









- Unawareness of consequences of hazard driving behavior,
- General Inexperience,
- Peer Passenger interference,
- Driving as a social activity,
- Driving under the Influence, and
- · Speeding.

Alive at 25 is designed to take place in a class-room type setting. The classes usually last about 4 hours. For more information (http://www.alive-at-25.org).



The Rocky Mountain Chapter BMW CCA is pleased to invite you to attend the Fall Performance Driving School sponsored by Murray Motor Imports (www.murraymotors.com) at Pueblo Motorsports Park, on Saturday, September 25th, 2004. Pueblo Motorsports Park is an excellent track for teaching: safe and demanding, yet fun and visible from the grandstand. (No convertibles are permitted at the Driving School.)

The purpose of the **Fall Performance Driving School** is to give you the opportunity to drive your car at speed and to experience more of the potential of the unique combination of car and driver. You will learn to drive this track smoothly and safely. This is NOT a racing school. Anyone **18 and older** with a valid driver's license may attend.

There is a **mandatory technical inspection** required of all cars before they will be allowed on the track. Tech inspection forms are available for download from the Chapter web site. All safety equipment will be checked: brakes, tires, brake fluids, battery hold downs, seat belts, wheel bearings and more. If there is any doubt about the condition of your equipment, have it replaced (although brand new tires are not automatically recommended). The inspection can be completed by your mechanic (expect a charge), or there will be a free technical inspection on **Saturday, August 28**th, **9 AM to 1 PM** at *Bimmer Haus Performance* or **Tuesday, August 31**st, **5:30 PM** at *Poudre Sports Car* in Fort Collins.

Hotels nearest the track are located just off of I-25 along Hwy 50. We have contacted Hampton Inn at 4703 N. Freeway Road, Pueblo for a BMW Club discount. For reservations call 1-719-544-4700 and mention BMW for your discount.

Pursuant to the Chapter Bylaws below are the duties of the Secretary and Treasurer.

Secretary shall be responsible for maintaining full and complete records of the Chapter's general meetings, meetings of the Board of Directors and other special meetings as designated by the President. The Secretary shall:

- Take complete minutes of each Chapter and Board meeting, and make them available two weeks prior to the next scheduled Board meeting.
- 2) Maintain and have custody of all records for the Chapter except those delegated to the Treasurer.
- Prepare correspondence as directed by the President or the Board of Directors.
- 4) Maintain a current roster of Chapter members. The Board may delegate this function to another chapter member.
- 5) Shall turn over all Chapter assets, accounts, records, etc. to successors as directed by the Board of Directors.

Treasurer shall be the chief financial officer of the Chapter and shall have custody of all the Chapter's assets and funds. The Treasurer shall:

- 1) Receive, record, and deposit Chapter funds.
- 2) Maintain an accurate and complete accounting of all the Chapter's assets and funds. Report the Chapter financial status at each Board meeting.
- Shall sign checks for disbursements authorized by the Board of Directors.
- 4) Shall turn over all funds, assets, accounts, records, etc. to successors as directed by the Board of Directors.
- 5) At the end of the calendar year, prepare an annual financial statement for submittal **by March 1**st **of the following year** to the national office of the BMW CCA, and for publication in the Chapter newsletter.
- 6) Complete and submit applicable federal/state tax forms.
- 7) Maintain current state sales tax license.
- 8) Collect, record and pay applicable sales taxes.
- 9) Maintain all electronic (web based) collections, credit card merchant accounts, and associated revenue accounts.

