



BMW Continues to have Great News! Rewards Program Extended

Looking to purchase a new BMW? You're in luck. BMW CCA has extended the Rewards Program through December 31, 2005; all vehicles qualify except the Z8. Check it out in your monthly Roundel or the BMW CCA website at http:// www.bmwcca.org/services/svcfset.shtml The basic guidelines remain the same - one must be a member in good standing of the BMW CCA for at least one year continuously prior to purchasing your vehicle (please do not contact BMW CCA about back dating memberships, they will not wavier on this issue), and one must file the documentation within 60 days of taking delivery of the vehicle. We have not received the updated forms yet, but understand that BMW NA has also included the Z4 in the program. Anyone purchasing a Z4 after January 1, 2005—and fulfilling the other program requirements—can apply for the rebate.

MINI Offers Limited Slip Differential and Automatic Transmission On 2005 MINI Cooper S and MINI Cooper S Convertible

Enhanced Performance and Convenience Offered With New Options; Updated Pricing for 2005 Model Year Takes Effect



Woodcliff Lake, NJ - December 8, 2004... MINI USA announces the availability of a limited slip differential and an automatic transmission as new options for the 2005 MINI Cooper S. In addition, a number of product enhancements and price adjustments across the 2005 model range take effect. Product changes are effective on cars produced January, 2005 and later, with new pricing effective on cars wholesaled after January 1st.

Limited Slip = Performance Grip

The MINI Cooper S and MINI Cooper S Convertible can now be optioned with a new limited slip differential, a performance feature coveted by motoring enthusiasts. The limited slip differential helps to divert more torque towards the drive wheel with better traction; ensuring power is transmitted to the road more effectively. This helps to increase traction under acceleration or during cornering, resulting in improved handling and increased stability.

The unit, manufactured by GKN Driveline, is a torque-sensitive differential that manages torque output under acceleration and offers a 30% slip rate. This means, there is no loss of torque if the difference in grip between the two wheels is 30% or less. The system also allows the threshold for Dynamic Stability Control (DSC) to be increased without impeding the system's safe intervention in slippery situations. All of this benefits the enthusiastic driver of a MINI Cooper S at its performance edge. The limited slip differential is priced at \$500 and is only available with the manual 6-speed transmission.

Automatic for the (Performance Minded) People

For the first time, the MINI Cooper S and MINI Cooper S Convertible will be offered with a six-speed automatic transmission including Steptronic mode and Steptronic shifting paddles on the steering wheel. Unlike the MINI Cooper Continuously Variable Transmission, this new automatic transmission has fixed gear ratios which result in quick gear changes and a dynamic driving experience tuned specifically to match the MINI Cooper S' sporty character. This new automatic transmis-

sion is built by Aisin and features the following gear ratios:

Transmission type AISIN Automatic

Gear ratio 1st / 2nd / 3rd 4,044 / 2,371 / 1,556

Gear ratio 4th / 5th / 6th 1,159 / 0,852 / 0,672

Reverse gear ratio 3,193

Final drive ratios 3.683

The unit also features Adaptive Transmission Control which allows the transmission to adapt to one's driving style. For example, the transmission will build the revs longer between gear changes if it 'knows' the driver enjoys taking the car to its limits. The automatic transmission is priced at \$1,350.

The MINI Cooper and MINI Cooper Convertible will continue to be offered with the Continuously Variable Transmission (CVT) with Steptronic. The CVT works without holding to

specific gear ratios, allowing the unit to variably adapt to the driving situation at any given instance. The unit offers smooth in-town 'gear changes' for leisurely driving and more dynamic responsiveness for spirited driving. The CVT transmission is priced at \$1,300.

Pricing Changes and Product Enhancements for January, 2005

Separately, MINI USA announces a price adjustment effec-



tive for models wholesaled to dealers from January 1, 2005 onward. The base MSRP for the MINI Cooper and MINI Cooper Convertible increases by \$501. The MINI Cooper S and MINI Cooper S Convertible base MSRP both increase by \$500. With new product enhancements for the 2005 models, MINI continues to offer customers a compelling price/value combination and premium positioning.

