


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

hat obligations do we have to our children when it comes to teaching them automotive responsibility? Traditional high-school driver's education courses give them only the rudiments, such as how to parallel park, stop at the crosswalk line, and avoid puking during the obligatory gory driver's ed, "This Could Happen to You" movies. You

have to start somewhere, and these classes are adequate preparation for passing the driver's license exam—the main requirement for which is that the applicant is able to fog a

Meanwhile, the Colorado state legislature is debating new rules to prohibit young drivers from engaging in certain types of unsafe behavior, such as having more than one passenger in a vehicle being driven by a first-year licensee. While such laws in and of themselves may do some good, I firmly believe that BMW owners generally take a more proactive role. We buy these cars in the first place due in part to BMW's "active safety" emphasis: it's better to avoid an accident than try to survive one (although BMW is at the forefront in passive safety as well). Chassis, suspension, and braking system engineering have always been BMW's forte, making the cars both safe and fun to drive. Who says you can't have your cake and eat it, too? Our kids naturally gravitate towards the

fun part; providing the education to use the car's capabilities responsibly is up to us.

There is no greater automotive legacy we can bestow upon the youthful drivers in our lives than the gift of an enduring, meaningful driver's education. On June 25th, our chapter will host its second annual Street Survival training course, aimed at teaching youthful drivers critical skills they can use for a lifetime (literally and figuratively) of on-the-road driving. We are indebted to Alain van der Heide for picking up the gauntlet and spearheading the effort this year, following on Bob and Lauri Sutterfield's heels last year (who are also kindly providing guidance and advice to Alain and company). ur April **Car of the Month** comes to you from Denver, Colorado belonging to Keith L., who writes:

Cars are for driving! As an owner of fine crafted German automobiles for over 20 years, the driving experience still feels fresh. Driving is what it's all about – miles and miles of gear shifting, red-lining, sideways sliding, and even the occasional off-roading! My current ride is a 1999 528i 5-speed with a sport package and sport seats. It's finally broken in with 112K miles! The off-road adventures are severely curtailed on this car due to the low ride height of the sport suspension. Not that I haven't tried, but that's a story for another day... (I can tell you that some of the plastic parts under the front of the car have been replaced and SUV drivers have looked at me in disbelief!) The car is so low that I can't even remove the oil drain plug without jacking the car!

To keep things fresh, I've replaced the head and tail lights with the latest offerings from Hella – angle eyes in front and Celis LED's bringing up the rear. The clear "European" style indicator lenses have made the color and the lines of the car flow. Deep dish Roundel's replaced the original sport wheels and are similar to the sport wheels on the 530i without the imitation rivets. The original BBS wheels are now snow rims for another club member's 530i.

The other cosmetic changes have been to change the

hood, trunk, and steering wheel Roundels. A few BMW "purists" looked at the change incredulously. For most people, especially those behind me in traffic, the change makes them smile. What's the change? Smiley faces have replaced the Roundels making my BMW a Be Merry Wagon!

Since we all read, or at least look at the pictures in the *Roundel*, you've probably noticed the German license plates. My car also has German plates so a little primer is in order. (This is more fun than telling you how great BMW's are since we know already!) I had the great fortune of living near Trier in the Mosel region of Germany some years ago, and visit the homeland every few years since. Which brings me to my plates: TR Ku55. The first two letters indicate the city. One letter is for large cities: M – Munich, F – Frankfort, etc; two letters is for medium size cities: TR – Trier (over 2000 years old!), DA – Darmstadt, etc; and three letters is for small cities: BIT – Bitburg (great bier, bitte ein bit!), COC – Cochem, etc.

After the city designation are the inspection (yellow) and registration (black) stickers. Next are numbers and/or letters. To the best of my knowledge, these are random although Ku55 was deliberate. Without being too obvious and take away from the authentic look, Ku55 is short for Kusse - which is kiss in English.

This car is used for daily commuting, autocrossing, mountain bike off-road transporting, and weekend ski trips. It is neither the fastest nor the sexiest of the BMW lineup, but it is the most versatile and dependable all-around car for my purposes. Be sure to smile and say "hi" at the next event! MSR

BMW Team PTG M3s Four-Strong at Grand Prix of Miami

Two F1 Air-sponsored M3s to Debut

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - February 28, 2005... Round two of the 2005 Rolex Sports Car Series season will see the defending GT champion's debut two new BMW M3s. Drivers RJ Valentine and Kelly Collins will share the No. 17 F1 Air M3, and Justin Marks and Tom Milner will co-drive the No. 16 F1 Air M3.