Meet the Candidates

i — I'm Jim Bartlett, your Rocky Mountain Chapter appointed Secretary since May of this year. My wife, Michele and I reside in Morrison. as it really been two years already? How time flies when you're having fun. Yes, there have been lots of fun I times, as well as times of lots of work. When I decided two years ago to graduate from being a "Roundel" member, as one of our National officers put it, to running for office and becoming a volunteer I didn't know what to expect. When I learned I was running against a CPA I thought "Oh well, it was a good try", thinking there was no way I'd be elected. Then the tie vote! What happens now? I agreed to be the Assistant Treasurer and took charge of the online payments, something J.J., my wife and I do everyday in our own Internet and Catalog based business. I wanted to help our club, and tried to volunteer for everything I could (two back surgeries in 10 months put a dent in that effort). I still haven't made it to an Autocross, Spring Drive, Fall Driving School or some of the other great events. I have managed to attend every Board meeting, the National conference in Keystone and work at both Spring Driving Schools and attend some of the Social events we have every year.

So, why do I think I'm a good Treasurer and Board candidate? I managed a Federal Credit Union in Maryland for 6½ years before moving to Colorado in 1993. I prepared all Financial Statements, all regulatory reports and helped the credit union grow from \$1.5 million to almost \$3 million in assets while adding new member groups and new services. In Colorado I became Manager-Treasurer of a small Federal Credit Union in Aurora that was in desperate need of modernization. During the 5½ years I ran it, we adopted a new software program so we could offer many new services, added new members, and stayed in the \$1.5 to 1.7 million asset range despite competition from two large community credit unions whose territory overlapped ours.

Our club faces many challenges in the coming years. Last year over 30% of our gross revenues came from the Spring Driving School at 2nd Creek Raceway. This track is being closed down. The local car clubs have banded together to try to purchase land and develop a new track, but this will require an immense money raising effort. Our Autocross program accounted for 43% of our gross revenues last year, and should raise even more this year. We have to rent lots to hold the autocrosses, and there is lots of competition for dates and places to hold these events. Driving events provide the capital that allows our club to subsidize social events to keep them affordable, and provide for charitable contributions.

I believe my knowledge and experience can help the club meet these challenges. If you agree, please vote for me for Treasurer.

Mark Webber Signs for the BMW Williamsf1 Team

Oxford, 28 July 2004. The BMW WilliamsF1 Team confirmed today that Mark Webber has signed for the team for the 2005 season and beyond.

The signing of the highly acclaimed 27 year-old Australian reflects a long-term mutual interest between team and driver.

"Mark is self-evidently a highly talented driver," said BMW WilliamsF1 Team Principal Frank Williams, "But his tenacity, determination and motivation are also qualities we prize at Williams. As a team we have traditionally prospered with drivers who have a down-to-earth, 'let's get on with it' attitude. Mark is certainly in that mould, and I am delighted he has agreed to join the team for 2005."

For his part, Webber said on the signing of the agreement, "The deal I have agreed with Williams today really is the most significant milestone in my career to date, and I have great expectations of what we can achieve together. Of course I am focused on my job for the remainder of this season, but I cannot wait to take up my position for next year. Besides having an amazing history of success, the team has a reputation for a no-nonsense and straightforward approach to racing, which suits me just fine."

Mark Webber has over a decade of motor racing experience, and has never failed to impress at every stage of his career. He rose to prominence in Formula One in his debut race in Melbourne in 2002 when he claimed a stunning 5th place for Minardi.

Sam Michael, WilliamsF1's Technical Director, sees the signing as more important than simply attracting a future World Champion to the team. "Mark is the kind of character who will give a whole new impetus to everyone employed at WilliamsF1 and at BMW. He is a driven person with one goal. Mark displays to me all of the characteristics on and off the track of a champion in the making, and I believe he will be a significant catalyst in improving our future results."

Mario Theissen, BMW's Motorsport Director commented, "BMW is delighted that Mark is joining the team. He is clearly a focused driver and wants to win like we all do. He shows a great attitude towards his work and we are convinced that he will be a real fortification to the team's efforts. We have been fully involved and consulted in the process of recruiting Mark, and completely support his selection."

