend for Ralf Schumacher

Ralf Schumacher held fourth place at Imola for nearly 50 laps. But at the end of the day, he suffered another dose of bad luck and finished seventh.

Unlike some of the previous Grand Prix of the 2004 season, Ralf made an excellent start and was soon in a position to pressurize his team-mate, Juan Pablo Montoya. It was a short but exciting battle, won by Juan Pablo when Ralf had to go onto the grass to avoid a collision and consequently lost momentum.

Although he wasn't satisfied with the result of his race, Ralf had no problems whatsoever with this particular battle. "It was a difficult race," said the German BMW WilliamsF1 Team driver after the day's events at the 'Autodromo Enzo e Dino Ferrari', "At first there was the early battle with my teammate that ended with Juan Pablo defending his position. But it was okay with me as I would have acted exactly the same way had I been in his position."


Over the course of the race, Ralf was involved in a number of other exciting battles with Ferrari's Rubens Barrichello and Renault's Jarno Trulli, passing the latter after an extremely fast pit-stop.

On lap 50, however, Ralf had to experience another dose of the bad luck which has haunted him since the beginning of the 2004 season. While battling for fourth place with Renault's Fernando Alonso, the cars touched and Ralf spun, though Alonso could continue. This incident cost Ralf several positions and he had to make do with seventh instead of fourth place.

Nevertheless, Ralf Schumacher left Imola in a positive mood. "As I see it we have made the best possible use of our package here at Imola," he said, "Currently, a better result is out of our reach. But I am convinced that this will soon change."

Over the three days of testing, which take place at Silverstone, near the WilliamsF1 headquarters in Grove, from Wednesday, Ralf Schumacher will contribute to the BMW WilliamsF1 Team's efforts to improve the competitiveness of the WilliamsF1 BMW FW26 for the coming races.

The BMW 1800 TI/SA: Racing in America's Inaugural Trans-Am Series 1966

Continued from May Issue

Trans-Am race number three was held in Louden, New Hampshire at the 1.6 mile Bryar Track. Alan Moffit's Ford Cortina took the overall win. Albert Bochroch's book only documents the top ten finishers and no TI/SAs were listed.

In the Virginia International Raceway "400" Trans American Sedan race of July 30-31 1966, the following 1800 TI/SAs were entered: #3 Herb Swan and Chuck Dietrich of Cleveland, Ohio and #48 Reed and Pinkie Rollo of Washington, D.C. The Rollos finished 7th overall behind the winning Mustangs, three Alfa GTAs and a Barracuda. The Rollo car added 3 points to the 1 point scored by a BMW TI/SA at Sebring in the Manufacturer's Championship. Racing at VIR were luminaries such as Richard Petty who was in a Barracuda which DNF'd. After going off course into the mud twice, the car was finally taken out of the race with engine failure. Other notable names included journalist Brock Yates and David Peason driving a Dodge Dart.

The 5th Trans-Am race was entitled "The Great Race" and held at the Marlboro Speedway in Maryland. On Sunday August 13, 1966, this was a 12-hour endurance race that featured both under- and over-2 liter classes racing. Twentyseven of the 36 cars were less than 2 liters. A lone TI/SA was entered by Pinkie and Reed Rollo of Washington DC. The race was won by Bob Tullius's Dodge Dart with the Alfa Romeos again rounding out most of the top ten. The Rollo BMW was scratched according to the September 3, 1966 "Competition Press & Autoweek" report.

A year later on August 12-13, 1967 the "Marlboro Double 300" was held. This race featured an under-2 liter race on Saturday August 12th and an over-2 liter race on Sunday August 13th. A TI/SA shared by Pinkie Rollo, Ed Diehl, and Bill Dunlap was entered. The Alfa Romeos had a woeful race with the Porsche 911s taking the top 6 spots. Among the Porsche drivers were Peter Revson, Jerry Titus, Peter Gregg, and Sam Posey!! The TI/SA dropped out at lap 52 due to transmission failure. The Sunday large bore race was a harbinger of the future of the Trans-Am series as Mark Donohue produced the first win for the Roger Penske Camaro. Other drivers in the over-2 liter class include Cale Yarborough, Jerry Titus, Alan Moffat, Bob Tullius, and Peter Revson. A number of drivers raced in both races.

The seventh Trans-Am race was the "Pan American 6-Hours" at Smithfield, Texas near Dallas. This race was won

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by a Mustang, with an Alfa GTA in 2nd place. It's unknown whether there were any TI/SAs entered.

The inaugural Trans-Am Series concluded at Riverside, California on September 18, 1966. Of the 34 cars entered, 14 were now Detroit large bores. Jerry Titus won in a Ford Mustang, but Alfa Romeo won the overall Trans-Am championship. No BMWs were entered.

