



Our December Car of the Month is our **Car of the Year** which comes to you from Denver, Colorado belonging to **Goetz Pfafflin** who writes:

It was two years ago, while I was in Shanghai (having spent most of the last ten years in China), that my then newly acquired 327/28 Coupe started its long trip from Parachute, CO to Eggenfelden in South-Eastern Bavaria for a ground-up restoration.

History of the car

Having long dreamed of owning a pre-war BMW, I was very happy to find this Coupe. It had resided in Parachute for several years after its owner had moved there from New Orleans, where the car had last been registered. "Find" in this case meant that a California friend had sent an email to me in Shanghai in August 2002, with a number of pictures he had taken of this Coupe several years earlier. The car seemed complete. The original 80 HP engine had evidently been replaced by the less sporty (but more service friendly) 55 HP engine of the 327 model. The original fabric interior had been replaced by red leather. The bodywork looked "straight" if a little rusty, and the wheels and central locks seemed original. All in all, the pictures reflected a good "project car".

The previous owner, John Wenter of Parachute, loved this car, and had made a start at restoration, but familial responsibilities precluded his completing this project. He concluded that the car had a better chance of revival in a new home. John and I had a frank and friendly exchange by email and phone between Shanghai and Parachute. He really did not want to sell me the car without my having first seen it which was impractical due to my agenda in China. We reached agreement on my purchase of this car without my ever having seen it. Do I regret this seemingly risky acquisition? Not for a minute; John had been more than forthright in explaining what was wrong with the car, what parts were missing, what work had been done, etc. There were no surprises, (or better yet, *almost* no surprises). Whatever surprises <u>did</u> come to light during the restoration were not due to non-disclosure, nor would I have discovered them as a result of a personal survey of the vehicle.

John Wenter had owned the 327/28 since 1983, and had

driven it in and around New Orleans for several years. Its earlier U.S. history is difficult to reconstruct, as John's records had been destroyed in a fire that had leveled his home in Parachute a few years ago.

A certificate issued by BMW in 2003 documents that the car, VIN 74469, had originally been delivered to the BMW dealer AUTOMAG Buchner & Linse in Munich on March 4, 1939. The car had been black with red cloth upholstery, a popular combination in colors and

materials. A total of 567 327/28s were built by BMW between 1937 and 1941, with only 86 as coupes; thus, this car is quite rare. **Bill Young** recently purchased another postwar BMW coupe. When that has been cleaned up, it will be a stunning addition to the Colorado-based WW II era Bimmers!

Restoration by Josef Freudenberger Junior

I first saw "my car" in February 2003, when I was in Germany on a business trip, and visited the Josef Freudenberger shop in Eggenfelden, where the car had been delivered in early January. The Freudenbergers, father and son, had taken the car apart, literally removing everything from the frame, all body panels, whatever little wood was left of the framing, the interior, the drive train—you name it. No two pieces remained attached to each other.

This was the first phase of a 15-month restoration project. The project led to the coupe's generally being restored to original condition, albeit in two-tone dark-green with beige leather interior in lieu of the original black exterior/red cloth upholstery.

In the process of restoration, we decided upon a number of other changes, some purely esthetic, and some to make the car more user-friendly and frankly more reliable:

- We changed the 55 HP engine back to the original 80 HP version, well known from the successful competition model 328 (of which three cars reside in Colorado, including the beautiful ex-Ernie Weil racer now being campaigned by Ernie's widow, Decker Swann).
- 2. In rebuilding the engine, it received a 501 crankshaft with larger journals than the 327 and 328 engines. It was modified for use of un-leaded gasoline, and it now has the larger valves used by the latest generation of Bristol engines built in England after the war. With a compression ratio of 10.6: 1 (compared to the original ratio of 7.5:1) this engine now produces well over 100 HP, significantly increasing the "Freude am Fahren" (or "driving pleasure"), which is BMW's slogan for the Ultimate Driving Machines of today's generation.
- 3. We up-graded the electrical system from originally 6V to 12V, making starting the car infinitely easier and more reliable.
- 4. We installed a Volvo transmission with overdrive, allowing highway cruising at 75 to 80 mph with engine speeds in the 2,500-rpm range, far more pleasant than having the engine rev between 3,000 and 3,500 rpm.

To enhance the esthetics of the car, I decided to replace the original mushroom combination dashboard instrument with the optionally available round instruments. These round instruments, standard on the 328 model, were one of a few options for the 327/28 cars in 1939. Apart from the pure looks, it allows for a tachometer, which I am very happy to have. I also decided on beige Connelly leather for the interior—a break with tradition, but a beautiful combination with the dark green exterior.

As I said, the project took 15 months (mid January 2003 until mid April 2004) and I had an 18-month window for the duty-free temporary import of the car into Germany for restoration purposes. The car had to leave Germany by the end of June, which was a well-understood deadline. The Freudenbergers have restored a total of thirty 327 and

327/28s, including five coupes, so that I benefited from this extraordinary experience. There was no uncertainty, no major surprise.

A hiccup occurred when we realized that the cast iron engine block in the car had a crack; this crack was discovered in July 2003, i.e. relatively late. Securing a replacement block became a critical path item in the restoration. Fortunately a friend in New Jersey had a block available. After making a deal for this block during a meeting at Pebble Beach in August 2003, I drove back across the country. I picked up the block north of Chicago, and headed straight for Philadelphia airport for a flight to Munich, where the block accompanied me as check-in baggage. It's tough flying economy with an 80-pound engine block in tow, but it all worked out. The block was confirmed to be first class, so that the engine now in this coupe is made up of a new block out of a 328, a new crankshaft out of a 501, a brand new cam and a fully up-dated Bristol head.