Webber was a relatively late starter by motor racing standards, only taking up karting at the age13 after a childhood spent playing and competing in a number of other sports in his native Australia. His swift progress claiming the Formula Ford Festival win in 1996 propelled the Australian into Formula 3, the FIA GT Championship with Mercedes and subsequently F3000, before Formula One beckoned. Testing for Benetton led Webber to a full-time drive for Minardi for the 2002 season, and his prowess attracted the attentions of Jaguar Racing. In 2003, he finished the season 10th in the drivers' championship, and scored 18 of the team's tally of 19 points for the year.

Best time: 1:14,446 min (lap 10, 7th overall)

What a bad start I had! The clutch didn't bite soon enough on the start and then I just had so much wheel spin and the car didn't go anywhere. I had no grip at all and lost a cool five positions. I also had some blistering problems on my rear tyres and it came to the point where driving the car was very, very hard since it was pointy and unpredictable. Actually, this prevented me from catching David Coulthard in the last part of the race. I came very close to him, but then I didn't feel I could make it. I am, of course, a bit disappointed because when you start from second you expect a podium finish. We did score some points today though which is very important for the team.

Antonio Pizzonia: 7th

Chassis: FW26 07

Best time: 1:14,586 min (lap 65, 10th overall)

All in all I'm happy with my performance today although I got stuck in a lot of traffic during the first two stints which cost me a lot of time. When I was on my own, I could put in some quick lap times but it wasn't enough to catch Webber in the last few laps. I still scored two points so I'm happy I could do that for the team. I think the potential is there, I just need some more race experience. After all, I drove my last Grand Prix more than one year ago.

Sam Michael (Technical Director WilliamsF1):

It is good having scored points with both cars and it is nice to see Antonio picking up some points as well. We had a poor start on both cars so for the next race we will be looking to make improvements on this. In general, the cars performed better in this Grand Prix, so the latest car developments have demonstrably improved our performance. The pit-stops were good once again and helped the strategies work.

Mario Theissen (BMW Motorsport Director):

The first compliment has to go to Michael Schumacher who dominated this race. The second goes to the Hockenheim circuit. The track layout encourages overtaking and today we saw a lot of interesting duals. With regards to our race result today, it doesn't mirror our increased competitiveness, which we saw in yesterday's qualifying. Antonio drove a good race but Juan Pablo made a poor start. He later managed to climb through the field to finish in fifth, despite struggling with some blistering on the tyres which didn't help when he was trying to overtake the cars in front.

Our September **Car of the Month** comes to you from Centennial, Colorado belonging to Gene Bockenstedt who writes:

"Greeny" My 1984 M635

The 6 series was offered in several different engine options from 2.8 liter to 3.5 liter. All were 12 valve configurations till the M1 ceased production. The M1's 24 valve M88 6-cylinder engine was not a prefect fit in the E12 or E24 chassis but with slight modifications it was made to fit. When the engine was tilted and the cooling system modified the higher horsepower engine helped transform the coupe into a much better performer. Where the M30 engine peaked in power and started to drop off the M engine was just warming up.

Having owned a 1986 635 for several years, I was in need of a power increase of my own. All of the regular maintenance and needed repairs were being done in the direction of a full restoration. Thousands of dollars later I determined that this car was destined to be a very solid everyday driver, not a show car.

Watching the ads in the local papers, plus EBay and Auto Trader, several cars caught my interest. One was in New

Jersey and one in Utah; both were grey market M635s with fairly low miles at 90,000 and 74,000 miles respectively. Talking to the Utah owner, his car had been offered for many months and many thousands of dollars more than current asking price. No serious bites were showing up from his ad choices. The same day I referred him to a free internet board site the ad was placed. Why did I do that? I don't need competition. What it did was force me to make a decision quickly and become an anxious prospect. Research and networking indicated this was one I needed to follow up on.

It was the week of the Thanksgiving 2002 and my inlaws were invading our house for Turkey day; we had nearly 30 people to prepare for and clean up after. Then there was the issue of my 40 immediate family members living in the metro area.