"By doubling our efforts this season, BMW Team PTG is more than doubling our chances for year-end success," said Tom Milner, BMW Team PTG owner. "Manufacturer points are only awarded to the highest-finishing car. Last season, after poor Daytona finishes, six wins were needed to take the class lead. BMW does not have the sheer number of cars that Porsche has, for example, but, four M3s finishing in the top-five can more than make up for that."

In 2004, BMW Team PTG began a seven-race winning streak at the Grand Prix of Miami with a 1-2 BMW M3 finish. Crossing the finish line side-by-side, the No. 21 M3 of Bill Auberlen and Boris Said won the race from the pole. Joey Hand and Justin Marks finished second in the No. 22 M3.

After co-driving the No. 21 M3 at Daytona together, defending GT Driver Champion Bill Auberlen and Joey Hand will share the No. 21 M3 and Chris Gleason and Ian James will now co-drive the No. 22 M3.

In February's Rolex 24 at Daytona, right rear wheel stud failures forced the withdrawal of both M3s in the eighth hour.





The cars were back at PTG's Winchester, Virginia shop almost before the race's end the next day and work was started to identify and repair the problem.

Milner continues, "We had run a five-lug wheel fixing on our 2003 Speed World Challenge M3s and never experienced a problem. We did not think this season's rule change requiring the move from center lock wheels would cause an issue. Unfortunately, there was no way to identify the wheel studs as a problem until they failed. It has been a very busy three weeks since Daytona. The start of a BMW Team PTG M3 is a BMW-supplied bare chassis and roll-cage, not a large check for a turn-key racing car. Of course, that gives us great control of the finished product, but the hours required to finish the new M3s plus repairing and readying the No. 21 and 22 cars required a 110% effort from every member of our staff. We began the run for the championship last season at Miami and we will have to do the same thing this year."

Practice for the Grand Prix of Miami begins on Thursday, March 3 and continues on Friday with qualifying scheduled for 4:15 p.m. The 250-mile race is scheduled to begin at 3:00 PM EST on Saturday and will televised live on Speed Channel.

Background:

2005 marks the tenth season of competition for BMW M3s of BMW Team PTG and 30th anniversary of BMW of North America's motorsport programs. In nine seasons of competition, BMW Team PTG has won a total of 46 races in both sprint and endurance racing series and 14 sports car racing championships. In 2004, BMW Team PTG swept the Rolex Sports Car Series GT class Manufacturer, Driver and Team Points championships, winning 10 of 12 races. MSR

Australian Grand Prix, March 4 - 6, 2005, Preview

With a new and revitalized driver line-up, Mark Webber and Nick Heidfeld will launch the BMW WilliamsF1 Team's 2005 Formula One campaign in Melbourne on Sunday March, 6, the first of a 19 race championship which will conclude in eight months time in China. For Mark in particular, his BMW WilliamsF1 debut will be especially poignant at his home race, where in 2002 in his debut Formula One race he delighted the home crowd by claiming a stunning fifth place, and grabbing the attention of the Formula One paddock.

Since launching the FW27 chassis and the BMW P84/5 engine, the BMW WilliamsF1 Team has completed 25,370 test kilometers on three different tracks, generating an impressive pre-season reliability record. Michelin too have moved forward significantly with a one-race, harder compound tire achieving long run lap times roughly comparable with the best times achieved by shorter life tires last season.


Mark Webber:

Clearly Melbourne is a very special race for me as I'll be competing in front of my home country. It's always a great experience and the party atmosphere around Albert Park is amazing. I hope we can give the crowd something to cheer about by getting the new season off to a good start. I feel I always drive pretty well at Melbourne, it's a track I quite enjoy, but it's always a tough race in terms of reliability, I've had two non-finishes in the last two years but finished fifth in my first race there. I would love to improve upon that result this year.

Being a street circuit, Melbourne provides a good challenge for the drivers. There'll be a lot of other categories racing over the course of the weekend which means the track will be relatively clean for the Formula One cars which is always good news. Australia will be the first race under the new regulations and everyone is going to learn a lot from having to look after the same set of tires for both qualifying sessions and the race, that's going to be very demanding for the drivers and the teams. I'm expecting it to be a very close fight at the front and it would be great if we could come away from the first race with some points in the bag which we could take onto Malaysia and the rest of the season.

