President's and Service Awards for 2004



'he President's Award is something of a local tradition within the RMC, and predates my tenure by many years. There's no formal process or guidelines for making the award; in fact it's solely at the discretion of the sitting president to make an award (or plural, in exceptional cases). My criteria are that the recipient should have "the right stuff"—a winning combination of commit-

ment to the club, dedication and persistence in fulfilling their assumed duties (since, after all, we're all volunteers), and community service. This is the third opportunity I've had to present this award. For the record, the recipients the last two years were Gordon Haines in 2002 and Doug Gordon in 2003. I'm pleased to report the chapter had such a great year that I had no problem whatsoever in naming two recipients for the 2004 President's Award.

#1 Presented to Darlene Doran, our imminently capable and tenacious newsletter editor, co-chair or the inaugural RMC Oktoberfest, multiple event coordinator (including the Fall Dinner where the award was presented to her!), and all-around chapter ombudsgal. Darlene contributes to the chapter in so many ways, the hardest part was figuring out how to say it succinctly so it would fit on the award plaque! For example, our newsletter has grown in size, quality and content during the three years it's been in Darlene's stead, and has blossomed to the point that it's financially self-sustaining—a first for the RMC. Also, our first Oktoberfest resulted in a \$7500 donation to the Colorado State Patrol Family Foundation's "Alive @ 25" program, due in large part to Darlene's passionate and cheerful solicitation of donations from club businesses and sponsors. And the list goes on and on.

As a small thank-you, the club presented Darlene and Mark Doran (who also contributes in no small measure to the RMC, including helping out with the Oktoberfest planning and execution) with a gift certificate good for two nights' lodging at the Saratoga Inn in southwest Wyoming. The Saratoga Inn, by the way, when told what Darlene had done in the way of community service and charity, donated one night's lodging.

#2 Presented to Mark Irvin, chair of the autocross committee. The RMC autocross program just finished up its third year of operations; the last two years comprising a comprehensive autocross point series following a format similar to programs run by SCCA for many years. From its infancy to widespread and fanatical levels of participation, Mark has been steadily guiding the program, organizing events, planning capital purchases (including our awesome twin-axle trailer), announcing at the events, and perpetually chipping in every step of the way. Service Award - The RMC also presented a special Service Award to Frank Delmonte, our outgoing treasurer, to recognize his significant contribution to organizing and maintaining the club's finances over the last two years. The club treasurer position is one of those mostly-behind-the-scenes jobs that require a substantial amount of time and expertise, and we are all grateful for Frank's professionalism and skill.

Car of the Month is a series in which Club members will have a chance to showcase their pride and joy in the *MotorSport Report*. Our membership will see the variety of BMWs and the level of personalization that makes each car unique.

ur December Car of the Month comes to you from Denver, Colorado belonging to Goetz Pfafflin who writes:

It was two years ago, while I was in Shanghai (having spent most of the last ten years in China), that my then newly acquired 327/28 Coupe started its long trip from Parachute, to Eggenfelden in South-Eastern Bavaria for a ground-up restoration.

History of the car

Having long dreamed of owning a pre-war BMW, I was very happy to find this Coupe. It had resided in Parachute for several years after its owner had moved there from New Orleans, where the car had last been registered. "Find" in this case meant that a California friend had sent an email to me in Shanghai in August 2002, with a number of pictures he had taken of this Coupe several years earlier. The car seemed complete. The original 80 HP engine had evidently been

replaced by the less sporty (but more service friendly) 55 HP engine of the 327 model. The original fabric interior had been replaced by red leather. The bodywork looked "straight" if a little rusty, and the wheels and central locks seemed original. All in all, the pictures reflected a good "project car".