The 1966 Trans-Am was an end of an era in some ways. The average race was 370 miles, 19 different marques were entered, 10% of the drivers were foreign, and Total Prize Money was \$37,000!! Race fans truly saw cars that could be raced on Sunday and bought in the showroom on Monday.

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




What is Autocrossing?

Someone on the Yahoo Groups E30 mailing list asked what autocrossing is. Not seeing any other replies, I offered up this description.

An autocross is a driving event where a group of crazed car nuts gather in a big open parking lot, on a closed airport runway or on an otherwise suitable, relatively flat piece of pavement (five acres minimum, ten acres is nice, more is better). Some diabolical sadist designs a small race course, and then heads up a group of volunteers to line the course with orange traffic cones. Timing equipment and a public address system are set up. Generally, each person spends a few minutes walking around the course (this is affectionately known as the "course walk", or for those still hung over from the previous night, the "course stumble"), taking note of the various types of turns, places where one might be able to go faster or have to go slower, etc.

After a brief drivers' meeting where rules and procedures are discussed, everyone splits up into pre-assigned groups. One group drives while another group works (you need roughly 15 workers to run the average autocross). If there are more than two groups, the other groups stand around watching the proceedings, making fun of how the others are driving, and or bragging about how much better they could do than everyone else (which, of course, they can't).

One challenge of organizing such events is that some cars are faster than others. So some form of car grouping, or

classification, is employed to try to level the playing field. A few groups, like the BMW CCA's Golden Gate Chapter and a few other chapters that use our system, have actually made an attempt to determine the performance potential of every BMW built since the mid-60s, taking into account the effect

of various modifications.



Other groups fall in line behind the SCCA with their system of restrictions. Under that system, cars are considered to be in one of the "Stock" classes if changes have been limited to a short list of modifications. Cars

that have had more extensive modification fall into different groups of classes like Street Prepared, Prepared, Street Modified, Modified, or Interplanetary Launch Vehicle. This means that a person with a fairly stock 318i who changes their shift lever and goes to lightweight lug nuts gets bumped up to a class where they compete with double-turbocharged V8s. Sorry, I seem to be editorializing again.

Like I was saying, the idea is to be the fastest driver in your class to navigate the course. This generally requires that you drive your car at its limits, which, as many find out, exceed your personal limits as a driver. Should you drive so fast as to exceed one or more tires' ability to find traction;



the car will spin or slide. Often discussions of these conditions involve the words "understeer" and "oversteer". Or as one racer explained it, the difference between understeer and oversteer is defined by which end of the car made the hole in the fence. Only at an autocross there are no fences, so you just spin or slide. Drivers quickly find out that spinning or sliding is not usually the fastest way around the course. Then they spend a bunch of time between runs changing their tire pressures or adjusting their sway bars, thinking that this makes a difference. (Sometimes it actually does.)

While trying to find the car's limits, those who exceed their own ability to control the vehicle may knock over one or more cones. This causes a time penalty to be assessed, usually one or two seconds per cone. Penalties are usually higher for hitting the timing equipment or a course worker. Another fairly common occurrence is that a driver just misses part of the course. For this they usually get a "DNF", which usually stands for did not finish. I've often thought that it should be "HCL" for hopeless and cluelessly lost, but no one listens to me.

Autocrossing is intended to be a relatively "low speed" form of automotive competition, so most courses are designed to be run in 2nd gear (for your average car with a manual transmission). Things get tricky when there are high-speed sections and you find yourself bouncing off the rev limiter. Then you have to decide whether or not to shift. Shifting up to 3rd allows you to go faster, but presents a new challenge — downshifting while braking and simultaneously


setting up for what is usually the trickiest turn on the course. This has been known to result in missed shifts, gear grinding, much swearing and, of course, more cones being hit. Also, there are often one or more very tight sections where you might be tempted to downshift into first. This is harder than downshifting from 3rd to 2nd, and has been known to result in attempts to select reverse by mistake. Oops! What's that grinding noise? Those who wish to avoid having to shift down to first often upgrade with a lower differential ratio and performance engine management software that allows you to rev the engine higher. This, of course, moves the car into the Interplanetary Launch Vehicle class.

Some organizing groups give out trophies or prizes for the fastest in class at each event. Others have some system of tracking finishing position over time and present awards at the end of the season. Still others just put your name in the local newsletter and hope that you keep coming back for more. And, of course, you do, because, despite the fact that you probably drove across half the state to reach the event where you spend a total of less than 10 minutes (VERY INTENSE FUN-FILLED CHALLENGING MINUTES) actually driving, just hanging out all day with like-minded car nuts is a highly enjoyable experience.

This is, of course, a brief description of autocrossing, and I'm sure others will add some of the details I've missed.