"Let's see, if we leave Friday morning we can be arrive in Salt Lake City before dark for the final examination." Five hundred miles might be too much for people not into road

trips, but my wife Cindy, being the good sport that she is, was up for giving me a ride. Two cars driving back are better than scrambling for transportation if I were to reject this car.



Payments were complicated at the last minute because of the holiday banking schedule. "Of course everyone needs more stress anyway." Hours later than we originally planned we were on the road.

The car is a very dark green color (that is how "Greeny" came about) that held up well to scrutiny. Achatgrun Metalic #177 was the name BMW called it. The original

wheels with metric TRX tires were color matched in "Agate" green also. The front spoiler needed minor repairs, but first impressions were encouraging. The interior is anthracite water buffalo, which is thicker leather and unlike the glove soft leather of the US M6. Small wear defects could be sorted out over time.

Driving the car convinced me that this car had to go home with me. Everything was placed the same as my 1986 635, except for non-powered seats and the power band.

The drive home started early and provided a great photo opportunity northwest of Green River, Utah. The sun hitting the plateaus at a low angle was dramatic and a short side road worked out perfect. "I love it when a plan comes together." It was a good thing we had our Subaru Outback to haul the track pipes, because they would not have fit in the M635.

As proud as I am of "Greeny", Concours shows at Arapahoe Community College and Sharkfests' in Paso Robles, California indicated the car has potential but is not finished in its restoration. The shows have been a motivation for me to keep moving forward and do a little at a time. Parts have not been a problem to locate, only the premium price demand for

them. Front spoiler, bumper trim and speaker pods shipped and received within two weeks of placing the orders from local BMW dealers.

New Michelin TRX GT tires were put on the original wheels but were quickly put in storage after one track day showed me what a 180 wear rating meant. The wheels and tires chosen to replace them give it more of an American muscle car look compared to the basket weave BBSs Euro look.

Two years in a row "Greeny" has done the Cerebral Palsy Concours at Arapahoe Community College and the 2,700 mile round trips to Pacific Sharkfest in California. Both years the car won the "Party Animal" award for the vehicle that was driven furthest. This year "Greeny" shared the award with Northglenn resident Brian Fonseca, owner of a 1987 L6.

The design team got it right when this rolled off the line – looks, handling and comfort were balanced well to keep this model fun to own and drive twenty years later. My problem will be keeping the mileage down and avoiding traffic tickets.

- 2. Assist RMC BMW CCA in continuing to provide the highest quality drivers' educational and recreational events.
- 3. To improve our ability to participate in and influence the future direction of CAMP.

Important Information to Members:

Many of the major issues relating to the facility, its operation, and ownership are unknown at this time. While we believe it is prudent to raise funds to support efforts to build the new track, it is prudent to provide support when and only when the final details are known. We do not know whether the area motorsports clubs will have ownership and control of CAMP or if an outside investor will ultimately own and control the facility. Much will depend upon our ability to raise funds to complete the project.

All funds collected by and within RMC BMW CCA, to support the new track facility will be deposited into an account that is administered by the RMC BMW CCA Board of Directors. The RMC BMW CCA Board will have control over how these funds will be used to benefit RMC BMW CCA membership. Funds donated directly to Colorado Amateur Motorsports Associates, LLC (CAMA) and Colorado Amateur Motorsports Park (CAMP), will go into a CAMA account. The RMC BMW CCA will have no influence in how these funds are used.

The RMC BMW CCA Board will determine how, when, and for what purpose the funds raised within RMC BMW CCA are

used to serve the interests of membership. The RMC BMW CCA Board may decide to donate funds to track operator, invest in track ownership, refund funds to donors, and/or hold funds to subsidize increased facility costs for future chapter events. The RMC BMW CCA Board may determine all or only a portion of the funds should be donated or invested. Any funds donated or invested by the RMC BMW CCA in the new track facility are at risk and may be unrecoverable.