The previous owner, John Wenter of Parachute, loved this car, and had made a start at restoration, but familial responsibilities precluded his completing this project. He concluded that the car had a better chance of revival in a new home. John and I had a frank and friendly exchange by email and phone between Shanghai and Parachute. He really did not want to sell me the car without my having first seen it which was impractical due to my agenda in China. We reached agreement on my purchase of this car without my ever having seen it. Do I regret this seemingly risky acquisition? Not for a minute; John had been more than forthright in explaining what was wrong with the car, what parts were missing, what work had been done, etc. There were no surprises, (or better yet, almost no surprises). Whatever surprises did come to light during the restoration were not due to non-disclosure, nor would I have discovered them as a result of a personal survey of the vehicle.

John Wenter had owned the 327/28 since 1983, and had driven it in and around New Orleans for several years. Its earlier U.S. history is difficult to reconstruct, as John's records had been destroyed in a fire that had leveled his home in Parachute a few years ago.

A certificate issued by BMW in 2003 documents that the car, VIN 74469, had originally been delivered to the BMW





dealer AUTOMAG Buchner & Linse in Munich on March 4, 1939. The car had been black with red cloth upholstery, a popular combination in colors and materials. A total of 567 327/ 28s were built by BMW between 1937 and 1941. with only 86 as coupes; thus, this car is quite rare. Bill Young recently purchased another post-war BMW coupe. When that has been cleaned up, it will be a stunning addition to the Colorado-based WW II era Bimmers!



Restoration by Josef Freudenberger Junior

I first saw "my car" in February 2003, when I was in Germany on a business trip, and visited the Josef Freudenberger shop in Eggenfelden, where the car had been delivered in early January. The Freudenbergers, father and son, had taken the car apart, literally removing everything from the frame, all body panels, whatever little wood was left of the framing, the interior, the drive train—you name it. No two pieces remained attached to each other.

This was the first phase of a 15-month restoration project. The project led to the coupe's generally being restored to original condition, albeit in two-tone dark-green with beige leather interior in lieu of the original black exterior/red cloth upholstery.

In the process of restoration, we decided upon a number of other changes, some purely esthetic, and some to make the car more user-friendly and frankly more reliable:

We changed the 55 HP engine back to the original 80 HP version, well known from the successful competition model 328 (of which three cars reside in Colorado, including the beautiful ex-Ernie Weil racer now being campaigned by Ernie's widow, Decker Swann).

In rebuilding the engine, it received a 501 crankshaft with larger journals than the 327 and 328 engines. It was modified for use of un-leaded gasoline, and it now has the larger valves used by the latest generation of Bristol engines built in England after the war. With a compression ratio of 10.6: 1 (compared to the original ratio of 7.5:1) this engine now produces well over 100 HP, significantly increasing the "Freude am Fahren" (or "driving pleasure"), which is BMW's slogan for the Ultimate Driving Machines of today's generation.

We up-graded the electrical system from originally 6V to 12V, making starting the car infinitely easier and more reliable.

We installed a Volvo transmission with overdrive, allowing highway cruising at 75 to 80 mph with engine speeds in the 2,500-rpm range, far more pleasant than having the engine rev between 3,000 and 3,500 rpm.

To enhance the esthetics of the car, I decided to replace the original mushroom combination dashboard instrument with the optionally available round instruments. These round instruments, standard on the 328 model, were one of a few options for the 327/28 cars in 1939. Apart from the pure looks, it allows for a tachometer, which I am very happy to have. I also decided on beige Connelly leather for the interior—a break with tradition, but a beautiful combination with the dark green exterior.

As I said, the project took 15 months (mid January 2003 until mid April 2004) and I had an 18-month window for the duty-free temporary import of the car into Germany for restoration purposes. The car had to leave Germany by the end of June, which was a well-understood deadline. The Freudenbergers have restored a total of thirty 327 and 327/28s, including five coupes, so that I benefited from this extraordinary experience. There was no uncertainty, no major surprise.