New enhancements available for January, 2005 models onward include; a new 17" Web-Spoke alloy wheel and performance run-flat tire package. The package is a \$1,100 stand-alone option on the MINI Cooper S and MINI Cooper S Convertible, or is a \$500 upgrade when the sport package chosen on the S models.

A number of new convenience items are available, including an auto dimming interior rear view mirror for \$200 and rain sensing front windshield wipers with automatic on/off headlights - also for \$200. These features are also packaged together with the universal garage door opener - which also remains an independent option for \$200 - to create a new convenience package, available for \$400.

Motorsports Around The World

Five cockpits for the 2005 season remain vacant

January 4, 2005 - The new Formula One season kicks off in 60 days, and five cockpits are still available, with BMW.WilliamsF1Team the BMW WilliamsF1 Team also having to sign one Grand Prix driver.



Although 2005 is already four days old and the 2005 season gets underway in Melbourne on 6th March, a quarter of the Grand Prix seats for the forthcoming season have not yet been assigned. One of the teams still to sign a Grand Prix driver for the 2005 season is the BMW WilliamsF1 Team. While Mark Webber will definitely contest the 2005 season for the Anglo-German partnership, it has not yet been decided who will be the Australian's team-mate, with Nick Heidfeld and Antonio Pizzonia having the best prospects to secure the drive.

Red Bull Racing is one of the other teams to have signed only one Grand Prix driver so far. David Coulthard will definitely sit behind the wheel of one of the former Jaguar Racing team's cars, while last year's Jaguar driver Christian Klien and Formula 3000 Champion Vitantonio Liuzzi are regarded as the favorites for the team's second cockpit. Minardi has also signed only one driver so far: Christijan Albers.

The only team that still has yet to sign two Grand Prix drivers is Jordan. However, the team has succeeded in guaranteeing that it will contest the 2005 season thanks to having secured a Toyota engine deal MSR






fter many years of active participation at the local level there comes a time to get involved and make a contribution at the national level. This is my motivation for seeking election to the position of National Secretary.



Those that respond to our 'lapsed member surveys' are mainly telling us:

- " i sold the car, no longer a bmw owner. thanks and good luck!"
 - "I sold my BMW..."
 - "I've sold my BMW. Thanks JT"
- "I have decided not to renew my membership at this time."

Messages such as...

"if you could ask the local chapters to discuss aspects of these vehicles at their meetings, say a "theme night" E36 or E34 or differences in frames through the year, what sort of tires to use? My feeling was that the local membership group was more like a party. If the local could somehow tie its meeting to an article in the Roundel, I would probably still stay joined. As for partying, I enjoy a good party, but I would rather make a weekend of it and learn something, than see how much beer members can drink in one sitting." ... are forwarded on to the chapter the member was enrolled in

The responses I find unsettling (because we have no control over them):

"Thank you for the reminder. After many years of owning BMW's, I have decided the margue is just not what it used to be (although I have the greatest respect and admiration for BMW CCA and the Roundel magazine) and I have moved on to another marque. BMW (the corporation) seems to have really lost its way with overly complex vehicles and styling which I do not care for at all. They simply are no longer "ultimate driving machines" but rather boring and unnecessarily tricked out gadget carriers. Loved the Club. Thanks again."

'Thank you for the reminder.. My membership has lapsed simply because I no longer own a BMW auto (have been a BMW motorcycle owner for years). I have been impressed with BMWCCA - great magazine, activities, etc. - a very well run club.

