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
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Marty's 2002 M3 Convertible

"The Long Wait"

s soon as I read that BMW would be producing an M3 convertible, I immediately placed a deposit with Ralph Schomp BMW so I could get my special vehicle order in for one of these vehicles. I was on the waiting list for over a year, and eventually purchased a new 2002 M3 which was one of the first convertibles to be delivered to Colorado. I specifically wanted silver, with gray leather interior and a blue soft top. The top was somewhat difficult because BMW only showed black tops in their catalog and on their web site, but ultimately blue is what I got. This car has options that include: Park Distance Control, Xenon Headlights, Lumbar Support, Harman-Kardon Sound System and the Cold weather package. Oddly enough, included in the cold weather package is a ski bag. Anyone using this car to transport themselves to the slopes needs help. Regardless of traction control, with rear wheel drive, wide tires and power, I just park this car in the winter and move to an SUV. The SMG shifting system was just becoming available as an option, and I wasn't sure how I would like it, so I stuck with the 6 speed manual transmission. (I'm also somewhat of a purist).

My last two cars were a BMW 525i and 528i. The M3 sounded like a great change of pace, but I wasn't sure how I would like the harsh ride and manual shifting over a long period of time driving the many miles of T-Rex. I decided to do a two-year lease, and then return to a sane and conservative ride. What I found was that this car is a pleasure to drive, and one that I looked forward to getting into every morning when I went to the garage. A previous Porsche was the only other car that fit that category. When the lease was up, I wasn't even close to being ready to give up my M3, so I purchased it from BMW.

Now the fun begins. Dinan, the performance company in California, come out with all of their modifications for their S package (Signature Series) in the M3. My dealer, Ralph Schomp BMW installed all of the new high performance components that consist of: Stage 3 Engine Software, High Flow Cold Air Intake / Air Flow Meter Assembly; Free Flow Exhaust

and Front Strut Tower Brace. *Ralph Schomp* also installed a UUC short shifter. While the S package increases the horsepower to almost 360, the sound from the new exhaust system was a significant change. All in all, the performance has been enhanced dramatically, and now I have even more reason to look forward to heading to the garage. **ISR**

Buying Your First Rental Property

The 2005 MINI Convertibles

The MINI Cooper Convertible and the MINI Cooper S Convertible bring the fun of open top motoring to the MINI brand

OVERVIEW

The MINI Cooper Convertible & MINI Cooper S Convertible: Genuine MINI

Since MINI debuted in the U.S. market in 2002, not only has it been producing and selling cars at a rate far exceeding early estimates, but MINI is now introducing its second body style in the form of the MINI Cooper Convertible and the MINI Cooper S Convertible. These two new models further expand the product range and MINI's presence in the marketplace as an established brand with a growing portfolio of products.

The MINI Cooper Convertible and MINI Cooper S Convertible are authentic four-passenger convertibles, engi-

neered from the ground up to be fun-to-drive cars while offering a high level of safety and practicality. The design of the MINI Convertible does not compromise appearance, functionality and engineering, and remains honest to the MINI concept of gokart-like performance and a truly recognizable "MINI" appearance from every angle.

Cool Convertible Concept

Following Alec Issigonis's concept that he used as his blueprint for the first generation Mini in 1959, the MINI Con-

vertible utilizes its compact exterior dimensions while making optimum use of its surprisingly spacious four-passenger interior. And the stiff body/chassis package, combined with its sport tuned suspension, gives the MINI Convertible superior handling and agility.

The MINI Convertible is packed with sophisticated technology that reinforces MINI's premium positioning within its market segment, most notably the fully automatic roof with a truly unique integrated sliding sunroof function and the expandable easy loading system to maximize accessibility to the rear cargo area. Other technology includes multi-arm rear suspension, run flat tires with a tire monitoring system and an available navigation system. As a global product, the major markets for the MINI Convertible are primarily the United States, England and Germany followed by other Western European and Asian countries.

The MINI Convertible Roof Two Ways to Enjoy Open Motoring

The MINI Convertible comes on the scene with a unique offering in the convertible market a fully automatic convertible roof with a power sunroof integrated into the top.