Paint makes such a difference

"5 – 50 – 500"

Some years ago, I had read a very persuasive article about a logical step-by-step break-in process after a total restoration of a vintage car. I don't remember the publication, or the particular car that the author had used for his example. The article essentially said when a car has been totally reworked, it needs to be thoroughly tested before using it for a major tour or rally. The author's recommendation: Step 1-driving distance should be limited to about 5 miles, sticking close to the restoration shop, as there would inevitably be issues to deal with before one ventured too far afield. Step 2 would then be a 50-mile outing, still sticking close to home. Having an old car towed back to home base when you're 20 or 30 miles away is a lot easier than if you are 100 or 200 miles away. Once the 5 and 50 mile test drives have been accomplished, the next step is a 500 mile trip, a final shakedown, during which the car should perform trouble-free; if that is not the case, this third step needs to be repeated.

With this message clearly registered in my mind, I had decided to push the envelope a significant step further and go to a 5 - 50 - 500 - 2500 mile test. Josef Freudenberger had done steps 1, 2 and 3. I spent the month of May 2004 putting another 2,500 miles of happy motoring in Germany and France on the car. Then it was a return visit to the Freud-

enberger shop for a second oil change and a re-torguing of the head. What a dream project! It was a blast taking a beautifully restored 327/28 Coupe through parts of Germany, then participating in a 4-day Elsation Holiday put on by the German BMW Veterans Club in France, and then a rally in the nearby Saarland in Germany. Most of the time, the car performed flawlessly. However my extended test drive turned out to be a smart decision.

After about 2500 miles (total) the gearbox began to give me trouble; 4th no longer engaged as it had up to that point (and as I had owned a Volvo 121 in the 1960s, I knew how these gear boxes should feel). That meant a tear down of the

gearbox (a one-and-a-half day project), as it required pulling out the box through the top, after removal of carpets and seats. Freudenberger discovered a broken 4th gear synchroring, which was replaced by a ring from another Volvo box. A further extensive test drive ensued. This "final" test drive revealed a strange noise in the region of the right rear wheel; could it be a rubbing brake shoe? We pulled the wheel and removed the brake drum, but there was no sign of distress in the brake.

During a very long night of examining the entire rear end, Freudenberger discovered that the new SKF bearing in the right rear wheel was defective. It is a blessing that the bearing companies evidently have some measure of standardization; a replacement SKF bearing was purchased from an auto parts store the next morning. By noon, following a "final final" test drive, I was off for my last stretch of Autobahn driving en-route to Bremerhaven, where I delivered the car on May 31st for its Row-Row trip back to America.

What next?

Since that time, the car has been on display at BMW NA in Woodcliff Lake, NJ, participated (faultlessly) in the 2004 BMW Vintage Marathon in the east, and now resides in the museum of BMW Manufacturing in Spartanburg, SC. It will return to Colorado well in time for the 2005 season, during which it will participate in a number of Colorado events, incluse ing the BMW V&CCCA "Colorado Holiday" in July 2005.

MINI Announces Next New Special Edition; The MINI Pullman

Special Model to Promote Flexible Transportation Initiative

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - April 1, 2005... MINI, already known for cornering as if it were on rails, will now offer a special edition that will actually corner on rails. In light of the growing problem of gridlock and rush hour traffic, this special model is adapted to ride on all domestic gauge rail lines throughout North America.

In conjunction with the North American railway system, an exclusive right-of-way has been authorized for the specially equipped MINI to commute via rail during peak hours in major urban centers. This access, once only limited to railway utility trucks is now available to MINI owners who order the special model.

The MINI Pullman can access the railway at any major crossing gate provided care is taken not to enter into the opposing direction of prevailing rail traffic. A new feature in the onboard computer allows the MINI 'motorman' or woman to access individual rail line schedules to plan their travels while on the rails.

The MINI Pullman comes fitted with a special wheel package that easily locks onto standard gauge rail thus allowing MINIs to corner on the roads and the rails with equal aplomb. An upgraded dual air-horn warning system comes standard on the model to alert inattentive pedestrians and vehicles as the MINI Pullman enters into crossing gate areas.

To compliment this new model, MINI has created a line of apparel. Items from overalls to hats are available in a fetching grey ticking-stripe pattern. Accessories for the vehicle include a brass roof-mounted bell and a special auxiliary engine exhaust stack that mounts on the bonnet. For four additional passengers, a specially adapted hitch system allows for the MINI Pullman owner to add the accessory Commuter Caboose.

"Access to the national system of underground subway rail is under consideration, once the logistics of accessing the track through individual subway stations can be solved" said national railway spokesperson Lou Komodeff, "We look forward to sharing the rails with MINI as long as they are 'going our way."

MINI spokesperson, Hugh Moore said, "MINI has mastered the art of cornering on the roads. Now we can claim that MINIs do literally corner on rails." MINI has scheduled the first prototype testing on public railways to commence today, April 1st, 2005 o MSR

Bahrain Grand Prix - Race, April 3, 2005

Weather: Dry, overcast. Temp: Air 42°C, Track 48-55°C

Sakhir (BHR). In the heat of the Bahrain desert, the BMW WilliamsF1 Team collected three points thanks to Mark Webber who finished in sixth position. Team mate Nick Heidfeld had to retire due to an engine failure around the mid-race distance.