If BMW would get rid of Chris Bangle and his ugly designs. I would likely buy another BMW. I would love to see a toned down (style wise) Z4 with a 6 or 8 cylinder M engine - that would bring me back. The Z3 was such a beautiful car stylistically. It's really a damned shame that Chris Bangle and his team buggered up the Z4 styling so badly - that goes for the 5 and 7 Series and their I-Drive systems as well. Frankly, I'm disgusted with BMW allowing this to happen. Thank you."

"I wanted to reply to your previous email regarding my decision to not renew. Please understand that this decision has nothing to do with you or the great organization that you represent. My failure to renew is about one thing only, and that is my total disappointment and disgust with the direction that BMW has decided to move in. I am a 37 year old life long BMW enthusiast, and I am the youngest of 5 boys that are (were) BMW fans. Between us we have probably owned as many as 15+ BMW's. Ranging from 2002's, M5's, and 750il's. While at first puzzled with the introduction of the new 7 series a few years back, I thought for sure that the overwhelming controversy and negative feedback would result in the new 5 series being modified accordingly so as to bring BMW back to center. I was very anxiously awaiting the new 545 with cautious enthusiasm, as it was my intention to replace my current 1999 540. Needless to say, the new 5 series in my opinion is a total disaster. (The new 3 almost as bad) That idiot in Germany should be sent on his way before the company implodes around him. This past month I bought a new Mercedes E500, and I am 100% thrilled and happy. It is a bittersweet feeling however; my loyalties have always been with BMW and for no one's fault but their own, I am now a Mercedes owner. I hope someday, when enough of us have voiced our protest, tat Mercedes dealerships et al... that BMW will someday be what they once were. I will be waiting. Thanks for your great efforts."

"No secret. I don't have a BMW any longer. I sold it a year ago, and while I enjoyed the magazine quite a bit, there's really no good reason to stay a member.

I sold the car because it was having a series of mechanical failures that were costing a fortune to repair. They happened just after the warranty expired, so I was stuck paying for it. You'd think that ball joints would last longer than 52,000 miles, but mine went, and BMW would do nothing about it. Same with the A/C compressor at 53,000, the Alternator at 54,000 and the fan in the heating and cooling system at 54,500. I loved the car, but a thousand dollars a month required more love than I had.

So I bought an Acura TL. Not a BMW, but pretty darned nice, and a LOT more reliable. The magazine was fine. No complaints."

News From National

AUTOCROSS STANDARDS

WOW! Great responses – again, they will be posted to the digests for all to review and comment upon – but this from Puget Sound, I thought exceptionally well presented:

This is a follow-up to my previous message, saying our chapter approves of the proposed Autocross minimum standards. We would like to comment on two items that caught our attention.

- 1. The stated minimum age is 16. If this is allowable for autocrosses, why are 16 year olds not allowed to drive at skills schools which are run in a similar environment, at low speeds using cones? The family friendly aspect of our driving schools is an important element, and the ability to include all family members of driving age in the same event strengthens that aspect. And the 16-18 year olds need the instruction more than adults. I know the Street Survival program is meant to address this, but we are averaging an SS event every two years. We put on two skills days a year, and it would be great to include 16-18 year old drivers at those events.
- 2. Re: the minimum turn radius of 25 feet: Our chief instructor, Walt Conley, has this comment: "I would like to see them reconsider 2.3.1.d requiring a minimum 25' inside radius for any turn or chicane. Pivot cones are an integral part of many autocrosses as it really forces people to slow down to effectively make the turn I call them discipline turns as you want to go fast but that's not the best way to do it."

Thanks for providing the opportunity for chapters to comment on the proposed standards. Tom Cox President, Puget Sound Chapter, BMW CCA





Automotive Frost Bites

Tips to help you keep your vehicle protected during harsh winter weather

Check your antifreeze (properly called engine coolant) before the mercury takes a dive

Simple and inexpensive testers are available to check your vehicle's level of anti-freeze protection. A 50/50 mixture of coolant and water provides your engine with protection down to 30 degrees below zero, and the additives in the coolant will help prevent internal corrosion that can severely damage today's multi-alloy engines. Always refer to your owner's manual for detailed information about your vehicle.