A hiccup occurred when we realized that the cast iron engine block in the car had a crack; this crack was discovered in July 2003, i.e. relatively late. Securing a replacement block became a critical path item in the restoration. Fortunately a friend in New Jersey had a block available. After making a deal for this block during a meeting at Pebble Beach in August 2003, I drove back across the country. I picked up the block north of Chicago, and headed straight for Philadelphia airport for a flight to Munich, where the block accompanied me as check-in baggage. It's tough flying economy with an 80-pound engine block in tow, but it all worked out. The block was confirmed to be first class, so that the engine now in this coupe is made up of a new block out of a 328, a new crank-

shaft out of a 501, a brand new cam and a fully up-dated Bristol head.

"5 - 50 - 500"

Some years ago, I had read a very persuasive article about a logical step-by-step break-in process after a total restoration of a vintage car. I don't remember the publication, or the particular car that the author had used for his example. The article essentially said when a car has been

totally reworked, it needs to be thoroughly tested before using it for a major tour or rally. The author's recommendation: Step 1—driving distance should be limited to about 5 miles, sticking close to the restoration shop, as there would inevitably be issues to deal with before one ventured too far afield. Step 2 would then be a 50-mile outing, still sticking close to home. Having an old car towed back to home base when you're 20 or 30 miles away is a lot easier than if you are 100 or 200 miles away. Once the 5 and 50 mile test drives have been accomplished, the next step is a 500 mile trip, a final shakedown, during which the car should perform trouble-free; if that is not the case, this third step needs to be repeated.

With this message clearly registered in my mind, I had decided to push the envelope a significant step further and go to a 5 – 50 – 500 – 2500 mile test. Josef Freudenberger had done steps 1, 2 and 3. I spent the month of May 2004 putting another 2,500 miles of happy motoring in Germany and France on the car. Then it was a return visit to the Freud-

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enberger shop for a second oil change and a re-torquing of the head. What a dream project! It was a blast taking a beautifully restored 327/28 Coupe through parts of Germany, then participating in a 4-day Elsation Holiday put on by the German BMW Veterans Club in France, and then a rally in the nearby Saarland in Germany. Most of the time the car performed flawlessly. However my extended test drive turned out to be a smart decision.



Paint makes such a difference

After about 2500 miles (total) the gearbox began to give me trouble; 4th no longer engaged as it had up to that point (and as I had owned a Volvo 121 in the 1960s, I knew how these gear boxes should feel). That meant a tear down of the gearbox (a one-and-a-half day project), as it required pulling out the box through the top, after removal of carpets and seats. Freudenberger discovered a broken 4th gear synchroring, which was replaced by a ring from another Volvo box. A further extensive test drive ensued. This "final" test drive revealed a strange noise in the region of the right rear wheel; could it be a rubbing brake shoe? We pulled the wheel and removed the brake drum, but there was no sign of distress in the brake.

During a very long night of examining the entire rear end, Freudenberger discovered that the new SKF bearing in the right rear wheel was defective. It is a blessing that the bearing companies evidently have some measure of standardization; a replacement SKF bearing was purchased from an auto parts store the next morning. By noon, following a "final final" test drive, I was off for my last stretch of Autobahn driving en-route to Bremerhaven, where I delivered the car on May 31st for its "row-row" trip back to the United States.

What next?

Since that time, the car has been on display at BMW NA in Woodcliff Lake, NJ, participated (faultlessly) in the 2004 BMW Vintage Marathon in the east, and now resides in the museum of BMW Manufacturing in Spartanburg, SC. It will return to Colorado well in time for the 2005 season, during which it will participate in a number of Colorado events, including the BMW V&CCCA "Colorado Holiday" in July 2005.

MINI Offers New 2005 John Cooper Works Kit for Mini Cooper S

Fully Warranted Kit Offers Increased Horsepower and Torque

Woodcliff Lake, NJ October 27, 2004.... MINI USA announces the availability of its new higher-output John Cooper Works kit for 2005. Produced by the legendary aftermarket company John Cooper Works, the new kit for the MINI Cooper S offers increased horsepower and torque over that of the previous generation. Horsepower is now increased to 207 hp at 6,950 rpm from 200 hp at the same rpm. Torque is also boosted, now registering 180 pounds-feet at 4,500 rpm, up from 177 pounds-feet at 4,000 rpm.