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



Colorado Amateur Motorsports Park (CAMP)


Since May of 2003, the presidents of the five Second Creek Charter Clubs (SCCA, MRA, RMVR, Multi Car Club Association (MCCA) and PCA) have been working together with the express purpose of building a new CAMP facility to replace Second Creek Raceway. BMW CCA is a member of MCCA along with Audi, CECA, Z Car, Mercedes, Shelby, Alfa and Lotus.

We believe that the best way to actualize this venture is to bring the entire Colorado motorsports community together as a "congregation", with all our members united in building this "church." This is about preserving motorsports in Colorado for our "congregation", into the future. With everyone's support, this goal is achievable. We and the next generation of motorsports enthusiasts will be the winners.

"over the hill" from where Second Creek is located. The diagram below will give some idea as to the proposed track layout but changes are inevitable.

The Fund Raising Committee (volunteers are welcome and needed) has had several meetings and is preparing to begin a fundraising drive by contacting every member of all the clubs and asking for your pledge. In addition, there will be car raffles, brick engraving, a business partner program whereby when you purchase a product or service from one of the listed business partners on the Fund Raising web site (www.camplaps.org), a portion of the proceeds will go towards funding the new facility.

The total projected cost of the project at this time starts at around four million dollars, with the first million due in

The goal of all the member clubs is to have an equal equity position without regard to whatever monies might be raised within each of the clubs. In approaching this project with this unified attitude, we (the Colorado motorsports community) have an incredible opportunity to control our track and autocross events and be able to pass that on to our successors.

An Operating Agreement between the 5 member clubs has been reached that creates an entity that will own the land. This entity, commonly known as Land-Co, is an LLC. This for-profit structure gives us maximum flexibility for this venture. We are also constructing a not-for-profit 501(c) 7 entity that will be run by the clubs. This entity, commonly called Op-Co, will contract with Land-Co to secure track rental dates on behalf of its member clubs.

The current preferred location of land provides approximately 320 acres of prime motorsports real estate – just

approximately six months to purchase the land. The land purchase is a key goal and must be accomplished to keep a realistic timeline for motorsports to be available once Second Creek is closed this year. We may have the use of Second Creek in 2005, but it makes no difference as far as the purchase of the CAMP land is concerned. Second Creek Raceway is going to be closed.

The www.camplaps.org web site will be the central point for information on the new facility for all club members. Please check the site often.

The President's Group and the Fund Raising Committee request that each of us look at the value that Second Creek Raceway provided to our motorsports community and support the new Colorado Amateur Motorsports Park with your donation.

"Ok. I'll watch out for you," he said.


So I did just that. He gave me the thumbs up from inside the shop and I flashed my lights at him.

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

BMW Brand Records 11.5% Jump • MINI Brand Sales Up 5.4% • Group Sales Increase 10.7%

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - May 3, 2004... The BMW Group (BMW and MINI brands combined) reported an increase of 10.7 percent in April sales for 26,709 vehicles compared to the 24,131 vehicles sold that month in 2003. The BMW Group also reported year-to-date sales of 87,950 vehicles, an increase of 1.7 percent from 86,513 sold in the first four months of 2003.

BMW Brand Reports Sales

BMW of North America, LLC reported an 11.5 percent increase in April sales of automobiles and Sports Activity Vehicles, to 23,419 vehicles compared to the 21,010 reported last April, making it the strongest retail month on record.

Strong sales of the X3, the newest Sports Activity Vehicle, contributed to BMW's record sales, as did impressive sales of the all-new 6 Series coupes and convertibles.

Year-to-date, sales of BMW brand vehicles were up 1.6 percent, for sales of 76,389 vehicles compared to 75,209 vehicles sold in first four months of 2003.

BMW Automobile Sales

BMW's automobile sales increased 1.6 percent in April, to 18,587 versus 18,294 in the same month a year ago. Year-

to-date sales were down 5.7 percent, to 60,511 automobiles compared to 64,183 in the same period a year ago.

BMW Sports Activity Vehicle Sales

Sales of BMW Sports Activity Vehicles were up 78 percent in April to 4,832, compared to 2,716 vehicles sold in April 2003. Year-to-date, sales of BMW's two SAV models are up 44 percent, to 15,878 vehicles compared to 11,026 for the first four months of 2003.

Certified Pre-owned

BMW also reported sales of 6,101 Certified Pre-owned vehicles, down 1.7 percent over the 6,204 vehicles sold in April 2003. Year-to-date, BMW CPO sales were up 7.7 percent to 23,063 vehicles over 21,408 in the same period a year ago.

MINI Automobiles

Demand for MINI brand automobiles continues as the MINI division heads into its third year of sales in the U.S. April 2004 sales were up 5.4 percent, with 3,290 cars compared to 3,121 sold a year ago. Sales of MINI automobiles in the first four months are up 2.3 percent with sales of 11,561 over the 11,304 in 2003.


Two BMW Sedans Awarded "Best Sedans 2004" by Forbes.com