While the antifreeze capability of coolant is "permanent", over time the additives wear out and contaminants collect in the cooling system. For this reason, most manufacturers recommend that the system be flushed and the coolant replaced every two years or 24,000 miles. Cars equipped with the newer (red) Dexcool™ coolant only need a flush every five years or 50,000 miles. A cooling system flush should include a pressure test and an inspection of the radiator, hoses, radiator cap, water pump, fan clutch or electric cooling fan, fan belt and heater valve.

Choose the right oil to protect your engine

Oil won't freeze the way water will, but its viscosity (thickness) does increase rapidly as the mercury drops. A lighter grade of oil will reduce the load on your car's battery and starter, allowing the engine to crank more rapidly and the engine to start more easily. In addition, a lighter grade of oil will reach critical engine lubrication areas much quicker than thicker oil, greatly reducing wear. Industry studies show that at sub-zero temperatures a 15W-40 oil can take up to 45 seconds longer to reach the valve train than a 5W-30 oil, Choose an oil based on your vehicle manufacturer's recommendations and be sure to install a new filter when changing the oil.

Avoid a safety hazard by having an under car inspection

Raising the car on a hoist for an oil change presents a good opportunity to inspect another system than rarely calls attention to itself, but which can present a significant safety risk when it does – the exhaust. Carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless killer that you don't want around in winter when a car's windows are closed tight and the heater fan is running almost continuously. The mufflers and pipes should be checked carefully for leaks, and all connections and mounting points should be in good condition to reduce the possibility of

Getting the engine's power to the road effectively is essential any time of the year. This is where your car's suspension and tires come in. Have your technician give the suspension a quick once-over. You want to look for worn or damaged springs, shocks, struts and steering components that can impair ride and handling, and make the car more difficult to control in low traction conditions. To reduce underbody rust and deterioration, treat your car to an occasional automatic car wash that has an underbody spray to remove harsh salts and chemicals.

How's your tread

The points where the rubber meets the road are the only things that stand between you and an accident. In wet and snowy road conditions, having good tires with sufficient tread is crucial. Most cars today are sold with all-season tires that do an adequate job in average winter conditions. However, there is no substitute for snow tires, preferably on all four wheels, when the going gets really tough. To check any tire's depth, insert a penny upside down into a tread groove; if you can see above Lincoln's head, the tire is in need of replacement.

Car design plays a significant role in the need for snow tires. Front-wheel-drive cars generally exhibit better winter traction because the mass of the power train is concentrated over the driven wheels. Conversely, rear-wheel-drive cars typically have less weight over the driven wheels and stand to benefit more from snow tires. A couple of bags of sand, placed in the trunk over the rear axle, can often help improve winter traction in a rear-wheel-drive car.

Regardless of type, keep your tires properly inflated to the vehicle manufacturer's recommendations. Tires typically lose one pound of inflation for every 10 degree drop in outside temperature. Most cars have the inflation information on a decal in the glove box, on a door jamb, or inside the trunk. Do not use the inflation pressure molded into the tire sidewall; this is the pressure needed to achieve the tire's rated load capacity, and it may or may not be the correct pressure when that tire is installed on your particular model of car. Never under-inflate tires; it's a myth that lowering tire pressure will increase traction on slippery surfaces.

Take to heart the old adage, "see and be seen". Winter's short days, freezing temperatures, snow, sleet, slush, mud, rain, ice and fog make it extra hard to see where you're going, and make it just as hard for pedestrians and other drivers to see you. It is critical to do everything you can to improve your vision and your visibility. When clearing away accumulated snow, start at the roof and brush off all the horizontal surfaces of the car. If you fail to do so, the movement of your car will blow the snow off the hood and onto the windows. Take special care to remove built up snow from the bumpers where it may obscure your head or taillights.