The sliding sunroof on the MINI Convertible is designed with a rigid panel under the first section of the canvas. When the top button is first pressed, the section slides back along the top rails to create an opening overhead of 15 3/4 inches. The sliding sunroof can be operated while the vehicle is in motion up to speeds of 75 mph, offering open-air motoring while on the go. With the sunroof open, or the top fully low-

ered, the MINI Convertible is "Always Open" to the elements.

In its standard mode, the MINI Convertible's roof goes from closed to open, in just over 15 seconds. The roof operates at the touch of a button and does not require the manual release of any latches.

Powered by an electro-hydraulic system, the top's frame mechanism automatically unlatches and retracts. The four side windows lower automatically as the soft top folds neatly to the rear.

The ingenious and

compact "z-shaped folding mechanism lets the roof fold compactly to store behind the rear seats. Also, there is no need for a tonneau cover when the top is folded because the front section of the roof provides protection when the soft top is down.

The top operation can also be controlled by ingenious features built into the remote locking system. The key-operated remote locking system not only operates the doors, trunk and fuel door, but can open the roof and side windows from a distance up to 49 feet.

The first press of the unlock button on the key fob unlocks the driver door. When the button is pressed and released a second time, the passenger door, fuel filler flap and rear boot lid all unlock. If the button is pressed the second time and held, all four windows lower and the sunroof opens up. Lastly, if the key fob button is released, then pressed and held for the third time, the convertible top will fully retract' all this can be done without opening a door.

The top can also be fully closed from outside the car. By inserting the key into the driver's door lock, turning and then holding it in the locked position, the top will raise and fully latch, all four windows will close simultaneously and the doors and rear boot will automatically lock.

To top it off, the MINI Convertible top comes standard with a heated glass rear window that helps to maintain a clear view even in inclement weather; the top is available in three colors, blue, black and green.

Room to Haul

Another truly unique feature of the MINI Convertible top is the easy load system. This feature allows the car to swallow up cargo through the rear boot in a very ingenious way:

With the top up, the lower rear edge of the top can be unlatched from inside the cargo area. This allows the rear edge to swing up 35 degrees to increase the size of the rear opening, easily allowing large items to pass into the cargo area. Due to the MINI Convertible's very rigid body structure, there is no need for a cross member at the top of the rear boot opening, nor a need for a rear bulkhead behind the rear seats. This allows for 50/50 split rear folding seats that can easily accommodate large or awkward sized items.

With the top in the up position, trunk capacity is 5.8 cubic feet, and even with the top down, the trunk provides 4.2 cubic feet of luggage space. With the rear seats folded down, cargo capacity is increased to a remarkable 21.3 cubic


feet. Maximum load capacity is 771 pounds. While the top is down, the rear seatbacks are lockable in their upright position, so luggage in the trunk is protected from theft.

A rear parcel shelf is provided for safety and security. With the top lowered, the rear parcel shelf acts as a shield for the rear glass window to protect from possible damage by cargo in the rear boot. The top has a safety feature whereby the top will not lower unless the rear parcel shelf is properly installed.

With the top in the up position, the parcel shelf obstructs the view into the rear cargo area so valuables can be securely stowed out of view. The cargo shelf can be easily taken out when maximum cargo space is needed.

Taken from classic Mini design, the Convertible has externally mounted hinges on the rear boot lid that is designed to swing down to open. These signature MINI hinges are further accentuated with the optional exterior chrome trim package. When open, the boot lid is held in position by two supports, creating a practical loading platform capable of carrying up to 175 pounds, making the open boot lid a perfect place to hold a cooler or snacks when tailgating.

An added benefit that the boot lid opens downward is that it offers easier visibility and access to the rear cargo area without the need to bend down or duck under the open lid. The MINI Convertible also comes with a soft-touch electric latch release located in the boot handle. MSR

BMW WilliamsF1 Team: Jerez Test January 10 - 14, 2005

Summary

The BMW WilliamsF1 Team today completed their first test of 2005. In preparation for the forthcoming season, the team ran two interim FW26 chassis over five days at the Jerez circuit in southern Spain. Mark Webber, Antonio Pizzonia and Nick Heidfeld were all on hand to share testing duties at the Spanish circuit.




With extensive revisions to the Championship's regulations for 2005, the team worked through an intensive schedule of set-up work, systems checks, brake and tire testing. Over the week, the drivers collectively accumulated almost 1,000 laps while setting the quickest times on three out of the five days.