The unique John Cooper Works Company kit is sold exclusively through MINI dealers and is covered under MINI's comprehensive new car warranty. Key enhancements for the new 2005 John Cooper Works kit include a redesigned air box with an electronically-controlled air induction system, a set of higher flow fuel injectors and a reprogrammed electronic control unit.

The new air box features an electronically controlled valve that opens an additional air duct at higher engine speeds, This allows more fresh air to enter though a special low restriction filter element. In addition to dramatically increasing the airflow, the new air box creates a more powerful induction sound that compliments the impressive growl from the performance exhaust, also part of the kit.

Of course, the cornerstone of the package remains the enhanced Eaton supercharger with specially-coated vanes that generate increased flow pressure. The unit comes with a pulley design that allows the unit to spin at a higher RPM. This, along with the increased flow pressure, generates an increase in power over the stock unit.





A high performance cylinder head also remains a key ingredient. The modified head has improved port flow and has been specifically designed for the increased compression and heat produced by the supercharger. For 2005, new injectors with a higher fuel flow and a set of performance spark plugs with a colder heat rating, also help to increase the power output.

With its new upgrades for 2005, the enhanced Electronic Control Unit (ECU) has been recalibrated to optimize power output and drivability, resulting in lively throttle response and increased acceleration in the mid-range torque band. The reprogrammed ECU optimizes the power output by managing all engine control functions including airflow, combustion, fuel delivery and spark advance.

Also included in the package is a stainless steel Sport Exhaust System. The system is a parallel-flow, low backpressure system with superb interior and exterior noise quality. The system adds a throatier, more powerful exhaust note, and has distinctive-looking twin chrome exhaust tips.

Visual cues for the kit are understated and will appeal to the MINI enthusiast. A unique chrome John Cooper Works badge adorns the rear deck lid and when raised, the bonnet reveals a visually appealing silver intercooler surround with a John Cooper Works logo. An individually numbered valve cover

plaque tops it off and commemorates the exclusivity of this special package.

John Cooper Works has engineered this kit so that it can be offered in all markets where the MINI is sold around the world. Therefore, a MINI Cooper S equipped with the John Cooper Works Package must be able to withstand extreme temperatures and variations in fuel quality, but still offer enhanced power in an extremely reliable package.

The John Cooper Works kit is sold and professionally installed through all MINI dealers in the U.S. A MINI Cooper S equipped with the dealer-installed package is fully backed by MINI's 4 year, 50,000-mile new car warranty. And the John Cooper Works package is not just limited to new cars. For those customers who already have the previous-generation John Cooper Works kit installed on their MINI Cooper S, a special upgrade kit includes the new air box, injectors and a reprogramming of the ECU for \$525.00 plus 1.5 hours of labor for installation. Also, owners of an existing MINI Cooper S may visit their local MINI dealer and have the kit installed at any time. The balance of the factory warranty will still remain in effect. Brazilian Grand Prix - RACE 24th October 2004

Weather: rain at the beginning and some drizzle later on. Temp: Air 24°C, Track 26°C, Humidity 75-78%

Sao Paolo (BRA). In the final race of the 2004 FIA Formula One World Championship the BMW WilliamsF1 Team celebrated its first victory of the season:

Juan Pablo Montoya became the winner of the Brazilian Grand Prix by

a margin of 1.0 second. It is the fourth F1 win for the Colombian and the tenth win since the beginning of the BMW and WilliamsF1 partnership in 2000. The last race won by the team was also thanks to Montoya, in Hockenheim, on 3rd August 2003. Ralf Schumacher, who drove his last race for the team as did Montoya, came fifth. Montoya finished his season fifth in the Drivers' Championship, Schumacher ended up in 9th place having missed six races through injury. The BMW WilliamsF1 Team consolidated their fourth position in the Constructors' Championship.