Nick Heidfeld:

I've just finished a very busy period of testing and I'm really looking forward to the first race. I have reached one



of my targets by joining a top team, now I want to work on my track performance. The track in Melbourne is nice and demanding for the drivers. At the start of the weekend it will offer only a small amount of grip but, as the weekend progresses, this will change significantly. We proved reliable during winter testing, and this could be a decisive factor in Australia. The balance on the FW27 is generally better than that on the FW26, and for Melbourne we will be getting some new aero parts in order to improve its down force. Australia is my favorite holiday destination, so it is great that we are flying out a couple of days in advance to acclimatize.

Sam Michael (Technical Director, WilliamsF1):

Melbourne is one of the most exciting races for everyone because we all want to know where everyone stands with their new cars. This year will be particularly interesting due to the rule changes. Albert Park is a street circuit, which implies low grip, while the layout is a combination of slow and medium speed corners but with two high speed sections. As with most circuits now, Melbourne requires maximum down force settings, particularly with the rule changes over the winter that reduced front and rear down force levels. The car's set-up leans towards giving good traction out of slow speed, something that is more difficult to achieve with the new cars. The number of braking events from speed means this circuit is hard on brakes.

This year will see a change in race strategies due to the two qualifying sessions where half of the grid position is taken from a low fuel session and the other half from a race fuel session. This means the effect on lap times of adding race fuel is halved and therefore teams will tend to run longer stints during the race.

We have been working hard over the winter on long endurance runs with the tires to ensure we have enough data to make the correct compound choice. The new rules mean that one set of tires must last for both the qualifying sessions and the race. This means the target has shifted towards a stronger race tire, rather than a qualifying tire. We have put a lot of effort into preparing our two new race drivers, Mark Webber and Nick Heidfeld, for the race starts which has involved a lot of practice and analysis of data during testing.

With all the rule changes, there is sure to be a large change in aerodynamic and engine performance among the teams during the first four or five races as everyone will be on a steep learning curve. After that, it will come down to the

normal test of which team can develop the hardest and fastest during the season.

Mario Theissen (BMW Motorsport Director):

Following the end of winter testing, the anticipation for the start of the season is increasing day by day. Everyone in the team wants to know where we stand and can't wait for the race in Melbourne. The past few months were really a race for the engineers who had to react to the extensive rule changes in a very short period of time. For BMW, the goal was to achieve an engine that would last two race weekends. This is four times the duration which we had to achieve in 2003, and therefore a huge challenge for the engineers. We also have to complete qualifying and the race with just one set of tires. Reliability will therefore be a deciding factor for success in Melbourne, and probably for much of the first half of the season.

The two qualifying sessions comprise single, timed laps. The driver with the fastest time in the first qualifying session is the last to go out on the track in second qualifying. The lap times of the two qualifying sessions are added together to determine the grid order. Parc fermé rules apply after both qualifying sessions have finished. The same set of tires must be used for the two qualifying sessions and the race itself.

History and Background:

This year's race will be the 10th time that the Australian Grand Prix has been held on the Albert Park circuit. Before moving to Albert Park, the Grand Prix was held in Adelaide where WilliamsF1 claimed four victories.

WilliamsF1 last claimed victory in Melbourne in 1996 with Damon Hill.

In 2000, Ralf Schumacher took third place on the Anglo-

German partnership's debut race, the most successful entry by an engine manufacturer since 1967.

Melbourne is located on the south eastern seaboard of Australia and is the capital of the state of Victoria. It is Australia's second biggest city and has a population of 3.2 million.

A Formula One parade will be held in the city centre from 12.30 to 13.30 on the Wednesday before the Grand Prix to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Melbourne race. Fans will have free entry to the race track on Thursday 3 March.

A celebrity charity race will be held over the Australian Grand Prix weekend with cars from the BMW 1 Series. The proceeds will be donated to help the victims of the tsunami.

Actress Bo Derek will wave the checkered flag at this year's Australian Grand Prix.

Actually, the IRL and NASCAR only do the main "D" oval, while we will use the road course configuration to provide the optimal learning experience for our school. Check out www.PPIR.com for all the info on this place. PPIR is located on I-25, about 15 miles south of Colorado Springs.

Our purpose is to give you the opportunity to drive your car at speed and to experience more of the potential of the unique combination of car and driver. Our High Performance Driving Schools are real schools for anyone 18 or over (with a valid driver's license). You will alternate between classroom sessions and time on the track with your instructor.