Sam Michael (Technical Director, WilliamsF1)

"This week we covered 4,393km over the five days in Jerez, with all three drivers in the two FW26Cs at some stage. It is great to have covered such high mileage on the new rear end of the car.

The main focus of the week was tire testing for Michelin, continuing the work we started with our tire partner before Christmas. We also spent time working on brake and traction control testing, as well as practicing starts for the new regulations."



Mario Theissen (BMW Motorsport Director)

"The team concluded an extensive five day program in Jerez today. Three drivers shared duties and we were able to complete up to 145 laps per car. Obviously the issues we concentrated on were those relating to the new rules. The first element is tires, which will have to last for qualifying and the race in the coming season, so we carried out a lot of work with Michelin. The impact on the new engine regulations is also of major importance. We did an endurance test run, and a race simulation. From the results achieved so far we are satisfied, although the current engine specifications showed some weaknesses. We are now preparing the last development stage of the engine specification in preparation for Melbourne."

BMW Team PTG M3s Mark Important Bmw Anniversaries at Daytona

Defending Rolex GT Champions Begin 10th Season of Competition

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - January 31, 2005... When the two BMW Team PTG M3s begin testing for the weekend's 43rd Rolex 24 at Daytona the team will be marking two very significant milestones in BMW motorsports history. The Rolex 24 at Daytona will begin the tenth season of competition for BMW M3s of BMW Team PTG and 30th anniversary of BMW of North America's motorsport programs.

Beginning with two BMW CSLs in 1975 emblazoned with BAVARIAN MOTOR WORKS across the tops of their windshields, BMW of North America's racing programs have continued to prove the brand in competition for three decades. The BMW Team PTG M3 program has been the longest lived and the most successful racing program for BMW of North America.

BMW Team PTG has won 46 races in both sprint and endurance racing series and 14 sports car racing championships between 1995 and 2004. In 2004, BMW Team PTG swept the Rolex Sports Car Series GT class Manufacturer, Driver and Team Points championships, winning 10 of 12 races.

In 1995, the Rolex 24 at Daytona was the very first race for the new BMW M3 effort and a BMW Team PTG M3 qualified on the GT class pole. The feat was repeated the following year as both Team PTG M3s sat on the front of the GT

class grid with the M3 of David Donohue, Javier Quiros, John Paul Jr. and Peter Halsmer finishing third in class and ninth overall. BMW Team PTG posted back-to-back wins at the 24-hour race in 1997 and 1998. The 1999 season marked the last year a Team PTG M3 competed at the Rolex 24, before returning in 2004, giving the team and the BMW M3 a very credible two wins in six attempts.

BMW has one overall victory at the Rolex 24 at Daytona, winning in 1976 with a 3.5 CSL driven by Peter Gregg, Brian Redman and John Fitzpatrick. In addition to the two class wins by BMW Team PTG, a BMW M1driven by Hans Stuck, Walter Brun and Rudi Walch took the GTO class win in 1981.

This year, the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3 will be driven at Daytona by Bill Auberlen, Joey Hand, Chris Gleason and lan James. 2004 Rolex Sports Car Series GT Driver Champion Auberlen is the most successful BMW Team PTG driver with 24 total victories and he was a co-driver on both the 1997 and 1998 Rolex 24 class winning M3s. Hand, also returning from 2004, finished sixth in Driver Points last season. Gleason and James are successful road racing veterans and are beginning their first season with BMW Team PTG.

Justin Marks, Tom Milner, Kelly Collins and R.J. Valentine will share the No. 22 BMW Team PTG M3 in the Rolex 24. Marks will begin his third season with BMW Team PTG. He finished third in 2004 GT Driver Points, winning four races with Auberlen. Milner, son of BMW Team PTG owner Tom Milner, had three starts with BMW Team PTG in 2004, scoring a

pole at Virginia International Raceway and a second pole and the win (with Collins) at the season's final event at California Speedway. Veteran Kelly Collins drove two races with BMW Team PTG in 2004. RJ Valentine will make his first start in a BMW Team PTG M3 at Daytona.