Mark Webber: 6th

Chassis: FW27 03 - Best time: 1:33.087min (lap 20, 10th overall)

It was a tough race for me. Unfortunately with about 20 laps to go I had a spin at turn 10 when I was running third and I lost two positions. My tires were in bad shape after I spun and the car was difficult to drive because of strong vibrations. So in the last few laps I lost one position to de la Rosa. Everyone in the team did a very good job and also Michelin provided us with good tires. Now I am looking forward to Imola.

Nick Heidfeld: DNF (engine failure on lap 26)

Chassis: FW27 04 - Best time: 1:33.055min (lap 19, 9th overall)

It's disappointing not to finish the race, especially because I was running in a very good position and I was on course to collect several useful points. On the other side one has to consider that my engine was the only one in the field that had run in Malaysia already and was having its' second Grand Prix here, in such extreme conditions. Everybody is working flat out at WilliamsF1 and at BMW and it's a shame what happened, nevertheless I am sure we will get some reward in the next races.

Sam Michael (Technical Director WilliamsF1):

This is obviously not the result we were aiming for after qualifying. In the ambient conditions we ran the engine at its thermal limits, which may have contributed to Nick's engine failure. In terms of lap times we had to manage the engine revs during the race which made it difficult for both drivers to defend. Either way we are confident that we will be able to race more strongly in Imola.

Mario Theissen (BMW Motorsport Director):

After a strong qualifying we were hoping for more from this race. The intense heat compromised us in two ways. First of all Nick drove the only car with an engine that had already endured the Malaysian heat. The combined temperature effects of both those races was obviously too much. We will find out in Munich what the exact reason for the failure was. The other reason is that even with the car's maximum cooling configuration we were running at thermal-limits and we could not exploit our engines to their full revs and this contributed to Mark being unable to properly defend his good position.

New York's Cooper-Hewitt National Design Museum to Feature a BMW Williamsf1 Grand Prix Racing Car in Its "Extreme Textiles" Exhibition

Between April 8 and October 23, 2005, one of the most renowned institutions devoted to design, the Cooper-Hewitt National Design Museum in New York, will stage the landmark exhibition "Extreme Textiles: Designing for High Performance."

The Exhibit


As part of BMW Group's Cultural Communications, the BMW WilliamsF1 Team is supporting this major show by displaying an FW26 Grand Prix car that has previously raced in the 2004 Formula One World Championship. Accompanying the car display will be a selection of authentic team items including among others: an F1 driver's helmet, racing suit, gloves, and shoes. Various display screens will present the BMW WilliamsF1 at speed on the race track, while interactive hands-on wall labels will allow visitors to experience the material components through touch. The F1 racing car itself will be displayed on a specially designed and dynamically tilted platform that pays homage to its status as an ultimate driving machine. The stand itself is constructed of the most recent high-tech materials.

The Exhibition

This is the first museum exhibition devoted to the subject of technical textiles and highly engineered materials that are designed for ultimate performance in extreme conditions. Curated by Matilda McQuaid, Exhibitions Curator and Head of Cooper-Hewitt's Textiles department, the exhibition will present more than 150 extreme textile applications from a wide range of areas, including architecture, apparel, medicine, transportation, aerospace, and the environment. The exhibition will examine the broad spectrum of contemporary design through the lens of textile fibers and structures.

The objects featured in the exhibition will be organized in terms of their high-performance characteristics: Stronger, lighter, faster, smarter, and safer; and displayed throughout the Museum campus, including the first and second floor exhibition galleries, the Great Hall, and the Arthur Ross Terrace and Garden. The BMW WilliamsF1 Team will be part of this exhibition in two separate categories.

First, the faster category will be on the museum's main floor featuring the display of an FW26 with plasma screens and HP tablet pc's playing copyright free Formula One footage provided by the BMW WilliamsF1 Team.



Secondly, part of he museum's second floor is dedicated to the show's theme Safer, where numerous Formula One items are on display, including an F1 driver's helmet, racing suit, gloves and shoes, supported by HP tablet pc's.

Extreme Textiles will explore the recent advancements in technical textiles, and reference the Museum's own textile collection in order to illustrate historical examples of textile structures and techniques-such as weaving, knitting, braiding, and embroidery - that continue to be used in the most pioneering textiles today.

The Museum

Founded in 1897 the Cooper-Hewitt, National Design Museum, Smithsonian Institution, New York, is the only museum in the United States devoted exclusively to historic and contemporary design. The Museum believes that design shapes our objects, environments, and communications, making them more desirable, functional, and accessible. With more than 250,000 objects, Cooper-Hewitt, National Design Museum is one of the largest repositories of design in the world - and with over 60,000 volume in its library it has become an important research institution for scholars and the interested public alike.

On Sunday, April 24, Paul Warwick Thompson, Director of the Cooper-Hewitt National Design Museum will be an invited panelist at the "BMW Group Design Talk Villa Erba 05." During this year's Concorso d'Eleganza at the shores of Italy's Lake Como, international keynote speakers including Carl Magnusson, VP and Konstantin Grcic, a Munich base designer will discuss design of the 1950's.

Later in the year, Paola Antonelli, design curator at the Museum of Modern Art, will launch a MoMA design exhibition of her own, SAFER, which will include an original BMW R 1150 RT-P motorcycle as they are being used by the California Highway Patrol.