Make sure all your car's lights are working properly

With the help of a friend, check the headlights, taillights, brake lights, backup lights, running lights, side-marker lights,

fog lights (where applicable), license plate lights, turn signals and four-way hazard warning lights. If you think there might be a problem, check the headlight aim as well; lights aimed too high can blind oncoming drivers and create a virtual whiteout in fog and snowstorms.

All the light in the world is of little use if you can't see out of the car.

If at all possible, never drive away until all of your windows are clear. Make sure your car's heating and defrosting systems are in good working order. Check your wiper blades (front and rear) and replace them if they do not wipe the glass clean in a single sweep. Consider special winter wiper blades covered with rubber boots that prevent snow and ice from accumulating and reducing blade efficiency. Finally, make sure your windshield washer system is working properly and filled with a winter washer solution that will not freeze. (If you should happen to run out of washer fluid and the road conditions cause your windshield to get messy, pull into a safe area and use some clean, wet snow to clean the windshield until you can get some more - and don't forget to clean your headlights and taillights at the same time - a handful of snow rubbed on them will quickly clean off the buildup that can cause their efficiency, and your visibility to others, to be cut in half. Ed.)

Battery problems are the most common cause of AAA road service calls in the winter

If you have any doubts about your car's battery or charging system, or your ability to accurately determine their condition, have a service technician do a complete charging system check, including a battery inspection and load test. If necessary, replace the battery. (AAA members can request a mobile battery service technician to come to their location to do this.)

Be prepared to take care of yourself should an emergency arise

(If an AAA member, always carry your membership card.) Equip your vehicle with an emergency kit containing some or all of the following items, depending on how far you travel off the beaten path:


- Jumper cables
- · Tire chains
- · Windshield washer fluid
- Coolant (50/50 mix)
- · Wiper blades



- Light bulbs
- Hoses
- Belts
- Basic tools
- Flares or reflectors
- Flashlight (with good batteries)
- Blankets
- · Radio receiver
- Cellular phone (with cigarette lighter charger)
- CB radio
- Folding shovel
- Traction sand
- Food that won't freeze
- Medication that you need regularly

Preventative car care is the best way to protect your safety and your investment. Depending upon your driving habits, mileage and the manufacturer's recommended service schedule. Your repair provider may suggest services for your vehicle. With the information provided here, you can better understand the reason for these recommendations and ask the right questions to feel better about your service.



What is TechFest?

riginally established in 1981, Gateway Tech was an annual gathering hosted by the St. Louis BMW Club for those BMW enthusiasts who want to delve just a little deeper into the technology behind their Ultimate Driving Machine[®]. is difficult to find any genuine competitors to the M6, since all other more or less comparable cars are either all-out super sports or sports sedans far inferior in terms of agility. So given the car's innovative drive concept, a power-to-weight ratio even better than on the M5, as well as unique handling – and all this with all the everyday driving qualities of a large coupe – the engineers at BMW M GmbH rightly claim that the new BMW M6 truly comes in a class of its own.

This intelligent control unit is able to sense any tendency to knock via the spark plug in each cylinder, checking the correct ignition setting and recognizing any tendency to misfire and thus allowing the engine to run as closely as possible to its theoretical limits, developing optimum power and performance in the process. The spark plug serves both as an actuator for the ignition and as a sensor observing the combustion process.

Seven-speed SMG transmission conveying M Power to the road.

BMW's seven-speed SMG transmission will be the only one offered in the new M6. This gearbox from BMW M is indeed the world's only sequential transmission with seven gears and Drivelogic. With qualities even greater than on a six-speed SMG gearbox, this transmission allows manual selection of gears with extremely short gearshift times as well



as comfortable cruising qualities thanks to the automatic gear selection function. And at the same time the additional gear keeps the increments between engine speed and torque even smaller, ensuring an absolutely smooth process of one gear "flowing" into the other.