"The realignment of the rules this season to combine the GT and SGS classes into one GT class means all-new M3s for 2005 and retirement for our 2004 Championship cars," said BMW Team PTG owner Tom Milner. "Building new M3s is certainly not new to PTG. If you think about it, we have been building new M3s continuously since 1995 and I believe our new M3s will prove as capable as those in past years."

"BMW of North America is proud to begin our fourth decade of motorsport at Daytona and our 10th season of competition with the BMW M3 and BMW Team PTG," said Hernando Carvajal, BMW of North America Motorsports Manager. "One of the foundations of BMW and the M Brand is competition and there is no harder test in racing than the Rolex 24 at Daytona."

A special internet link has been arranged on www.ptgracing.com to give media and BMW fans updates on BMW Team PTG during the Rolex 24 at Daytona.

Practice and qualifying for the 43rd Rolex 24 at Daytona begins on Thursday, February 3 and continues on Friday. The race is scheduled to begin at 12:00 PM EST on Saturday with more than 14 hours of the endurance classic televised live on Speed Channel. ***ISR**

The individualized instruction is a key to this program that has been developed over decades, and compares very favorably with commercial schools costing many times more. Our experienced instructors have come from racing, autocrossing and BMW CCA schools and can help you develop your potential. 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM at the Car Control Clinic. **DO NOT PUT THIS OFF!** Be sure to give yourself time in case something is found that must be fixed.

While there will be mostly BMWs at the track, other makes are welcome. If you're considering something other than a coupe or sedan, please call the Driving School Coordinator—sorry, but no convertibles are allowed.

We have reserved a block of rooms at the Fairfield Inn

in Colorado Springs (719-576-1717, exit 138 from I-25, Marriott.com/Fairfieldinn) for \$69/night for a double. The track is about 16 miles south, but there is not much in that area. A simple breakfast is included, and they allow pets (ask when you call). Reservations must be made by **March 29**th, so don't delay. Other hotels can be found in Colorado Springs or Pueblo, if you are coming from the south. Check the RMC web site for information. There are also a lot of listings on the PPIR web site.



AUTOCROSS MINIMUM STANDARDS – Thanks to all of your chapter autocrossers out there who provided feedback, observations and corrections to the preliminary draft of the Autocross Minimum Standards. Rafael Garces, in particular obviously spent a great deal of time and presented the BMW CCA Board with a detailed critique. Your comments and suggestions will be incorporated into the document and a second draft will be sent out for your evaluation.

2005 MOTORSPORTS INSURANCE RATES – have gone up 15%. This is not a reflection on our loss and incident rate, but based on the rise in how many events have been put on between the 2003 and 2004 season. We're not doing anything wrong; we're just way more active than we have been. Cost for certificates **per event** will be as follows 2/1/2005 – 1/31/2006:

ADDITIONAL INSURED STATUS with respect to MOTORS-PORT LIABILITY COVERAGE - There has been some confusion regarding who and what may be added as an additional insured to the certificates issued for events by Wisenberg. Please be sure everyone in your chapter involved with obtaining coverage for events understands that any participant that signs a waiver is covered as an additional insured. However, if the individual has a "business", that business can't be added as an additional insured to our policy. Often chapters are then asked to "indemnify" such a business, but if we ever had a claim, this would not be looked upon favorably by the carrier. Be sure your corner workers, instructor trainers, driving instructors, etc. sign the waivers at each event. Be sure to **READ** contracts carefully and thoroughly so that you are not agreeing to indemnify the business of a paid participant. If you have questions or need help with reviewing contracts submitted to you – please call me or your regional D.E.C. representative.

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


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



-Revision of Showroom Stock Classes:

Showroom Stock I:

(V8, 6cyl, 4cyl sports cars w/aluminum or fiberglass bodies & rotary)

Showroom Stock II:

(4cyl multi-carb or fuel injected over 1850cc, factory turbo)

Showroom Stock III:

(4cyl 1-2bbl, fuel injected under 1850cc)

- -4cyl sedans over 1200cc fuel injected were moved to Street prepared Class E.
- -Grey market cars (Factory available but not available from the US dealer network) run in the appropriate Modified class.
- -Class A Street Prepared cars cannot be bumped to a Modified class unless it can be classified as such by the rules.
- -Street Prepared cars must have bumpers and all seats. Enclosed Modified cars must have a windsheild.
- -Entry fees: SINGLE: \$10.00 Club Member (Alpha, BMW, CSU) , \$12.00 Non-Member. COUPLES: \$18.00 Member, \$22.00 Non-member.