Auberlen and Hand Take Grand American 400 GT Victory BMW Team PTG M3s Finish 1st, 6th, 7th and 12th

Fontana, Calif. - April 3, 2005... The No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3 of Bill Auberlen and Joey Hand won the GT class of today's Grand American 400, moving BMW to second in Manufacturer Points. It was the first victory of the 2005 season for the defending GT class champions. Starting from the pole, the duo covered 84 laps in the two-hour-and-forty-five-minute contest, finishing ahead of the No. 65 Porsche.

Not an easy race, the contest was marked by six caution periods that required smart pit strategy by Team PTG to gain advantage over a very competitive 24-car GT field.

After falling to second on the lap 14 restart, Auberlen pitted for fuel only during the second yellow-flag to regain the lead. He held the point and it was the fifth caution period of the race that proved pivotal for the win. Just within the window to make it a one-stop race, Auberlen was able to pit the No. 21 M3 under caution. Hand entered the car on lap 46 and, though challenged towards the end of the race, held on for the win.

The No 22 BMW Team PTG M3 of Chris Gleason and Ian James finished sixth after starting fifth.

The No. 16 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3 of Tom Milner and Justin Marks started second and ran just behind the leading No. 21 M3 for a great part of the race. Unfortunately, their effort was undone by a broken coolant fitting. Marks had to pit for repairs with only 25 minutes remaining in the race. They finished seventh, with Milner setting the fast lap of the race (1:41.545) on lap two.

After running in the top-10, the No. 17 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3 of RJ Valentine and Kelly Collins dropped back in the field late in the race after pitting for tires. They finished 12th.

Round four of the Rolex Sports Car Series will take place on April 29-May 1 at Laguna Seca Raceway.


BILL AUBERLEN, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3: "The race proved to be uneventful. We ran to the numbers and that can get to be a little stressful because you feel you should be doing more. The M3 was great at the end and Joey could race with anyone. I think our strategy of pitting for fuel only early was the right one as it enabled us to make the race on only one more stop. That meant the tires were fresher at the end. Let's look to string these wins together like we did last season."

JOEY HAND, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3: "It is good to be back on top. Everyone told me that this place would be tough for us, but I said that the M3 was great through the bumpy infield last year and that would make a difference. We were a little closer to the Porsches on the straights, but the way we can roll through the middle of the corners made up for what we lacked on the banking."

TOM MILNER, OWNER BMW TEAM PTG: "I think the performance of the GT class is now as close as it has ever been. It was a good day for PTG, but my happiness is tempered by the fact that we did not receive a wave-by during the first caution period."

HERNANDO CARVAJAL, BMW OF NORTH AMERICA MOTORSPORTS MANAGER: "After a particularly rough start to the season, it is great to have the BMW M3 back on top. It looked like we could have had a 1-2 M3 finish, but we had a small mechanical problem. We'll see if we can keep the wins coming." MSR

BMW Sets Its Sights on the Nurburgring 24 Hours Again Farewell season for the BMW M3 GTR

Munich, 18th February 2005. One more time: BMW will again be fielding its two BMW M3 GTRs in the Nürburgring 24 Hour Race on 7th/8th May. It will mark the final season for the two muscle cars with their 500 bhp V8 engines that claimed a one-two win in 2004.

The seven-man BMW squad for the marathon on the legendary Nordschleife has been named: the winners of 2004, BMW works drivers Dirk Müller (Burbach) and Jörg Müller (Hückelhoven), along with Hans-Joachim Stuck (Ellmau/AUT) are in the team, as are last year's three runners-up - Duncan Huisman (NLD), Pedro Lamy (PRT) and Boris Said (USA). Team BMW Motorsport led by Charly Lamm gets notable backing from Andy Priaulx (GBR), the reigning European Touring Car Champion and BMW works driver in the 2005 FIA World Touring Car Championship (WTCC).

BMW Motorsport Director Mario Theissen: "The Nürburgring 24 Hours is unique in terms of sport and atmosphere. 220 cars racing on a 25.4-kilometre twisty labyrinth before a crowd of 200,000 - this is a spectacular event. In 2004 we defied the most appalling weather conditions to take a onetwo win, which caused great excitement among the public and in-house. In 2005, our preparation program is much shorter due to the event having been brought forward by five weeks and because of the relatively harsh winter. Nevertheless, we hope to be able to continue the BMW success story on the Nordschleife with the last major appearance of the M3 GTR, though we know only too well that with this kind of distance on what is arguably the world's most challenging circuit, things don't always go according to plan. That is also part of the attraction of this 24-hour event."

With 17 overall victories - including seven one-two wins - since the event was inaugurated in 1970, BMW has been by far the most successful manufacturer involved in the race. Hans-Joachim Stuck was behind the wheel for three of BMW's overall wins. He won the debut race of 1970 in a BMW 2002 ti and was also at the controls in 1998 when the BMW 320d became the first diesel-powered touring car to win an endurance event of this kind.

Before the BMW touring car aces rise to the challenges of season 2005's 24 Hour Race and FIA World Touring Car Championship (WTCC), they will be meeting up at the BMW Fitness Camp in Principina Terra, Grosseto (Italy) from 25th February to 2nd March.



DRIVERS SCHOOL REGISTRATION PROGRAM AVAILABLE TO CHAPTERS

Brian Ghidinelli of the Golden Gate chapter has been working with the Golden Gate and Delaware Valley chapters over the past two years to build a comprehensive online registration and payment system for driving events (HPDE, AutoX, Rally, and so on) at http://www.MotorsportReg.com.