Chassis: FW26 05 - Best time: 1:11.473 min (lap 49, lap record)

Still, the race was decided by a good strategy put together by all of my engineers and by Sam Michael, who called me in to change tires from intermediate to slick at the right time. Later in the race they made another good call when I had Kimi behind me. They managed to get me out on the track ahead of him by just over a second. I could see him behind and I was thinking I could not afford to make even the smallest mistake! It's fantastic to give such a good end to these four years at Williams BMW. I want to say thanks to Frank and to everyone in the team who made this possible! And if you ask me what was the hardest thing in the race I'd say it was the pain in the neck, since this is an anti-clockwise circuit and we are not very used to all those left turns!

Ralf Schumacher: 5th

Chassis: FW26 07 - Best time: 1:11.764 min (lap 23, 5th overall)

What a shame, due to the rain my strategy did not pay off at all. But I have to say that I was not fast enough to overtake Alonso and as a consequence I think I missed out on a podium today. It was great to be with this team for the last six years and it's a true pity we didn't enjoy even more success. I wish the Team all the best for next year!

Sam Michael (Technical Director WilliamsF1):

What a fantastic way to finish the season, with a superb drive from Juan Pablo! He didn't put a foot wrong, the pit crew and the engineers got everything right as well. With tricky conditions at the start of the race fuel loads were critical. Ralf also did a good job. Unfortunately he lost some time in the pits, but regardless he didn't give up and overtook a couple of cars during the race. Michelin's intermediate tire performed well at the start of the race. It's been a hard season for us

and this is a great reward for all the people who worked hard in the Grove and Munich factories and at the circuit to turn the FW26 around and finally, all the best to Juan Pablo and Ralf for the future.

Mario Theissen (BMW Motorsport Director):

This was a great relief for the team after a long and tough season. I am proud of our team's recovery from a difficult situation and we have now come back to former strengths. My compliments to both the drivers who gave everything at their last race for the team. Juan's race was just perfect. This progress is of great importance for our technicians as it is exactly the right motivation for the development of the new car and engine. The tenth victory feels as good as the first one. We are back!

Formula BMW -Interview with BMW Motorsport Director, Dr. Mario Theissen

Q: Dr. Theissen, the Formula BMW ADAC Championship 2004 has come to an end. What's your conclusion for the season?

Dr Mario Theissen: We have witnessed some fantastic sport. Virtually all 20 races were exciting until the last bend and the last two races in Hockenheim were top-class events. It's extremely rewarding to see the progress that has been made by our new generation pilots within the space of a few months. This is particularly the case for the ten sponsored drivers from BMW and the ADAC

Q: And champion Sebastian Vettel is one of them.

Dr Theissen: When Sebastian won the Rookie Cup in 2003, it was clear that he had a great deal of talent. This year, he took another great step forward. He performed outstandingly. It will be a very long time before his 18 wins and 387 points are beaten. Now Sebastian has grown out of the Formula BMW ADAC Championship. Next year he will be lining up on the starting grid in the Formula 3 Euro Series. We should like to wish him every success there.

Q: The internationalization of Formula BMW is continuing. After Formula BMW Asia was established a year ago, Formula BMW Series were also launched in Great Britain and the USA in 2004. Did everything go according to plan?

Dr Theissen: The Formula BMW UK Championship had a flying start. Formula racing has a long tradition in Great Britain and most of the teams had a great deal of experience. Although it's not the same story in North America, Formula BMW USA managed to establish itself immediately as the most important entry-level series in Open Wheel Racing there. It won the hearts and minds of a lot of fans this season.

Q: How do you explain the worldwide success of Formula BMW?

Dr Theissen: Firstly, we set standards when it comes to safety. Our vehicles meet all safety criteria for the significantly more powerful and faster Formula 3 racing cars. Secondly, Formula BMW offers its drivers more than simply a car. Our training and continued next page

coaching program teaches the next generation of drivers everything they need to know about making their way in the world of motor sport. This concept has taken Formula BMW right to the top: Formula BMW has developed into the top entry-level series for global Formula racing from a standing start.

Q: And now?