These rule changes have been made in the hopes that it will bring ore equity between classes and enable autocrosser's from other clubs of participate competetively.

Spring Tech Tips

norry, but your car failed the brake bleed section of the inspection. Other than that, you are fine." It happens every year. Brakes must be bled, or flushed, after January 1st for our Spring Performance Driving School, anything earlier is not acceptable. So please, present your car for inspection with the brakes already bled. You can do it yourself; it is not that difficult.

The above applies to instructors too. Instructors who list a 2004 date for a brake bleed will not receive a pass tech inspection sticker when they hand their tech sheet in at registration. They will have to bleed the brakes in the paddock, or forgo their track time.

Brake pads must have 50% or more life left. The thicker the pads, the better their ability to handle the heat generated by hard braking. You will enjoy the driving school a lot more if you have new pads. Install them if you can afford them and don't forget to break them in before the event.

If you have a dedicated set of track tires and wheels, then bring them to the inspection. We want to examine them for any defects. My tech inspectors have very limited time available at the driving school, so you might miss the first session if your car needs attention the morning of the event.

Lastly, a professional shop can do a better job than the volunteer inspectors in the field. Raising the car on a lift allows better inspection of wheel bearings, transmission suspension and the exhaust system. Have a professional inspection if you can afford it; otherwise, our volunteers will be happy to oblige. MSR

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Cleaning the Z-3's Plastic Window (Or Any Plastic Surface)

Cleaners

My Valkyrie motorcycle's windscreen was made of Lexan, a seemingly very hard material that was easily scratched, and using a proper cleaner was very important. As a result I knew to approach cleaning my Z-3's plastic rear window very cautiously.

With some investigation I learned that the rear window on the BMW Z-3 is made of two sheets of a specialized type of clear vinyl generally referred to as "Pressed Polished Sheets." The sheets are forced together under great pressure to remove impurities, and treated with plasticizers and stabilizers to help keep them soft, and to retard degradation caused by UV light. Unless the window is cleaned with a proper product multiple cleanings will result in a window more opaque than clear, and difficult to see through.

Many cleaning products designed for glass contain alcohol and should **NEVER** be used on vinyl. Put away the Windex. Fortunately, similar vinyl windows are used on other vehicles like boats, and golf carts, so manufactures have developed products that when used properly minimize scratches. Listed below are three cleaning products specifically designed for different kinds of plastics, including vinyl:

- 303 Aerospace Cleaner by 303 Products
- Plexus by BTI Chemical Company

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• Meguiar's No. 17 Plastic Cleaner

There are at least two schools of thought regarding how often to use a cleaner. Some feel satisfactory results can be obtained with a good rinse coupled with towel drying, and only limited use of a chemical cleaner. I personally like the smooth "waxy" feel, and shine obtained by using a proper cleaner each time I clean the window. The window seems to stay clean longer. Take your choice.

Cleaning Towels

Only microfiber towels should be used to clean a plastic window. Towels made of non-microfiber cotton terry can scratch plastic windows and it is best to avoid them.

Microfiber is a blend of Polyester and Polyamide fibers (microfiber is a synthetic product without any natural cellulose) and the yarn is 100 times finer then human hair. Microfiber is softer then cotton or silk, and is very strong. Quality microfiber toweling is made of split fibers with a denier of 0.02, and contains approximately 221,000 fibers per square inch. Generally, the best microfiber comes from South Korea. Quality microfiber toweling will not lint because of the way it is manufactured. Listed below are two microfiber towels for use on plastic windows:

- Paradise Green sold by Detailers Paradise
- Paradise Purple Waffle Weave also sold by Detailers Paradise

Microfiber should not be washed with any other material as it will pull fibers from other textiles. It's a good idea to use a detergent that is free of perfumes and colors. Something like "Tide Free" is a reliable choice. Be sure not use fabric softener on your microfiber. It will inhibit the performance of the towel. To keep your microfiber towels fluffy and absorbent, try rinsing them twice and adding a cup of white vinegar to the second rinse. This breaks up any residual wax or detailing chemical left after the wash. It also removes the perfumes and additives often found in washing detergent. (Editors Note: this article modified for the Rocky Mountain Chapter).