The individualized instruction is a key to this program that has been developed over decades, and compares very favorably with commercial schools costing many times more. Our experienced instructors have come from racing, autocrossing and BMW CCA schools and can help you develop your potential. Safety, learning and fun are our priorities—and that is the order, safety first—but you will have fun.

A Car Control Clinic will be held on **April 9th** at Arapahoe Park. If this is your first driving school, you must attend this, and the cost is <u>included</u> with your driving school registration. This provides braking, slalom and skid-pad exercises that are excellent preparation for the school. It also provides good training even if you can only attend the Car Control Clinic. If you've been to one or ten driving schools, it is still a great warm-up, and particularly informative if the car is new to you.

A technical inspection is required of all cars, and must be completed **prior** to the school. This will verify the safe condition of your vehicle, especially the parts that will be critical for an event like this. Tech inspection forms can be downloaded from the Chapter web site. All safety equipment will be checked: tires, brakes, brake fluid, battery hold-downs, seat belts and more. If there is any doubt about the condition of your equipment, have it replaced (new tires are not required or necessarily recommended—this track is very easy on tires). The inspection can be completed by your mechanic (expect a

charge) or there will be a **FREE** technical inspection courtesy of *Bimmer Haus Performance* on **Saturday**, **April 9**th, from **8:30 AM to 1:30 PM** at the Car Control Clinic. **DO NOT PUT THIS OFF!** Be sure to give yourself time in case something is found that must be fixed.

While there will be mostly BMWs at the track, other makes are welcome. If you're considering something other than a coupe or sedan, please call the Driving School Coordinator—sorry, but no convertibles are allowed.

We have reserved a block of rooms at the Fairfield Inn in Colorado Springs (719-576-1717, exit 138 from I-25, Marriott.com/Fairfieldinn) for \$69/night for a double. The track is about 16 miles south, but there is not much in that area. A simple breakfast is included, and they allow pets (ask when you call). Reservations must be made by **March 29**th, so don't delay. Other hotels can be found in Colorado Springs or Pueblo, if you are coming from the south. Check the RMC web site for information.

There are also a lot of listings on the PPIR web site.



Spring Tech Tips

orry, but your car failed the brake bleed section of the inspection. Other than that, you are fine." It happens every year. Brakes must be bled, or flushed, after January 1st for our Spring Performance Driving School, anything earlier is not acceptable. So please, present your car for inspection with the brakes already bled. You can do it yourself; it is not that difficult.

The above applies to instructors too. Instructors who list a 2004 date for a brake bleed will not receive a pass tech inspection sticker when they hand their tech sheet in at registration. They will have to bleed the brakes in the paddock, or forgo their track time.

Brake pads must have 50% or more life left. The thicker the pads, the better their ability to handle the heat generated by hard braking. You will enjoy the driving school a lot more if you have new pads. Install them if you can afford them and don't forget to break them in before the event.

If you have a dedicated set of track tires and wheels, then bring them to the inspection. We want to examine them for any defects. My tech inspectors have very limited time available at the driving school, so you might miss the first session if your car needs attention the morning of the event.

Lastly, a professional shop can do a better job than the volunteer inspectors in the field. Raising the car on a lift allows better inspection of wheel bearings, transmission suspension and the exhaust system. Have a professional inspection if you can afford it; otherwise, our volunteers will be happy to oblige. MSR



Traditional Driver's Ed teaches traffic signs and sometimes signaling for a lane change. Usually, it's a little weak on the physics of driving. Unfortunately, the first time a new driver hits that patch of black ice or has to swerve to avoid the daydreamer who just blew through a stop sign, that physics thing is going to rear its ugly head. How will our new driver handle it? Adult members of the Rocky Mountain Chapter have the opportunity to participate in our excellent Performance Driving Schools, but how will our under-18 kids learn the driving skills they need?

The BMW CCA Foundation has created a one-day school to teach teens how to handle their cars safely. It's called *Street Survival*, to reflect its purpose: keeping our kids alive in their everyday driving on the streets and highways. It takes students from any starting point, to knowing how to handle their cars in any situation they can encounter. Teens use the same cars they drive every day, so the skills are applicable immediately. It could save them on the trip home after the event.

Last year, the Rocky Mountain Chapter held their first *Street Survival* school at Bandimere Raceway, which was a huge success. If your child missed it, or wasn't quite old enough, you're in luck. We've scheduled the *Street Survival* course for early summer: It will be held on **Saturday, June 25, 2005** at Mt. Elbert lot at DIA (all you autocrossers already know where it is). Bimmer Bearings

Fatal Accident Caused by National Stereo Shop's Auto Alarm Installation!