Dr Theissen: We are currently holding the observation trials for 2005 at the BMW Racing Center in Valencia. We've discovered a number of talented young drivers there, and they will certainly attract a lot of attention in the future. I'm already looking forward to the next season.

BMW WilliamsF1 Team Acknowledges CRB Verdict

Oxford, October 20, 2004. The BMW WilliamsF1 Team today acknowledged the verdict delivered by the Contract Recognitions Board (CRB) that Jenson Button is legally bound to BAR for the 2005 season.

The team also confirmed that it would not seek to challenge the judgment under any other legal jurisdiction.

In response to the verdict, the BMW WilliamsF1 Team Principal Frank Williams said, "Naturally we are disappointed with the CRB's conclusion. We took the view that Jenson was a driver worth challenging for, and based on strong legal advice, we have no regrets about making a bid for his services. The CRB accepted a significant number of the BMW WilliamsF1 Team's arguments, but nevertheless found against us. We do not believe any further legal action in relation to this matter to be in the broader interests of the sport. In spite of the CRB's conclusion, which relates to 2005, we will maintain our close relationship with Jenson for 2006."

Jenson Button commented, "Naturally I am disappointed by the ruling, but as a matter of principle, I firmly believe in standing by the decision the CRB have reached today. BAR has been extremely professional at the race track during this process, and I expect this to continue. I look forward to joining the BMW WilliamsF1 Team in the future."

BMW Team PTG M3s Score 9th Rolex Series GT - Win at Barber

Auberlen and Marks Lead Fifth 1-2 M3 Finish of Season

Birmingham, Al - October 11, 2004... Under constantly changing weather conditions, BMW Team PTG scored its ninth Rolex Sports Car Series GT class victory and fifth 1-2 BMW M3 finish of the season in the Porsche 250 at Barber Motorsports Park today.

Bill Auberlen and Justin Marks, driving the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3, completed 87 laps in the 250-mile race around the 2.38-mile Barber Motorsports Park circuit, finishing one lap ahead of the No. 22 BMW Team PTG M3 of Boris Said and Joey Hand.

The win moves BMW to a 13-point lead over Porsche in the Manufacturer Points and clinches the Team Points title for

the No. 21 M3. Said and Hand's second consecutive runner-up finish moves the No. 22 M3 to second place in the Team Points standings.

BMW Team PTG drivers have secured the top-three positions in the Driver Points with Auberlen continuing to lead by four points over Said. Marks' win moves him to third. Hand stands in sixth place.

The win was Auberlen's eighth of the season and second consecutive victory since setting a record six wins in a row in Rounds 2 through 7. Marks has now tallied four wins, all codriving with Auberlen.

Said and Hand's second-place finish was their third podium finish of the season. The duo shared a win in Round 8. Said shared four wins with Auberlen in Rounds 2 through 5.

Tom Milner and Kelly Collins drove a third M3 and finished eighth, completing 83 laps. The duo started fourth and lost a number of laps early in the race after unscheduled pit stops for tire changes.

Auberlen started the No. 21 M3 from its eighth pole of the season and took command of the race from the first lap. Because of the threatening rain Team PTG elected to start the No. 21 M3 on dry tires and both the No. 22 and No. 16 M3s on rain tires. The dry tire choice proved to be the correct one as the heavy rain held off and the No. 21 M3 was able to stay on track as both of the other M3s had to pit, and re-pit, for dry tires. It was on one of those stops that a wheel gun jammed on the left rear wheel nut of the No. 22 M3 resulting in a damaged airline and a stop-and-go penalty. The penalty cost Said and Hand one lap, but they were still able to hold onto a second place finish. The results were not as good for the No. 16 M3 as early race pit stops for tires cost Milner and Collins two laps. Hard driving in very slippery conditions by 18-year old Milner in the closing stages of the race was not enough to improve on an eighth-place class finish.

The final round of the Rolex Sport Car Series will be held at California Speedway in Fontana, Calif. on October 29-31. The race will be televised live on Speed Channel on Oct. 31 at 4:00 p.m. ET.