The driver shifts gears in the SMG transmission either from the selector lever or via paddles in the steering wheel. Compared with the conventional SMG transmission, the new generation of SMG technology performs the entire gearshift process 20 per cent faster, gears merging directly into one another.





The New MG

As a result, any interruption of the flow of power inevitable when shifting gears now becomes hardly perceptible. The BMW M6 accelerates virtually without the slightest jolt or interruption from a standstill all the way to top speed.

Drivelogic: The driver determines how SMG shifts gears. Featuring its special Drivelogic function, SMG on the BMW

M6 offers the driver a total of 11 gearshift options allowing him to individually adjust the gearshift characteristics of the SMG transmission to his personal style of motoring.

Six of these driving programs come in the sequential manual function (S-mode), ranging from smooth but dynamic all the way to race track crisp. Driving in the S-mode,



the driver shifts gears manually. But thanks to the launch control function SMG Drivelogic shifts gears automatically shortly before the engine reaches its maximum speed, ensuring an optimum gearshift process with optimum spin control all the way to the top speed of the BMW M6.

In the automatic shift mode (Drive = D-mode), the transmission shifts the seven gears automatically as a function of the driving program currently in use, the driving situation, road speed, and the position of the gas pedal.

SMG for even greater safety and motoring comfort.

Seven-speed SMG supports the driver not only in achieving and enjoying the highest standard of performance comparable to genuine motorsport. It also comes with many safety features opening up the clutch within fractions of a second in a critical situation – for example when shifting down on a slippery surface – in order to keep the car stable and free of excessive engine forces acting on the drive wheels. A further special function is hill detection, which adjusts the gearshift points on uphill and downhill grades. Driving uphill, this avoids the common phenomenon of the gears constantly shifting up and down ("pendulum gearshift"); driving downhill the hill detection mode holds lower gears in mesh longer than usual in order to capitalize on the engine's braking effect.

Last but not least, SMG also enhances the particular sound effect of the V10 power unit: To quote a specialist commenting on this special sound, that "brief, roaring rumble" is simply fantastic when the electronic engine control unit "blips" the throttle between gears when shifting down.

Maximum driving pleasure.

Interaction of the V10 power unit and seven-speed SMG gives the driver of the BMW M6 Coupe driving pleasure of the highest caliber: Acceleration from 0–100 km/h (62 mph) comes in 4.6 seconds and the M6 reaches 200 km/h or 124 mph in just about 14 seconds. Then, at a speed of 250 km/h or 155 mph, the electronic speed governor ends the car's irresistible surge of power, while the speedometer gives you an idea where the engine would take you without such electronic

speed control: the speedometer goes all the way to 330 km/h or 205 mph.

Lapping the Northern Circuit of Nürburgring in 8 minutes.

The world-famous *Nordschleife*, the Northern Circuit of the legendary Nürburgring Race rack, is the perfect benchmark for measuring driving dynamics. For it is here, on the world's most demanding race track, that the exceptional stand out from the mediocre in terms of driving dynamics. Nowhere else is the interaction of all a car's components as clear as here, when driving to the absolute limit. Lapping the Northern Circuit in around 8 minutes, the BMW M6 easily matches the most thoroughbred sports cars, clearly beating the competition.

M Suspension: The icing on the cake of the BMW 6 Series.

Lap times of this kind clearly bear testimony to the M6's driving qualities. Which is actually no surprise, considering that the chassis and suspension already outstanding on the BMW 6 Series as such. The modern assistance systems have been specially adapted on the M6 for truly unparalleled M Performance. Compared with the M5, in turn, the wheelbase is shorter and the car comes with a lower centre of gravity for extra agility on the road. In terms of both chassis equipment and set-up, the M6 is therefore a unique car in every respect.

EDC: From firm and taut all the way to comfortable and extrasmooth.

EDC Electronic Damper Control on the BMW M6 offers the driver the choice of three programs available on demand: Comfort, Normal, and Sports, with the car's chassis and suspension ranging from sporting and taut all the way

to – relatively – smooth and comfortable. The driver operates EDC via the MDrive button on the steering wheel or the push button next to the SMG selector lever.