The RMC BMW CCA Board will publish their intention for use of funds raised, in the *MotorSport Report*, 45 days prior to committing funds. If you are uncomfortable with the decision of the RMC BMW CCA Board, you may make a written request to withdraw your contribution within 30 days of the publication of intent to commit funds. 
Colorado Amateur Motorsports Park (CAMP) Information






It is amusing to note that while BMW owners and enthusiasts welcomed the X5, recognizing its many virtues and supporting strong showroom sales and a healthy resale value; Porscheophiles protested the introduction of the Cayenne, Porsche's version of a high-performance SUV, wailing and bemoaning the end of the automotive world...

BMW has now brought us the X3, a new SAV based on the 3-series model line. Cut from the same styling mold as the X5, the X3 looks remarkably like its 5-series sibling. Only a side-by side comparison revels that the X3 is slightly smaller, with more of a squared off rear-end. This shape allows the X3 to boast more interior cargo room than its larger brethren.

Thanks to the good people at *Ralph Schomp BMW* in Littleton, I had the opportunity to experience a spanking new X3 for a couple of days. They loaned me a 3.0 liter model, with the 6-speed manual transmission. The salesperson who gave me my orientation check-out encouraged me to "really get on it", and "throw it into corners aggressively." Always one to follow instructions, I did my best to comply!

The X3 is exactly what you would expect from a 3-series vehicle - a quick accelerating, superb handling, strong braking, well appointed, joy to drive. Like the X5, the X3 is one of those rare SAV's that when actually driven in a sporty manner, complete with heel and toe downshifts, is responsive and confidence inspiring, rather than wallowing and terror inducing.

BMW introduced its new All Wheel Drive system, called xDrive, on the X3. Using what BMW calls "active dynamic drive control", the xDrive system is infinity variable, meaning that it can deliver anywhere from 0% to 100% power to either frontwheel or rearwheel drive, or any combination thereof, as needed. This is unlike most AWD systems that have some residual bias to either front or rear. In fact, with other built-in electronic systems, like Dynamic Stability Control, the X3 can deliver all of its power to any one wheel! All this wizardry goes about its business seamlessly; all the driver is aware of is plenty of grip and excellent traction in most any situation.

The interior of the X3, while certainly comfortable, is pleasantly simple and efficient. The carpets and leather are designed to be highly durable, evidence that buyers of the X3 will in fact use the vehicle for sporting activities. Whatever the activity, there will be plenty of light on the subject from the two-part panorama sunroof that covers both front and rear seats. Up to five full sized people are protected with a full array of airbags, and can enjoy filtered air and a premium stereo system. The rear seats fold 60/40, allowing access to the cargo area that sports a reversible floor panel, either carpet or grippy rubber, and a collection of ratcheting tie-down hooks that slide along an adjustable track.

For something in the order of \$41,000, the X3 delivers a roomy, stylish, sporty, and versatile vehicle that embodies all the attributes of a BMW.







DIRECTORS & OFFICERS LIABILITY INSURANCE

It's finally here. In this package is a copy of the application for Chapter D&O coverage. Another copy is being sent to the Chapter Presidents' homes along with a Fed Ex package to return the original to this office. Each chapter must fill out the application, sign it and return it. The cost per chapter will be indicated in the cover letter and is based on chapter size.

Why purchase Directors & Officers (D&O) insurance? Doesn't General Liability insurance cover the chapter board of directors? General Liability insurance provides coverage for "negligent" acts. If an organization, its employees or volunteers (including board members) negligently cause someone "bodily injury, personal injury or property damage" General Liability insurance typically provides coverage.

Directors & Officers provides coverage for "intentional" actions taken by an organization's board of directors or management and someone else thinks these actions are wrong. For example, in employment-related cases, the board affirmatively adopts personnel policies that are intentionally carried out by management. These are intentional, willful actions that may result in some type of damage other than bodily injury.

Do statutes such as the Volunteer Protection Act offer protections in the case of a lawsuit against a board of directors?