BILL AUBERLEN, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3 (first):

"Today it was a real dog-fight. We went from first under the green to last under the yellow and back to first under green again. Luckily, this weather played to one of our strengths. Justin is one of the few drivers I know who likes changing conditions. He told me that if it rained off and on he would outrun everyone. He delivered and I can breathe a little easier about the championship."

JUSTIN MARKS, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3 (first):

"The No. 21 M3 was perfectly set-up for anything that the track or the rain could send our way. The effort the team made to get us out front and keep us there was fantastic."

BORIS SAID, DRIVER NO. 22 BMW TEAM PTG M3 (second):

"We started on rain tires and I thought that it was the right choice. We lost a lot of track position as it stayed dry and

had to pit for slicks. We were able to get it all back, but the penalty ultimately cost us one lap."

JOEY HAND, DRIVER NO. 22 BMW TEAM PTG M3 (second):

"I was not going to take any chances in these conditions, especially after we lost a lap due to the stop-and-go penalty and I


began to develop a brake problem. I knew that I was safely ahead of the third place car so I ran to preserve our 1-2 M3 finish."

TOM MILNER, OWNER, BMW TEAM PTG:

"This probably was not one of our best races from the standpoint of strategy. We were very unsure of when and how much it would rain so we started the No. 21 M3 on dry tires and the No. 22 and 16 M3s on rain tires. We made a number of tire changes on the No. 16 M3, but just not at the optimum time and lost laps. We got the No. 22 M3 back on the right tires at the right time, but the penalty cost us a lap. It was not pretty, but we raced the conditions and took another 1-2 M3 finish."

HERNANDO CARVAJAL, MOTORSPORT MANAGER, BMW OF NORTH AMERICA, LLC:

"Another great day for BMW Team PTG. They gambled with the tires as the weather could have gone either way. The win went to the No. 21 M3, but the No. 22 M3 was never far behind. Rain or no rain everyone did everything possible to ensure a ninth victory."





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News From National

DIRECTORS & OFFICERS LIABILITY INSURANCE

Good news! We have a letter and appurtenant documents set to go out to you as well as some real-life examples of claims against like organizations. Based on the overwhelmingly affirmative response by the majority of BMW CCA chapters regarding the need for coverage; during the meeting in Kansas City, October 16th, the BMW CCA Board voted to make D & O coverage for chapters a minimum requirement. So along with the requirement for Motorsport Liability coverage, we will now have the requirement for D & O coverage added to the Operations Manual.

The BMW CCA Board also voted to help defray the cost of the coverage by paying 20% of it, thereby reducing the burden borne by the chapters for this very important insurance.

RE-CHARTERING CHAPTERS

Many of the chapter files at National do not contain original charter documents for the chapters, and many, if not most chapters do not possess a charter document. So that we have a common and current chartering baseline and documents on file to support all our chapters' existence, we will re-issue charters to our chapters. These will not be new charters, but rather, replacements. These will be sent to each chapter along with the most current BMW CCA bylaws. Each

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chapter will be asked to acknowledge receipt of the charter and provide BMW CCA with the most recent version of their bylaws.

DRIFTING as a BMW CCA Event

When we obtained coverage for the drifting exhibition at Oktoberfest a member was kind enough to provide me with a descriptive paragraph for Wisenberg. Basically we represented that drifting would be a slow-speed autocross with an extremely tight course. However, in reviewing the Oktoberfest event info, Wisenberg has determined that what we really conducted was not at all a low-speed autocross. That drifting does NOT equal autocross. Drifting is new and the risk factors are different. If we'd like to press for coverage, we would need to develop and submit a complete rules package for consideration, but caution is advised as drifting is not automatically suitable to autocross courses. Wisenberg will not cover drifting events as part of our coverage, nor do they cover drifting for any other clubs at this time.

ELECTIONS

Positions open are: Treasurer, Secretary, South Atlantic Regional Vice President, North Central Regional Vice President and Pacific Regional V.P.

