



### BMW Continues to have Great News! Rewards Program Extended

Looking to purchase a new BMW? You're in luck. BMW CCA has extended the Rewards Program through December 31, 2005; all vehicles qualify except the Z8. Check it out in your monthly *Roundel* or the BMW CCA website at <u>http://</u> <u>www.bmwcca.org/services/svcfset.shtml</u> The basic guidelines remain the same – one must be a member in good standing of the BMW CCA for at least one year continuously prior to purchasing your vehicle (please do not contact BMW CCA about back dating memberships, <u>they will not</u> <u>wavier on this issue</u>), and one must file the documentation within 60 days of taking delivery of the vehicle. We have not received the updated forms yet, but understand that BMW NA has also included the Z4 in the program. Anyone purchasing a Z4 after January 1, 2005—and fulfilling the other program requirements—can apply for the rebate.


# Mini USA Awards Nuzzo Motor Sports Prize Money for Podium Finish Contingency Program Pays Out \$6,000 for Third-Place Finish at Watkins Glen

WOODCLIFF LAKE, NJ - June 24, 2005... Mini USA has awarded Nuzzo Motor Sports for its participation and hardwon podium finish at Watkins Glen, Saturday, June 11th with a \$6,000 contingency payout. The private team of Nuzzo Motor Sports, who campaigned two Mini Cooper S' in Grand Am took full benefit of Mini's contingency program, notably with a 3rd place win in the ST class.

Mini USA's contingency program offers private Mini racing efforts an incentive to compete in grassroots motorsport. From SCCA Solo, to Road Racing to Rally, those who compete have the opportunity to earn up to \$7,500 per race. In addition, Mini USA's race contingency program now offers publicity support for any podium finisher who successfully competes with a Mini in select classes. Historically, Mini earned its racing legacy on the challenging rally circuits in Europe, most notably Monte Carlo where a Mini Cooper S won in 1964, 1966 and 1967. # BMW Managed Formula One Team from 2006 BMW Realigns Its Formula One involvement

MUNICH, 22nd JUNE 2005. BMW is striking out on a new path in Formula One. After acquiring a majority shareholding in the Swiss Sauber team, a BMW managed team will be contesting the Formula One World Championship as early as 2006. This was decided by the BMW Board of Management on Tuesday. It means that, for the first time in company history, BMW will be competing independently in Formula One.

# Professor Burkhard Göschel, BMW Board Member for Development and Purchasing:

"This decision is a strong, long-term affirmation of BMW's commitment to Formula One. We anticipate that Formula One will emerge strengthened from the current restructuring phase and that it will continue to represent the top echelon of motor sport for the future as well. For BMW, Formula One is thus the right platform for demonstrating our competence as a car manufacturer.

Success in Formula One increasingly depends on the perfect interplay of all factors. That is why we have resolved to extend our involvement beyond our present role of engine partner. With a team managed by BMW we will, as of next year, take on responsibility for the entire package, which will include the key factors of the chassis, tires and drivers.

Naturally this decision impacts on our partnership with

WilliamsF1. We want to discuss the future options together with WilliamsF1 in order to find the right way forward for both sides.

We do not expect instant success from the new constellation, but we are convinced that we have chosen the right path for the long term."

#### Dr Mario Theissen, BMW Motorsport Director:

"The realignment of our Formula One strategy is based on two insights. Firstly, the influence of the engine on the winning potential of the overall package has diminished; the car, tires and drivers play a greater role than they used to. Secondly, from our point of view, an optimal overall package can only be achieved with a fully integrated team and coherent processes throughout.

In restructuring we are taking account of these insights. At Sauber we have found a solid foundation for vehicle development and production, along with the requisite knowhow and one of the most modern wind tunnels. The results achieved there so far are worthy of respect in the light of the team's limited budget.

BMW will not only maintain this foundation but build on it. That applies both to the facilities and to the staff. Additional workplaces will be created at the Sauber headquarters in

Hinwil. The new team will be managed as a fully integrated project from two locations, as has long been standard practice at BMW for series production.

We are aware that we face a learning curve, that although you can plan success you can't buy it off the peg. After showing that BMW is capable of building the best Formula One engine, we are starting out as it were at apprenticeship level on the complex task of tackling the vehicle as a whole. That demands patience and stamina. We possess both, as well as a concrete work program. The technical cooperation has already begun.

In the partnership with WilliamsF1 we have celebrated successes together and taken the team forward. Both partners today are stronger than at the outset of our joint venture and are thus equipped for the future. What that future will look like will be decided over the next weeks. Irrespective of that decision, we are concentrating on the current season. We still have quite a few goals for this year and we will apply all our powers and professionalism to implement them together with WilliamsF1."