The system has been so successful with it that Brian wants to make it available to the other chapters. He'd like MotorsportReg.com to become the online registration system of choice for BMW CCA chapters and their driving events. Chapters would not be required to use it but those that do would save money and effort, mitigate technology risks and have more fun running their events using Brian's proven system.

Use of MotorsportReg.com is completely free: free for promoting events, free for online registration, free for generating reports. Our only fee is a 4.5% service charge for online payments. About 3% of that goes to Visa/Mastercard and the other 1.5% is our margin which covers technology infrastructure, customer service and other costs. If a chapter ran an event and not a single person paid online, MotorsportReg would collect \$0 and that's perfectly OK with them. Brian built the system to make events easier to manage.




Traditional Driver's Ed teaches traffic signs and sometimes signaling for a lane change. Usually, it's a little weak on the physics of driving. Unfortunately, the first time a new driver hits that patch of black ice or has to swerve to avoid the daydreamer who just blew through a stop sign, that physics thing is going to rear its ugly head. How will our new driver handle it? Adult members of the Rocky Mountain Chapter have the opportunity to participate in our excellent Performance Driving Schools, but how will our under-18 kids learn the driving skills they need?

The BMW CCA Foundation has created a one-day school to teach teens how to handle their cars safely. It's called *Street Survival*, to reflect its purpose: keeping our kids alive in their everyday driving on the streets and highways. It takes students from any starting point, to knowing how to handle their cars in any situation they can encounter. Do You Have Gas? by Jim Bartlett

recently noticed a thread on a 7-series tech forum that prompted me to write this "tech" topic article. Many of our chapter members are pros at maintaining their cars, capable of determining the root cause of most problems that occur, as well as performing any mechanical work required to remedy the situation. For those who are less experienced, these tips may be of significant value.

Fuel Line Leaks

Here are some recent forum postings regarding fuel line leaks, demonstrating the problem...

"Over the past six months I have on 5 or 6 occasions noticed a gas smell in the cabin of my car. Mostly this occurred when the weather was very cold (sub 10 degrees) and I had left the car outside for an hour or two. The gas smell would go away after I drove it a few minutes and the problem wouldn't resurface for usually a month. I just took my car out to the store, which is not even a mile from my home and I started to smell gas while I was driving. There appeared to be no leaks on the garage floor and the strangest thing is how intermittent the problem is.

I'm just wondering if any of you have had this issue and can recommend the best place to look for a leak or if it could be something else?"

At 03:10 AM 10/21/2004, you wrote: Regarding a '97 740IL with 132,000 miles.

Occasionally, I smell gas. It is infrequent, yet at times I will detect the gas odor. What could this be -- especially taking into account that the gas scent is only from time to time -- not constant?

Subject: Intermittent Gas Smell on 740iL Date: Fri, 22 Oct 2004

I had the same problem. Took the engine cover off while the engine was cold and looked for gasoline, then started the car. Before I got back, the whole intake section was soaked with fuel. There is a small fuel line located on driver's side near the firewall. I found a small hole in mine, just next to the clamp. It was spraying a small amount of gasoline right between the intake runners.

What to Smell For

Do you sometimes smell gasoline when first starting your car, or when getting in or out of the car (after starting when cold, or just after operation has ended)? If you do, it's very possible you have a leak in one of your fuel lines.

The rubber fuel lines on BMW automobiles carry highpressure gasoline throughout the fuel system (from the fuel tank to fuel pump, fuel filter, and into the fuel injection system or carburetors). Pressure is typically about 35 PSI, which is more than two atmospheres. Over time, these fuel lines slowly age and become weak, at which point they may cease to hold this pressure in, resulting in leaks.

How it happens

At first the leaks may be no more than minor seepage at locations where the hose segments are attached and fastened by hose clamps. This happens as the rubber hose loses its elasticity, and no longer expands and contracts as much as it did when new. Where the ends of the fuel line are compressed at connection points, the hose / hose-clamp connection may become lose when these parts are cold, causing gas seepage that only occurs during cold starts in low ambient temperature (wintertime). Where gas seepage is concerned, it's most likely that hose clamps on the fuel lines are in need of replacement. On many cars (like my 740iL) these clamps are only crimped on, and this is a relatively common problem. Since the fuel system is under pressure, gas begins to seep out at these locations. Being highly volatile, the gas may evaporate fast enough from a seeping joint so that no visible leak can be seen (no puddle on the garage floor)...just a telltale smell.

Further deterioration of the fuel lines may yield pinhole leaks that spray a mist or stream of gasoline into your engine compartment – not a safe situation, to put it mildly!

What to DO

BMW uses a special braided hose to carry the high pressure necessary for proper fuel circulation. The specific size and part number of the hose may vary from car to car. In all cases, it's highly recommended that OEM fuel line (sourced from BMW) be used to replace any old segments.

To avoid unplanned visits from the fire department and associated personal injury and/or insurance claims, it's wise to *immediately investigate any gasoline odor emanating from your car.* Regular tech inspections (such as those performed in conjunction with our Fall and Spring Driving School events) are one way to keep an eye on things like this. However, some BMW owners have been known to take a preventative approach, replacing all of their fuel lines at regular intervals (e.g. every 3 years), just to be safe. Others – particularly those who regularly "track" their cars – may elect to replace their stock rubber fuel lines with more durable aftermarket parts designed for such service.