Currently there are three positions available on the national Driving Events Committee, as well: South Atlantic Region, North Central Region and Pacific Region. People have exhibited interest, but I have not received any nominations yet. Dan Tackett, Lance White and Scott Collins are all definitely retiring of their own volition, so don't hold back if you're afraid of offending them by running.

The Club Racing Advisory Committee also has positions open for election.

f you attended the Fall Dinner last month, you already know that our chapter raised about \$300 in cash and another \$200 in products/items to support Gateway Battered Women's Services. Thanks again to all who participated in this special fund drive!

Gateway was selected as our focus charity associated with our Fall Dinner. They have been operating in the local community for over 25 years, serving the victims of domestic violence. If you're unfamiliar with this cause, here are some startling facts about the problem that Gateway's staff deals with daily:

- Domestic violence occurs among all races and socio-economic groups.
- A woman is beaten every 12-15 seconds in the United States; 4 women are killed each day, approximately 1,400 a year
- Statistically, in the US, a woman is more likely to be assaulted, injured, raped, or killed by her partner than by any other assailant.
- An estimated 4- to 5-million American women are battered each year by their husbands or partners.
- Violence occurs at least once in two-thirds of all marriages.
- Domestic violence is the leading cause of homelessness among women and children.
- Many of society's worst woes are linked to family violence in the home, including drug abuse, gang violence, school dropouts, and teen pregnancy.
- Domestic violence is the leading cause of injuries to women ages 15-44.
- On any given day in Colorado, nearly 200 women make crisis calls to battered women's shelters.

NOTE: The above facts and figures are considered to be conservative since many domestic violence injuries are reported as accidents or clumsiness on the part of the victim or the victim is not allowed to report it.







As with its predecessors, the fifth generation BMW 3 Series raises the sport sedan benchmark - decisively and significantly. Continuing to improve a concept that BMW pioneered more than forty years ago, the new 3 Series offers greater performance, safety and security as well as greater comfort and convenience.



<u>Groundbreaking six-cylinder with light-weight</u> <u>magnesium crankcase</u>

The new 3 Series will enter the U.S. market in summer of 2005 with a choice of two in-line 6-cylinder engines, continuing a 3 Series tradition. The all-new 3.0-liter unit in the 330i offers a significant increase in performance. It is rated at 255-horsepower (SAE), a 30-horsepower increase over its predecessor.

In BMW's ongoing pursuit of weight reduction, this engine is the first in large-scale series production to use magnesium which, compared to aluminum, is 30 percent lighter. Magnesium is used in the crankcase, the crankshaft bearings and the cylinder head cover.

This engine is also the first six-cylinder to use BMW VALVETRONIC. With infinitely variable valve lift in place of the traditional throttle butterfly, this system improves both throttle response and fuel efficiency. Like previous BMW engines which have incorporated VALVETRONIC, the gains are impressive. In the case of the 330i, horsepower increases by 13%, while fuel consumption decreases by 12%. This unique technology works in tandem with BMW's double-VANOS variable valve timing for both intake and exhaust camshafts. The new 330i will accelerate from 0 - 60 mph in approximately six seconds.

Six-speed transmissions on both models

Both models will be offered in the U.S. with a choice of a standard six-speed manual transmission or optional six-speed STEPTRONIC automatic transmission. The benefits of a six-speed manual in terms of acceleration, cruising comfort and fuel efficiency have been demonstrated in the previous 330i. These same benefits have also been proven on other BMWs which offer the new six-speed STEPTRONIC automatic. Those benefits will now be available to all 3 Series drivers.

Starting the engine at the touch of a button

The 3 Series is the latest BMW to feature the convenience of a start button. After firing up the engine at the touch of a button, all other functions operate seamlessly.

Reflecting BMW's rich heritage, the new BMW 3 Series continues some long standing traditions - engine mounted longitudinally up front, drive power to the rear wheels and

near perfect 50:50 balance of weight over the front and rear wheels. These have contributed to the 3 Series well-earned reputation as the best handling sports sedan on the market.

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


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