Dynamic Growth in Revenues in 2004 Thanks to Product and Market Initiative

BMW Group increases revenues by 6.8% to euro 44,335 million / Earnings forecast confirmed

The BMW Group has continued its successful growth course in the financial year 2004 and achieved new record figures for sales volume and revenues. Despite adverse currency factors, Group revenues in 2004, at euro 44,335 million, were 6.8% higher than in the previous year (2003: euro 41,525 million). Revenues of the Automobile segment rose by 11.0% to euro 42,544 million (2003: euro 38,317 million). The Motorcycles segment recorded revenues of euro 1,029 million (-2.5%; 2003: euro 1,055 million). Revenues of the Financial Services segment rose by 8.5% to euro 8,226 million (2003: euro 7,582 million).

With 1,208,732 BMW, MINI and Rolls-Royce brand cars sold in 2004, the BMW Group beat the sales volume record set in the previous year by 9.4% (2003: 1,104,916 cars).

On the basis of this performance, Helmut Panke, Chairman of the Board of Management of BMW AG, has also confirmed the earnings forecast for 2004: "We have achieved all of the targets which were set for the year. The Group has been able to expand both its product range and its international market presence and acquired new dimensions. In line with this development, we will also achieve new record earnings for 2004."

Capital expenditure still at high level

In 2004, the BMW Group invested euro 3,226 million in property, plant and equipment and intangible assets. In addition, development expenditure of euro 1,121 million has been recognized as assets in accordance with IAS, so that total capital expenditure for 2004 amounted to euro 4,347 million. This represents an increase of 2.4% compared to the previous year (2003: euro 4,245 million).

Production volume increased

As a result of the product initiative, the BMW Group also achieved new record figures in production volume terms. In total, 1,250,345 BMW, MINI and Rolls-Royce brand cars were manufactured, 11.7% more than in the previous year (2003: 1,118,940 cars).

Increase in number of apprentices

The BMW Group had a worldwide workforce of 105,972

employees at 31 December 2004, 1.6% more than at the end of 2003. The number of apprentices also rose again. At present, 4,464 young people are learning a profession with the BMW Group, an increase of 3.7% compared to one year earlier.

Automobiles: All brands achieve new record volumes

In 2004, the Group introduced more new models onto the market than ever before. The BMW X3, the BMW 6 Series Coupé and Convertible models and the BMW 5 Series Touring were all launched in the first half of the year. The product range was broadened again in the second half of 2004 with the introduction of the BMW 1 Series and the MINI Convertible.

For the first time in its history, the BMW brand surpassed the one million mark with sales of 1,023,583 cars (+10.3%/2003:928,151 units). The BMW 1 Series, available since September, recorded 39,247 unit sales. The fourth generation of the BMW 3 Series has been the most successful series in the BMW Group's history: since its launch in 1998 more than three million new cars had been sold by the end of 2004. 449,732 BMW 3 Series cars were sold worldwide in 2004 (2003: 528,358 units), the 14.9% reduction being due to model life-cycle factors.


In 2004, more BMW 5 Series were delivered to customers than ever before: the sales volume reached 229,598 units, 23.8% more than in the previous year (2003: 185,481 units).

The strong demand for the new BMW 6 Series Coupé and Convertible models, which were launched in January and March respectively, has been extremely encouraging. By the year-end, 12,332 of the 6 Series Coupé and 8,708 of the 6 Series Convertible had been sold.

In its fourth year of production, the worldwide sales volume of the 7 Series was 47,689 units (-17.6% / 2003: 57,899 units). The BMW 7 Series has moved into first place in the top class in Germany and, with 7,671 vehicle registrations, it is the market leader in the segment for large limousines.

Demand for the BMW X5 continued at a high level. In the fifth full year of production, sales of this Sports Activ-

ity Vehicle totaled 104,988 units (-0.5% / 2003: 105,554 units). Since its market launch in 1999, more than 433,000 units of the BMW X5 have been sold. The BMW X3 was introduced onto the market in January 2004 and by the end of the year, 92,248 units had been delivered to customers. With the roadster segment contracting overall, a total of 38,483 BMW Z4 were delivered, 18.2% less than in the previous year (2003: 47,049 units).