High-performance brakes like in motorsport.

Reflecting its truly outstanding power and performance, the BMW M6 naturally features extra-large high-performance brakes complete with cross-drilled extra-low-weight compound brake discs. The double-piston swing calipers are made of aluminum and are optimized for both weight and stiffness. Applying the brakes from a speed of 100 km/h (62 mph), the driver of the BMW M6 comes to a standstill after just 36 meters and takes less than 140 meters to reach a stop from a speed of 200 km/h (124 mph).

High-performance athlete in a beautiful body.

With the BMW 6 Series already acknowledged as a strikingly beautiful car, the M6 enhances this impression to an even higher standard. Special design features making this unique Coupe look even more powerful and dynamic, while remaining discreet and unpretentious.

The most eye-catching feature is the truly impressive front air dam. And like all design features on a BMW M Car, this particular element focuses once again primarily on its specific function: The V10 power unit requires roughly twice as much cooling air as the V8 in the BMW 645Ci. Large secondary intake openings to the left and right of the front air dam thus give the engine of the M6 even more air to breathe and cool the brakes at the same time. Through their design alone,

finally, these air openings accentuate the sporting character of the car.

Lightweight engineering and beautiful design in perfect harmony.

Beneath the doors the side-sills powerfully contoured for aerodynamic reasons again emphasize the dynamic impression of this sports coupe. At the same time the side-sills stretch the car for an even sleeker look, making the BMW M6 even lower and more dynamic in its appearance. Inside, the M6 stands out from the "basic" model also through its even more sophisticated Merino leather upholstery with a choice of three different colors or – at extra cost – with full leather upholstery leaving absolutely nothing to be desired.

Despite its simply staggering performance, the BMW M6 does not make any compromises in terms of adequate roominess as well as active and passive safety of the highest standard. Even the level of motoring comfort is virtually the same as in the "regular" model. BMW Group Shatters All Past Annual Sales Records

BMW brand records best month ever

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - January 4, 2005... The BMW Group (BMW and MINI brands combined) reported robust sales for 2004, breaking past annual sales records for both brands, to record a total of 296,111 vehicles, an increase of 7 percent over the 276,869 in 2003. The Group also reported record December sales of 29,292 vehicles, up 18 percent over the 24,915 vehicles sold in the same month in 2003, for an all-time monthly sales record.

BMW Brand Sales

BMW reported sales of 25,482 automobiles and Sports Activity Vehicles, up 22 percent compared to the 20,910 vehicles reported the same month last year, making it the best month ever in retail sales history.

Annual sales of BMW brand vehicles were up 8 percent, to 260,079 vehicles compared to 240,859 vehicles last year.

BMW Automobile Sales

BMW's monthly automobile sales were up 17 percent, to 18,762 versus 16,054 in December 2003. For the month of December, sales were down 5 percent, to 190,250 automobiles compared to 200,144 sold in the same period in 2003.

BMW Sports Activity Vehicle Sales

Sales of BMW's Sports Activity Vehicles increased 38 percent in December, with sales of 6,720 vehicles compared to 4,856 vehicles sold in the final month of 2003. Year-to-date, sales of BMW's SAV models were up 72 percent, to 69,829 vehicles compared to 40,715 for 2003.

Certified Pre-owned

BMW also reported monthly sales of 6,083 Certified Preowned vehicles up 10 percent compared to 5,526 vehicles in December 2003. Annual BMW CPO sales were up 8 percent, to 71,112 vehicles compared to 65,693 sold last calendar year.

MINI Brand

MINI USA reported its strongest year to date, with sales of 36,032, compared to the 36,010 sold in 2003. For the month of December, MINI sales were down 5 percent, to 3,810 automobiles versus 4,005 sold a year ago. MSR