Under the Volunteer Protection Act of 1997, to receive any protection, the volunteer must prove in a court of law that he or she:

• was acting within the scope of his or her responsibilities,

- if appropriate or required, was properly licensed or certi-
- did not cause the harm by willful, criminal, or reckless conduct or gross negligence, and
- · did not cause the harm by operating a motor vehicle, vessel, aircraft, etc

Key Policy Provisions

While D&O policies are different, there are a few important policy provisions that should be included in any good D&O policy for nonprofit organizations and are included in the policy in place for BMW CCA chapters. These are:

- Broad definition of insured: the definition of insured should extend coverage to any person who was, is or becomes a director, trustee, officer, employee, committee member or volunteer of the nonprofit, and importantly, the nonprofit organization itself.
- Requirement to advance defense costs: Nonprofits usually cannot afford to advance the costs of their defense and then wait for the insurance company to reimburse them after the claim is settled. Typically, insurance policies for nonprofits should provide that the insurer will pay for the costs of the defense and indemnity as those costs are incurred.

The BMW CCA National Board has determined that it is imperative for chapters to avail themselves of this coverage. In order to make the costs for coverage as palatable as possible, the National Office will deduct the premiums from chapter rebates on a monthly or quarterly basis – based on instruction from the Chapter.

Sometimes the underwriting departments at insurance companies cause considerable frustration by acting like the Bermuda Triangle. Lots of stuff goes in, but precious little comes out. The information that insurance companies require for underwriting D&O insurance varies considerably. We consider the following information to be essential to be able to underwrite D&O insurance for nonprofits. Other insurance companies may require more or less information, but those items listed below are common to many of them.

- Completed application signed by a board member;
- Up-to-date bylaws or articles;
- · List of board members and work affiliations.
- · Most recent 990.

Enclosed (once more) with this report is the newly approved Driving Event Incident Reporting form. Please toss the old ones out and begin using this henceforth. It is available in the **Files** section of the Presidents and Driving Events digests, and I am happy to email it to anyone who asks. This form was developed by the Driving Events Committee and approved by the Risk Management Committee and the BMW CCA National Board. Since last month when we first provided the updated document we continue to receive reports on the outdated form. PLEASE – begin using this form henceforth. Your cooperation is very much appreciated.

RE-CHARTERING CHAPTERS

Many of the chapter files at National do not contain original charter documents for the chapters, and many, if not most chapters do not possess a charter document. So that we have a common and current chartering baseline and documents on file to support all our chapters' existence, we will re-issue charters to our chapters. These will not be new charters, but rather, replacements. Scott Blazey will draft the charter certificates and cover letters. Whether or not you decide to participate, BMW and CEE would appreciate return of the enclosed pre-stamped reply card that is included in the letter, with all requested information. CEE representatives should be able to answer all of your questions. The New BMW M5 -


BMW Unveils the Fourth Generation of the Quintessential Performance Sedan

Woodcliff Lake, NJ, July 2, 2004...It has been 20 years since the launch of the first BMW M5. After three generations, more the 35,000 sales and countless attempts by competitors to emulate its performance and success, the BMW M5 still makes its position as the benchmark. Each successive generation has extended the bounds of both performance and luxury. The last generation M5, the most successful ever, significantly pushed the performance envelope with the first V8 from BMW M, mated to a six-speed transmission.

The all-new fourth generation M5 pushes that envelope even further with the first V10 engine to power a production sedan. The new V10 produces 507 horsepower and 383 lb-ft of torque by European measure. This new engine is mated to a seven-speed SMG transmission. With this new powertrain the M5 offers the best power-to-weight ratio in its class. In the tradition of BMW M, the chassis has been engineered to keep up with the power while the exterior treatment is subtle, yet distinctive.