True story....? Not quite, but real close. The following is the real story, as unbelievable as it may seem!

n late October I received a very frantic call via my after hours voicemail from a very good client of mine. It went something like this......Trent.... This is Lewis and my vehicle is in route to your shop.....I think my steering column or steering linkage must have broke. I was on a date and on my way to the restaurant and as I turned a corner I lost control of my car. When you turn the steering wheel it does not turn the car. In fact it freely spins......

I was out of town when I received this call and really didn't know what to think. Quite often I get calls from my clients that are not very capable when it comes to describing problems they are having with there vehicle. I suppose that is mostly because they have no idea what makes there car run, drive, steer, stop, start, go etc. Therein lies my whole existence as a shop and tech advisor.

As soon as I returned to Ft. Worth I stopped by the shop to see what vehicles had shown up while I was gone and to move those outside, inside for the night. I immediately noticed Lewis's car and after retrieving the keys from the night drop I preceded to unlock and move inside. When I inserted the key and grabbed the wheel to see just what Lewis had been trying to explain, I was floored. You could literally spin the wheel with one finger like a roulette wheel. Just when you think you have seen it all......

Now I know why the tone in his voice was so frantic. Being that it was Sunday night and there was nothing that could be done tonight. I locked the 1999 Z3 with absolutely no steering and decided it could wait till morning.

Monday morning came and both of my senior tech's showed up and inspected the vehicle. Both were at a loss for what could have caused what we discovered to be a completely severed steering column under the hood. Neither had ever seen anything like this in all of there years in this industry. After we finagled the Z3 inside I did some sleuthing and what I found is nothing short of hair raising.

I have said for years that when you take your car to aftermarket Stereo shops you are taking your life into your

own hands. Little did I know that those words, said humorously push my point, were actually true. What I found under the hood of this Z3 is what incompetence, immaturity and lack of caring and responsibility all look like. You see what I found was that the Teenage Stereo/ Alarm System Expert Installer On Duty (TSASEIOD) had incompetently installed my clients aftermarket alarm system 2 years earlier.

The TSASEIOD had installed the alarm system horn/siren on top of the frame rail just below the steering column. Which may have not been an issue except that it was installed with only one mounting screw. The mounting



flange on the horn needed two screws, one on either side of the hinged horn. With just the one installed the horn soon after vibrated loose allowing the horn to pivot on its mounting point. Over the next year or so vibrated from its place of origin right on over to rub on the steering column. And just like a very dull very slow lathe, it cut a nice even groove into the steering column because of the consistent rubbing. That groove eventually cut right through the very thin corrugated tube separating the steering wheel from the linkage all together.

The end result of this could have been catastrophic except that the driver of the car was traveling at a low rate of speed preparing to make a corner when the steering column gave up. But imagine this scenario at 75mph on a busy interstate.

There was no doubt what caused this norrific mechanical failure and when this was brought to the National Stereo retailer's attention, the manager at the location that did the installation wanted to see the vehicle. Upon seeing the vehicle, the receipt and the damage from the installation, he agreed that it was their error and planned to take care of the cost caused by their mistake. Unfortunately the National office is now involved and it will probably take a lawsuit by the client to get reimbursed for the damage caused. Fortunately, it was only mechanical damage and not human damage.

I am constantly amazed by the incompetence in the aftermarket Stereo and alarm installation industry (if you can call it an industry) and wonder just if there have ever been any fatalities caused by poor installation of these two items. I am convinced that if this car had been in a major accident caused by the steering column failure that no one would have ever been the wiser to this incompetence. So remember that the 17 or 18 year old TSASEIOD that installs your new Stereo or alarm system you just purchased may end up being the death of you and your family. Steer clear of the car audio and electronics department at Electronic City this year.



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




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The New BMW 3 Series Saloon: Unique Dynamics, Product Substance and All-Round Efficiency

he new BMW 3 Series is making its world debut at this year's Geneva Motor Show. Marking the fifth generation of this unique model series, the new car is once again moving up the benchmark significantly.

Acknowledged for 30 years as the best car in its class, the 3 Series comes with a wide range of innovative, tangible progress on the engine and suspension, and in terms of motoring comfort.

Making its world debut with four new engines

Entering the market, the new BMW 3 Series is setting out from the start with three petrol engines and one diesel power unit. All four of these engines offer a significant increase in power and performance, motoring refinement, and all-round economy. Indeed, each of these new power units is a highlight for itself in its own right.