Only three years after its market launch, the 500,000th MINI rolled off the production line in Oxford in August 2004. Altogether, sales of MINI brand cars rose to 184,357 units in 2004, an increase of 4.5% compared to the previous year (2003: 176,465 units). Sales of the entry model MINI One went up by 6.8% to 47,641 units (2003: 44,623 units), bolstered by the sales volume of the diesel version, MINI One D, with 16,726 units sold (2003: 9,316 units). The MINI Cooper remains the most popular model, with 77,532 units sold (-11.3% / 2003: 87,378 units). The top model, the MINI Cooper S achieved a sales volume of 40,443 units (-9.0% / 2003: 44,461 units). The MINI Convertible was launched in July 2004 and, by the year-end, a total of 18,741 units had been sold.

Financial Services: growth course continued

The BMW Group expanded its activities in the Financial Services business and was able to continue its growth course in 2004. The volume of new customer financing contracts rose by 19.1% to euro 20,749 million, and hence a new record level (2003: euro 17,423 million). The proportion of new BMW and MINI cars financed by the Financial Services business in 2004 rose to 42.0% (2003: 38.3%).

Prospects 2005

In the past few years, the BMW Group has significantly expanded the range of products it offers in all of the relevant premium segments. The various new products launched in 2004 will be available in full throughout 2005. In addition, from spring onwards, the dynamic four-wheel xDrive system will be available for the first time in a BMW sedan, namely in the BMW 525xi and 530xi. The launch of the new BMW 3 Series Sedan in March will mark the start of the renewal of the core series. At the same time, series production will commence at the new BMW Leipzig plant.

The BMW Group therefore predicts a sales volume increase for all three brands and thus a new record sales volume level in 2005. MSR



BMW of North America Celebrates 30 Years of Motorsport in 2005

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - January 31, 2005... This year BMW of North America, LLC will celebrate the 30th anniversary of its North American motorsports programs and the year-long celebration will begin at the 43rd Rolex 24 at Daytona.

At Daytona, in 1975, two BMW CSLs with "BAVARIAN MOTOR WORKS" emblazoned on the top of the windshields started BMW of North America racing programs toward three decades of victories in both GT and Prototype categories. Although BMW's first race in the U.S. would end some nine-and-one-half hours later, both CSLs would retire while leading, sending notice that BMW would be a force to be reckoned with.

One month later, at the 12 Hours of Sebring, Hans Stuck, Brian Redman, Sam Posey and Allan Moffat would steer a CSL to its first major road racing victory in North America.

In 1976, a CSL, now with "BMW OF NORTH AMERICA" on the top of the windshield, driven by Peter Gregg, Brian Redman and John Fitzpatrick would deliver a win at the 24 Hours of Daytona.

The CSL program would give way to the 320 Turbos of the late 1970s. David Hobbs drove his McLaren-prepared "Flying Brick" to eight Camel GT victories between 1977 and 1979.

In 1985 BMW of North America stepped boldly into the IMSA Prototype category with two BMW GTPs powered by a 2.0-liter, turbocharged, four-cylinder version of the engine that propelled Nelson Piquet's BMW-powered Brabham BT-52 to the Formula One world championship in 1983. A young John Andretti and Davy Jones gave the two-year program its only win at Watkins Glen. David Hobbs and John Watson also drove for the program.

Since 1995, BMW of North America has focused its motorsport efforts with one team, Prototype Technology Group, and one model, the BMW M3. The BMW Team PTG M3s, in both endurance and sprint racing, have delivered 46 wins and, more importantly, 14 championships to BMW of North America. Most recently, in 2004, BMW Team PTG swept the Rolex Sports Car Series GT class Manufacturer, Driver and Team titles, winning 10 of 12 races.

At the Rolex 24 at Daytona, BMW Team PTG won the GTS-3 class in 1997 and the GT3 class in 1998, winning the 12 Hours of Sebring in both those years as well.

Four major racing programs, and contingency support for the many private teams that race BMWs, have provided BMW with wins at most every road racing circuit in North America. As the fourth decade of competition for BMW of North America begins, BMW is stronger than ever - proven in competition.