When replacing fuel lines, you may need to cut off existing hose clamps. BMW clamps (and those of some other German makers) differ from common automotive hose clamps in that they don't contain slots or serrations, which could cut into and weaken the soft rubber hose. Recently manufactured BMW hose clamps include built-in "torque-to-yield" heads, which automatically snap-off after the requisite tension has been reached. This prevents over tightening, but also means the parts are one-time use, and must be cut off when the need for replacement occurs.

Fuel Filter Clogging

Owners of fuel-injected BMWs should also periodically check the main fuel filter – the one near the fuel pump. It's

advisable to replace this filter every 10,000 miles, not at the longer intervals recommended by the factory. These filters are so efficient that they can quickly become clogged as they strain out fine particulate matter pumped into the tank along with your gasoline.

As the fuel filter becomes filled, it begins reducing the flow of gas to your engine. You first may notice that the engine appears to be "missing" or "not firing on all cylinders" on an intermittent basis. You may also experience difficulties starting the car when hot, or notice a lack of top-end power. Next, you may notice difficulty going over 50 mph, then trouble reaching 50, and finally find that you struggle to get to 20 mph. Some owners have seen this situation creep up on them slowly over weeks or months, while others have experienced a seemingly "packed" filter, almost overnight – with coincident inability to start or operate the car for more than a few minutes.

To avoid being stranded by a clogged fuel filter, some owners carry a spare filter, because these are unique parts – nothing else will fit your Bimmer, nothing can be substituted, and of course the car won't run with the part missing. In addition to carrying an extra filter, it's wise to know what size wrenches and other tools may be required to change out the part on your vehicle...and ensure those tools are in your car's tool kit.

An Ounce of Prevention...

As a general rule, try not to fill up your gas tank whenever there's higher probability of particulate matter suspended in the gas. Situations when particulate matter is likely to be highest include:

(a) whenever a gas delivery is in process at the filling station, (sediment in the bottom of the underground tank is stirred up during this process, and doesn't settle back to the bottom for 20-30 minutes);

(b) whenever the underground tanks are near empty (you'll know this because the gas pumps up top usually begin operating much more slowly (sometimes painfully so!) when underground tank levels begin to approach the low level mark).

Pumping gas into your car at such times simply invites more sediment into your tank....sediment which eventually flows into the fuel lines and gets captured in the fuel filter (which is simply doing its job).

Bottom line, gasoline is the life-blood of your car. To ensure it continues to flow freely (and safely) to your engine compartment, keep a close eye on the fuel lines and fuel filter, replacing the fuel filter every 10,000 miles, and fuel lines as indicated by wear, seepage, etc. MSR







All-New 2006 BMW 3 Series and Enhanced 2006 7 Series Make North American Debut at The New York International Auto Show

Prices Announced for 2006 3 Series, 7 Series as well as 5 Series

New York, NY - March 23, 2005... The all-new 2006 3 Series and the enhanced 2006 7 Series make their North American debut at the New York International Auto Show. Prices were announced for the 2006 3 Series and 7 Series as well as the 2006 5 Series, including all-wheel drive models. Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Prices for the 325i and 330i sedans are \$30,995 and \$36,995 respectively. Prices for the 750i with its new 360 hp V8 begin at \$71,195. Prices for the 2006 5 Series, which feature all-new inline six cylinder engines and available all-wheel drive, start from \$42,495 for the 525i. The 530xi Sports Wagon has an MSRP of \$51,795. All prices include destination and handling. All of these early 2006 models will be available beginning this May.

The all-new BMW 3 Series: The quintessential sport sedan blends cutting edge technology with remarkable value

The fifth generation BMW 3 Series will yet again improve and refine a concept BMW pioneered more than forty years ago - the sport sedan. The new 3 Series continues to offer style and quality combined with a unique combination of performance, practicality and European luxury in a compact package.

Above all, the 3 Series is renowned for how it drives. Since the beginning, the 3 Series has always been remarkably agile and pleasurable to drive, without compromising comfort and everyday usability. Though many have tried and are still trying, no one else quite knows how to match this constellation of attributes.

The new 2006 3 Series will arrive this May with two models available, the 325i and 330i. Two inline six-cylinder engines continue a 3 Series tradition. The all-new 3.0-liter unit in the 330i offers a significant increase in performance. It is rated at 255-horsepower at 6600 rpm, a 30-horsepower increase over its predecessor and has 220 lb-ft of torque at 2750 rpm. The 325i will now also feature a new 3.0-liter engine. This engine is rated at 215-horsepower at 6250 rpm and 185 lb-ft of torque at 2750 rpm.

In BMW's ongoing pursuit of weight reduction, this engine is the first in large-scale series production to use magnesium which, compared to aluminum, is 30 percent lighter. This engine is also the first six-cylinder to use BMW VALVETRONIC. With infinitely variable valve lift in place of the traditional throttle butterfly, this system improves both throttle response and fuel efficiency. Like previous BMW engines which have incorporated VALVETRONIC, the gains are impressive. In the case of the 330i, horsepower increases by 13%, while fuel consumption decreases by as much as 9%, depending on model. This unique technology works in tandem with BMW's double-VANOS variable valve timing for both intake and exhaust camshafts. The new 330i with manual transmission will accelerate from 0 - 60 mph in 6.1 seconds. Both models will be offered with a choice of a standard six-speed manual transmission or optional six-speed STEPTRONIC automatic transmission.