Six-cylinder with crankcase made of extra-light magnesium

Developing 190 kW/258 hp, the straight-six in the top-of-the-range BMW 330i outperforms its predecessors by 20 kW or 27 hp. Maximum torque of 300 Nm or 221 lb-ft is maintained consistently between 2,500 and 4,000 rpm, making this the most powerful and lightest six-cylinder in its segment.

To reduce weight to a minimum, BMW is for the first time using magnesium in large-volume production that is a material 30 per cent lighter than aluminium. This very special and efficient material is used specifically on the crankcase and the crankshaft bearings as well as on the cylinder head cover.

A further new feature in the six-cylinder is VALVETRONIC engine management masterminding the engine opening period and intake valve lift infinitely as a function of the gas pedal position. This allows even more efficient use of the fuel supply and makes the engine even more responsive. These qualities are further enhanced by double-VANOS variable camshaft management on both the intake and the outlet valves.

The BMW 330i accelerates from 0–100 km/h in 6.3 seconds. Top speed is limited electronically to 250 km/h or 155 mph, fuel consumption in the EU tests cycle is 8.7 litres/100 km or 32.5 mpg lmp. Last but of course not least, the BMW 325i is also making its debut in spring 2005. The most important facts and figures are 160 kW/218 hp maximum output at 6,500 rpm, 250 Nm/185 lb-ft peak torque between 2,750 and 4,250 rpm, and engine displacement of 2.5 litres.

BMW 320i with an even more powerful fourcylinder

The BMW 320i is the most powerful four-cylinder in the range based on the two-litre straight-four previously homologated as the BMW 318i.

Also featuring VALVETRONIC as well as BMW's variable double-VANOS camshaft management, this engine develops maximum output of 110 kW/150 hp at 6,200 rpm, with maximum torque of 200 Nm/147 lb-ft at 3,600 rpm.

Acceleration to 100 km/h comes, as a result, in 9.0 seconds, with maximum speed of 220 km/h or 136 mph. Fuel consumption in the EU test cycle, finally, is 7.4 litres/100 km or 38.2 mpg lmp.

This improvement of the most important facts and figures over the previous engine already acknowledged as very dynamic lies in the detailed optimisation of the engine's intake and exhaust systems.

The range of petrol engines in the BMW 3 Series will naturally be expanded step-by-step in the course of time, a "basic" four-cylinder rounding off the line-up as of autumn 2005.

The BMW 320d continuing the successful story of the BMW Sports Diesel

The diesel engine is transformed into pure dynamics in the BMW 320d: Featuring second-generation common rail technology as well as an exhaust gas turbocharger with variable turbine geometry, the four cylinders of this outstanding engine develop a very substantial 120 kW/163 hp plus outstanding torque of 340 Nm/251 lb-ft at 2,000 rpm. Drive comfort and dynamic performance, as a result, are both best in segment.

The car's acceleration is equally impressive, sprinting from 0–100 km/h in 8.3 seconds. Top speed is 225 km/h or 140 mph, fuel consumption 5.7 litres/100 km or 49.6 mpg Imp. And at the same time the BMW 320d naturally complies in full with the EU4 emission standard.

Six-speed gearbox on all models

All models come as standard with BMW's six-speed manual gearbox or, as an option, with six-speed automatic transmission. Thanks to the additional gear, its closer increments, as well as the larger range of gear ratios between the smallest and highest gear, the driver is able to shift smoothly from one gear to another, without the slightest "gap" between gears. This is particularly advantageous when setting off, with the first gear being laid out for even more power and pulling force. As a result, the new BMW 3 Series is even more dynamic than its predecessor, accelerating faster and reaching an even higher top speed. And to round off all these benefits, fuel consumption has been reduced accordingly.

Starting the engine at the touch of a button

A new feature in the midrange segment: Benefiting from the comfort starter, the driver only has to briefly press the starter button in order to start the engine. All other functions in starting and warming up the engine are handled automatically.

Top-end technology for an even higher standard of driving dynamics

Following a great BMW tradition, the new 3 Series again comes with all the characteristic features of the brand that is the engine fitted lengthwise, engine power going to the rear wheels, and a superb axle load distribution of 50:50 making a significant contribution to the high standard of agility offered by the new BMW 3 Series.





The double-joint front axle newly developed for the BMW 3 Series and made entirely of aluminium ensures an optimum balance of driving dynamics and motoring comfort. Directional and tracking stability are superb, roll noise is reduced to a minimum. And despite its low weight, the aluminium front axle is very stiff and sturdy.