First high-revving engine to be featured in a production sedan

This is the first application of a V10 engine in a regular production sedan, if it's possible to call any product from BMW M "regular." It once again sets the benchmark in its





class. This engine was engineered to rev, with a redline of 8,250. With 25 percent more power than the previous M5's V8, this new engine offers 100 horsepower per liter of displacement, pure race car territory. The 900 V10 is designed for maximum stiffness and minimum vibration.

The new V10 features double-VANOS variable valve timing. Each cylinder has its own electronically controlled throttle butterfly. The new MS S65 engine management system uses the most powerful processors currently approved for use in automobiles. It has been designed specifically to deal with the V10's high output and high revs as well as the comprehensive controls that are required.

Seven-speed SMG gearbox features Drivelogic

The driver of the new M5 is able to maximize the potential of the new V10 engine with a seven-speed SMG gearbox. Like other BMW SMG gearboxes shifts can be made from either the lever on the center console or the paddles on the steering wheel. Compared to the previous SMG, gear changes happen 20 percent faster with this latest generation SMG, making for smooth, crisp shifts.

With Drivelogic, at the driver's disposal are eleven program options. This enables the SMG's shift characteristics to be tailored to suit the driving situation and the mood. Six of these programs can be selected in the sequential manual gearbox mode (S mode). These programs adjust shifting speed and style because, in the S mode, the driver does all the shifting. In the Drive (D mode) the transmission shifts automatically, depending on which of the five programs is selected, the driving situation, the road speed and the position of the accelerator pedal.

Taken together the drivetrain of the new M5 provides truly awe inspiring performance. From rest 60 miles per hour will be reached in well under five seconds. The rush of acceleration never lets up until the electronically limited top speed of 155 miles per hour. The top speed may be limited but with the speedometer reaching all the way to 205 mph, the mind conjures intriguing possibilities.

The perfect blend of ride comfort and agility

The M5 has long been known for handling that matches its performance, carefully blended with impressive ride comfort. More than just a "tuned" 5 Series suspension, the aluminum suspension on the M5 has been engineered to match





its performance. The suspension is mated to 19-inch wheels with performance tires. Keeping power on the road is critical, so the M5 features the Variable M differential lock. By constantly monitoring and comparing the speed of the rear wheels, the Variable M differential lock can ensure that power gets to the drive wheel with the most traction even in extreme driving situations. Its benefits are particularly apparent when accelerating out of a corner.

The Dynamic Stability Control system in the M5 has been designed to suit its performance. Of course, the DSC can be deactivated at the push of a button. The M5's DSC also offers the choice of two driving dynamics programs. One allows DSC to function the way it always has. At the touch of a button, the M Dynamic Mode is engaged which lets DSC facilitate more spirited driving.

To ensure that this level of handling does not compromise ride quality, the new M5 features Electronic Damping Control, with three program modes (comfort, normal, sport). EDC constantly adjusts the suspension to suit the driving conditions.

To complement its performance potential, the M5 is equipped with generously sized high performance brakes with perforated compound brake discs. The aluminum twin-piston brake calipers have been designed for minimum unsprung weight and maximum stiffness. They will haul the new M5 to a stop from 62 mph (100 km/h) in under 120 feet and from 124 mph (200 km/h) in just under 460 feet.

Styling is subtle but purposeful

In the tradition of BMW M, the exterior styling of the new M5 follows the "wolf in sheep's clothing" philosophy. The casual observer may not, at first glance, recognize the M5's performance potential. The less casual observer instantly will. The modified front spoiler and rear apron are instant giveaways. So too are the modified side sills. The wheel arches are more prominent in order to house the generous wheel and tire package. Following BMW M's recent traditions, the new M5 has more aerodynamic exterior mirrors, four tailpipes and exclusive wheels. Similar to the latest M3, the M5 features exclusive gills incorporated into the front fenders.

The exclusive leather interior features sports seats. Other styling touches, from the instrument cluster to the center console and the steering wheel are all unique to the M5. Even the optional head-up display is M-specific.

The all-new BMW M5 once again combines the comfort





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


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