The 3 Series will be available with all-wheel drive, features BMW's xDrive, beginning this October.

The front suspension is enhanced to include BMW's double-pivot strut design while the rear suspension features a new five-link design. BMW has been able to further capitalize on its Dynamic Stability Control with a number of new features. When brakes risk fading due to heat build up caused by hard use, Brake Fade Compensation automatically reacts by increasing the hydraulic pressure relative to pedal force. When the driver lifts off the accelerator pedal abruptly, Brake Stand-by enables DSC to recognize that sharp braking may be about to occur and applies just enough pressure in the brake system to snug up the pads against the rotors. With Brake Drying, acting on input from the rain sensor the pads are periodically brought up to the rotors - just enough to eliminate any film of water between pads and rotors, but not enough to cause a brake application. Comfort Stop ensures smooth stops by modulating the brakes as the car comes to rest. Start-Off Assistant holds the car on a hill enabling a smooth start off from rest.

With all this technology, the MSRPs of the 325i and 330i are \$30,995 and \$36,995 respectively. A typically equipped 325i includes the Premium Package, an automatic transmission, leather upholstery and metallic paint. At \$35,645, a typically equipped 2006 325i is only \$150 more than its 2005 counterpart and has substantially more equipment. When you factor in the Xenon Adaptive Headlights which are standard on the 2006 330i, that model with Premium Package, automatic transmission and metallic paint is actually \$100 less than a similarly equipped 2005 model, again with substantially more equipment.

2006 7 Series:

Design enhancements inside and out are complemented by more power for V8 models.

Since its introduction in 2002, the fourth generation 7

Series has proven to be the most successful 7 Series ever. The 2006 7 Series exterior receives subtle but significant refinements. Forward of the windshield, new elements include a larger rendition of BMW's traditional "kidney" grilles; a new bumper/spoiler ensemble; new headlights and fog lights; and a re-contoured hood. The rear bumper's wraparound tucks in more noticeably at the wheel well and thus visually emphasizes a 14-mm/0.6-in. wider rear track. Both 750 models have a new standard wheel design, with seven relatively wide spokes reaching right out to the rim. The trunk lid is newly shaped while retaining the original's advantages in terms of aerodynamics and cargo space; the taillights now wrap into the lid, and are accented by a slender bright strip.

The refinements are carried into the interior as well. New climate-control knobs present improved tactile feel to the user, and are trimmed in an elegant new Titanium galvanic material that also appears in other details. The iDrive system's controller has a new, handier shape and a handsome leather insert on top. Functional enhancements include the audio system's new hard controls for AM/FM and entertainment source selection; MP3 capability added to the CD changer (standard 760i/Li, optional 750i/Li); and a Bluetooth cell phone interface. Whereas previously the 7 Series came standard with an installed (but also portable) phone, owners will now select their own phone from a list of BMW-approved handheld phones and can keep up with the latest developments in this fast-moving technology while also enjoying standard hands-free calling, auto-dial functions and Voice Command convenience. Encompassing an extensive array of features and functions within its pioneering color-display-andcontroller concept, iDrive has again been refined and made more user-friendly.

The new 750i and 750iL feature a new 4.8-liter VAL-VETRONIC V8 engine. With 360 horsepower and 360 lb-ft of torque, this represents an increase of 35 horsepower and 30 lb-ft of torque over their predecessors. Although official 0-60-mph acceleration times are little changed at 5.8 seconds, the real story here is more urge virtually anytime the driver presses down on the accelerator pedal, especially at midrange speeds. The 6.0-liter V12 in the 760i and 760Li remains unchanged offering 438 horsepower and 444 lb-ft of torque. Both are mated to a 6-speed STEPTRONIC automatic transmission. The price of the 750i and 750Li are \$71,195 and \$75,195 respectively. This represents a \$600 increase over the previous models. Prices for the 2006 760i and 760Li are \$110,695 and \$118,095 respectively.

2006 5 Series: New six-cylinder engines, available all-wheel drive and the return of the Sports Wagon

In only its third model year the latest 5 Series enters the 2006 model year with BMW's newest generation of inline 6-cylinder engines, available all-wheel drive and the return of the 5 Series Sports Wagon. The 5 Series shares its two 3-liter engines with the new 3 Series. The 525i/xi go from 184 to 215 horsepower while the 530i/xi go from 225 to 255 hp. All models are offered with a 6-speed manual transmission with an available 6-speed STEPTRONIC automatic. The 530i is also available with a 6-speed Sequential Manual Gearbox.

The 5 Series are the first passenger cars that use BMW's xDrive all-wheel drive system, which has proven itself in the X3 and X5 Sports Activity Vehicles. xDrive goes beyond the traditional advantages of all-wheel drive to offer the driver an even higher level of stability and traction in all driving situations. While conventional all-wheel drive only responds when the wheels are already spinning, xDrive begins to react even before wheel spin is able to build up. Via an electronically controlled multiple-plate clutch, the flow of power is redistributed within milliseconds between the two axles in the interest *continued next page*

of enhanced traction, driving stability and agility.