The five-arm rear axle in lightweight steel design ensures supreme agility and sports handling at all times, guaranteeing precise wheel guidance and very good roll comfort.

Active Steering: Absolutely unique in this segment

For the first time in the midrange segment, the customer now has the choice of optional BMW Active Steering in the six-cylinder models of the new BMW 3 Series: Active Steering maintains a more direct transmission ratio at low speeds and provides a more indirect transmission at high speeds, thus ideally solving the conflict of interests between agility, stability, and comfort arising time and again with a conventional steering system.

Now being introduced in the new BMW 3 Series, Active Steering has indeed been enhanced by an important additional feature: When applying the brakes on surfaces with different frictional coefficients such as patches of ice, snow and asphalt, the driver benefits from Active Steering intervening actively in the steering system to stabilise the car more quickly and more precisely than a normal driver ever could.

Latest-generation DSC

The latest generation of DSC Dynamic Stability Control also serves to ensure a supreme standard of all-round safety. On the six-cylinder models DSC comes additionally with very useful functions such as dry braking of the brake discs on wet roads or brake standby by pre-aligning the brake pads.

Two phenomena now also avoided are the car rolling back when setting out on an uphill gradient and brake dive shortly before the car comes to a standstill. As a result of all these improvements, BMW's Sports Saloon further enhances its



leadership in terms of driving dynamics, already one of the car's strongest points.

ACC Active Cruise Control: The joy of being driven

ACC Active Cruise Control is far more than just a conventional speed control system, since it actively monitors traffic conditions around the driver and his car.

Incorporating a radar distance sensor, ACC Active Cruise Control determines the distance from the car ahead and adjusts both road speed and the distance from the leading vehicle in specific, pre-determined steps. This makes the ACC function virtually ideal for cruising along in a steady flow of traffic with only moderate traffic density. The system maintains the desired speed regardless of external factors and conditions and without the driver having to intervene.

If necessary, ACC will even reduce the speed of the car automatically to maintain the distance required.

All the driver has to do in this case is specify the current speed by pressing the appropriate control knob, the system then saving the current speed level and maintaining this speed until the driver intervenes himself either by giving gas or applying the brakes.

Unique design giving the 3 Series the profile of a dynamicand elegant Sports Saloon

In its design language, the 3 Series clearly stands out as a unique, self-confident, dynamic and elegant Sports Saloon. Coming right in the middle of BMW's modern design range, the new 3 Series harmonises the design cues of the BMW Z4 or, as another example, the BMW 1 Series with all the elegance of the BMW 5 and 7 Series. Particularly characteristic features are the short overhangs, the passenger cabin moved far to the rear, as well as the long engine compartment lid. With the car's dimensions increased considerably both outside and inside, the interior is light, spacious and generous, clearly reflecting the lifestyle of the car's target group.

In facts and figures: Overall length is 4,520 millimetres/178.0" (+ 49 mm/1.93" over the former model), width measures 1817 millimetres/71.5" (+ 78 mm/3.07"), and height is 1,421 millimetres / 55.9" (+ 6 mm/0.24"). Wheelbase, finally, is a significant 760 millimetres/108.7" (+ 35 mm/1.38").

Body progress: lighter, stiffer, safer

Even stiffer and at the same time lighter in terms of its specific weight, the body of the new 3 Series makes a significant contribution to the car's perfect concept harmony. Apart from the optimised belt systems, the passenger safety system comes as standard with no less than six air-





bags: the driver, front passenger, hip, thorax, and curtain head airbags.

Proven technology for extra safety

Apart from the regular halogen dual headlights featured as standard, the customer also has the choice of bi-xenon headlights with or without adaptive control as an option. BMW's bi-xenon headlights with adaptive control in bends ensure optimum illumination of the road ahead, with ongoing, continuous and dynamic adjustment of the headlight units themselves. This significantly improves the driver's visibility particularly in bends, where the headlights dynamically following the course of the road light the way for the driver as if by magic.

The two-stage adaptive Brake Force Display featured as standard enlarges the brake light area whenever the driver applies the brakes hard or when ABS brake control cuts in. Motorists following from behind will interpret this intuitively as an emergency braking manoeuvre, applying the brakes harder themselves and thus gaining important stopping distance.

As a further feature the new BMW 3 Series comes as standard with run flat tyres allowing the driver to continue in the event of tyre damage for a distance of up to 250 kilometres or nearly 160 miles at a speed of up to 80 km/h or 50 mph.

Clever solutions inside the car: premium-class spaciousness and extra room

The interior is both modern and harmonious in its style, the generous ambience creating a unique feeling of controlled dynamics and lightness. The driver and passenger feel these two characters resting harmoniously within the 3 Series, the aura of the comfortable midrange saloon and the power of the sporting driving machine.

Superior functions for the driver and passengers integrated in perfect harmony

The cockpit of the car is clearly structured and driver-oriented in that typical BMW style: The driver's zone is on the left, giving the driver all the relevant information he needs in perfect clarity. The BMW 3 Series offers particularly the driver an excellent seating position with equally excellent side support. Compared with the competition, the air conditioning in the new BMW 3 Series boasts the fastest response in both heating up and cooling the interior. Automatic air conditioning available as an option serves to optimise the driver's and passengers' climate comfort, providing the desired temperature very quickly and efficiently without the slightest draft and keeping the optimum climate just right, without any fluctuations in temperature or climate conditions.

The BMW 3 Series is the first car in its class to feature sun blinds on the rear side windows as well as a rear window sunblind operated electrically.



Easy control plus a high level of information density

The new BMW 3 Series ensures optimum control and ergonomics wherever you go. Significant features such as the air conditioning and radio are easy to control with maximum comfort and reliability. Complex systems comprising a lot of information, in turn, are masterminded by iDrive available as an option in conjunction with the car's navigation system.

The Control Display comes within a binnacle in the middle of the instrument panel, presenting the functions of nearly all assistance and communication systems. Its main menu is subdivided into the four areas Communication, Navigation, Entertainment and Climate. Depending on the car's level of equipment, these main menus may be operated in various sub-functions on different levels.

The Controller enables the driver to choose specific functions and navigate within the menus. And apart from the Controller itself, there is also voice control with an enhanced voice dialogue and additional functions serving to mastermind the system.

Multifunction steering wheel with free buttons

The multifunction steering wheel is also an important assistance system in its own right offering not only the usual steering function, but also, through ergonomically arranged buttons, the option to mastermind additional, major functions on the car. The information and entertainment features boasted in the new BMW 3 Series have been carried over from BMW's luxury performance models: First and foremost, the customer has the choice of either the BMW Business or BMW Professional navigation system (both based on DVD data media) as optional extras. The optional Professional LOGIC7 HiFi system, in turn, provides surround sound effects throughout the interior.

In conjunction with a car telephone fitted as optional equipment, the driver is furthermore able to call up all BMW Assist services in the interest of extra comfort and safety: the emergency call function, BMW Breakdown Assistance. BMW Info, Traffic Information, as well as mobility-related inquiry services. MSR



BMW, MINI brand post impressive sales increases in February

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - March 1, 2005... The BMW Group (BMW and MINI brands combined) reported sales of 21,496 vehicles in February 2005, an increase of 10 percent over the 19,561 vehicles sold in the same month of 2004. Year-to-date, BMW Group sales increased 16 percent, to 41,260 versus the 35,696 sold in the first two months of 2004.

BMW Brand Sales

BMW reported sales of 18,356 automobiles and Sports Activity Vehicles (SAV), up 9 percent compared to the 16,903 vehicles reported in February 2004. Year-to-date, BMW reported sales of 35,203, compared to the 30,282 reported in the same period a year ago, an increase of 16.3 percent.

BMW Automobile Sales

BMW's monthly automobile sales were down slightly for the month at 13,341 versus 13,584 in February 2004. For the first two months combined, BMW automobile sales increased 7.3 percent to 25,952 versus 24,191 reported in the same period last year.

BMW Sports Activity Vehicle Sales

February sales of BMW Sports Activity Vehicles were exceptionally strong, up 51 percent, to 5,015 vehicles over the 3,319 reported in the same month a year ago. Year-to-date, sales increased 9,251 to 6,091, up 52 percent.

Certified Pre-owned

BMW's Certified Pre-owned sales increased 2.5 percent in February, to 5,546 vehicles over the 5,411 reported in February 2004. Year-to-date, CPO sales were down slightly to 10,291 over the 10,476 reported in the same period in 2004.

MINI Brand

MINI USA reported February sales of 3,140, an increase of 18 percent compared to the 2,658 sold in February 2004. MINI USA also reported sales of 6,057 for the first two months of 2005, an increase of 12 percent over the 5,414 sold in the corresponding period last year.