The 5 Series Sports Wagon returns as the 530xi. Offered only as an all-wheel drive model, the 530xi Sports Wagon offers advantages not only over the Sedans, but also over its predecessor, last offered in 2003. The 530xi abounds with rational design and thoughtful details which include a high-lift tailgate - almost 73 in. head clearance - with Soft Close feature. The tailgate is electrically released from the exterior or interior switch or the remote. The rear window may be opened separately, for convenient loading without opening the tailgate. A power opening and closing feature is included in the Premium Package. Wider than that in the previous Wagon, and with straight, essentially vertical sides, the cargo area offers 17.6 cu ft. of volume up to the tops of the upright rear seats and a maximum of 58.3 cu ft., rear seats folded, cargo loaded to ceiling. The cargo area includes a lockable storage space under the cargo floor, in a tray with adjustable dividers to help secure smaller objects.

Like the Sedans, the Sports Wagon comes standard with a power moonroof; however, the Wagon's is a dual-panel Panorama Moonroof, a feature also seen in the X3 and X5 Series. With its overall roof opening of 41.9 x 34.8 in., the Panorama concept gives occupants almost the feeling of being in a convertible. The power glass roof consists of two panels, both of which can be tilted up at the rear. The forward, larger panel can also be slid open; together, their glass area is almost 10 square feet. Although the glass is effectively tinted, there is also a power-operated interior shade; a wind deflector rises at the front of the opening to reduce wind buffeting when panels are open. All motions have 1-touch operation, including that of the interior shade.

In addition to other enhancements, Servotronic vehiclespeed sensitive power steering is standard on all models and Adaptive Xenon Headlights are standard on 530i/xi models.

Manufacturer Suggested Retail Prices for the 525i and 530i Sedans are \$42,495 and \$47,195 respectively. For the all-wheel drive Sedans, the MSRPs are \$44,695 for the 525xi and \$49,395 for the 530xi. The all-wheel drive 530xi Sports Wagon has an MSRP of \$51,795.



No Training Wheels Needed: New BMW Kids' Bike Grows With Young Riders

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - March 14, 2005... The new BMW Kids' Bike lets riders avoid a wobbly beginning by starting out as a ride-on bike without pedals, allowing children to develop balancing skills until they are ready for the power of pedaling. The user-friendly bicycle has an easy-to-install pedal system and an adjustable seat so it can grow with the rider.

By starting a biking adventure with their feet first, children can use the sleek two-wheeler BMW as a running bike, practicing steering and hand-braking skills, and developing a natural sense of balance at their own pace.

When young riders are ready, the sturdy plastic pedals and steel chain can be fitted to the BMW Kids' Bike. The pedals have safety reflectors, and the pedal brake system features a hand-operated brake on the right handle bar and a back-pedal brake.

In the tradition of BMW technology and design, the Kids' Bike features a resilient bike frame made of high-quality brushed aluminum. The striking frame is painted in bright blue and gray, or deep red and gray, with the BMW logo embossed on both sides of the frame. Other safety features include an adjustable cantilever frontwheel brake, a child-friendly steering design and a controlled

steering lock. There are reflector lights and a hand-operated bell on the left handle bar that rings as the child pushes the small lever down, alerting other bikers of their arrival.

The BMW Kids' Bike retails for \$300 and is intended for children age's three to six. It weighs approximately 16 pounds with the pedals and the maximum weight load for the Bike is 111 pounds. The frame ranges from 15 to 18.1 inches.

BMW Group Reports 7% Increase in Sales for First Quarter 2005

BMW Brand Up 4.5% Year-To-Date

MINI Brand Up 23% Year-To-Date, Propelled by Best Retail Month

Woodcliff Lake, NJ - April 1, 2005... The BMW Group (BMW and MINI brands combined) reported year-to-date sales of 65,536 vehicles, a 7 percent increase over the 61,241 sold in the first quarter of 2004. The BMW Group also reported a decrease of 5 percent in March sales for 24,276 vehicles compared to the 25,545 sold in that month last year.

BMW Brand Reports Sales

Year-to-date, sales of BMW brand vehicles were up 4.5 percent for sales of 55,352 vehicles compared to 52,970 vehicles sold in first quarter of 2004.

The company also reported an 11 percent decline in March sales of automobiles and Sports Activity Vehicles, to 20,149 vehicles compared to the 22,688 reported last March.

The decline was not surprising, given that inventories of 3 Series sedans are at extremely low levels, in preparation for the launch of the all-new 2006 sedans in May.

BMW Automobile Sales

BMW's automobile sales dropped 18 percent in March, to 14,475 versus 17,733 in the same month a year ago. First quarter sales were down slightly, 3.6 percent, to 40,427 automobiles compared to 41,924 in the same period a year ago.

BMW Sports Activity Vehicle Sales

Year-to-date, sales of BMW Sports Activity Vehicles are up 35 percent for 14,925 vehicles versus the 11,046 vehicles sold in the first three months of 2004. March SAV sales were 5,674, compared to 4,955 vehicles sold in the same month last year, an increase of 14.5 percent.

Certified Pre-owned


Certified Pre-owned BMW sales were up 1.6 percent with 6,587 vehicles sold over the 6,486 sold last March, making it the best March ever.

Year-to-date, the company reported sales of 16,878 CPO vehicles, almost even (-0.5 percent) with the 16,962 sold in the first three months of 2004.

MINI Brand

Demand for MINI brand automobiles was exceptionally strong as the division celebrated its third anniversary in the U.S. on March 22nd. March sales were the best ever recorded, for 4,127 cars versus 2,857 in March 2004, an increase of 44 percent. First quarter sales of MINI automobiles increased 23 percent with sales of 10,184 over the 8,271 sold in the first quarter of 2004. MSR



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