#### Presentation at the start of 2006

In parallel with that, based on the Board's decision, the new structure with managerial and key positions, including the driver line-up, and the name of the new team will be worked out by the takeover date of 1st January 2006. Development of resources is being driven forward with urgency and immediate effect.

The team will present itself to the public at the beginning of 2006. The factory in Hinwil will continue to be operated as a legally independent Swiss company linked to BMW Motorsport.

The expansion of BMW's Formula One involvement will not impinge on other BMW motor sport projects. In future, BMW will continue its commitment to touring car racing—both in the new World Touring Car Championship (FIA WTCC) and in leading individual events such as 24-hour races. Formula BMW with its four series in Asia, Britain, Germany and North America will also continue. This year it will feature a world final for the first time.

Peter Sauber: "For Sauber, the partnership with BMW is an ideal solution as it supports the two goals which have always been paramount for me: firstly, to offer the team the possibility of improving their sporting performance, and secondly, to safeguard the site at Hinwil and the jobs of today's 300-strong workforce.

The involvement of six car manufacturers has resulted in significant changes to Formula One in recent years. For the private teams in particular it has become increasingly difficult to secure the kind of solid financing that will also allow for sporting success. For some years I have also been thinking in terms of succession planning—in the light of the very specific demands of Formula One that is no easy matter.

The partnership with BMW guarantees continuity. For that reason, too, it represents an ideal solution, because I know it will give the workforce a very good outlook. Over more than 35 years, I have guided this company through often stormy seas, which is why it is so important for me to know that it will be in good hands in future as well."

The new partnership is also made possible by Credit Suisse, which over the next three years will successively sell

off its shares in Sauber Holding AG to BMW as well. Credit Suisse took over these shares in 2002 with a view to placing them with suitable investors in due course.

Urs Rohner, Member of the Executive Board of Credit Suisse Group, comments: "We are looking forward to working with BMW. What you associate with BMW and Sauber are, on the one hand, longstanding experience in motor racing and, on the other, efficiency and dedication. That creates an ideal basis for a successful team. Credit Suisse, moreover, will be an Official Partner of the team for the next three years."

#### Background

#### BMW Motorsport:

Generating innovative technology for sporting contests and record attempts has always been part of BMW's identity. After world records and championship titles with aero-engines and motorcycles, a one-two win in the 1940 Mille Miglia marked one of the first international touring car successes with the BMW 328. In post-war Germany, motorcycling ace Schorsch Meier became a national hero on BMW's flat-twin Boxers.

Since 1966, BMW has earned 24 FIA-approved titles in touring car racing alone—both European Championship and World Championship titles. The national titles accumulated by BMW drivers are numberless. The winning cars: BMW 1800Ti, 2002Ti, 2002, 3.0 CSL, 320, 635CSi, 528i, M3 and 320i. Up to and including 1992, BMW M3 drivers secured more than 1,500 individual wins and 50 titles. From 1993 to 1998, 29 championship titles were won around the globe with the BMW 320i. In 2001, the FIA once again sanctioned a European title for touring car racing, which was promptly claimed by the BMW 320i. In 2003, BMW won the Manufacturers' title in the FIA European Touring Car Championship (ETCC) and successfully defended it in 2004 as well as winning the Drivers' title. In 2005, BMW is competing in the FIA Touring Car World Championship (FIA WTCC) with the 320i.

With a total of 18 overall wins, BMW is by far the most successful manufacturer in the 24-hour races on the Nürburgring. Beyond that, BMW has won the 24 Hours of Spa 21 times. In 1999 it claimed overall victory in the Le Mans 24 Hours with the BMW V12 LMR.

Building on ten years' experience of junior talent promotion, BMW Motorsport took an ultra-modern vehicle to the grid for the 2002 season—the Formula BMW. In conjunction with a unique Education and Coaching Program, the Formula BMW championships in Asia, Britain, Germany and North continued on next page

America have established themselves as the international benchmark.

In Formula 2, a BMW four-cylinder engine was the yardstick during the period from 1973 to 1982, taking six drivers to a European Championship title. In 1980, BMW announced its first Formula One involvement. Paul Rosche took a production four-cylinder engine block and turned it into a 16-valve turbo unit reduced to 1.5 liters, which by the end of its career had an output of around 1,400 bhp. On 23rd January 1982, Nelson Piquet lined up on the grid at Kyalami, South Africa, in a Brabham BMW, and in June the Brazilian took his first GP victory in Montreal. In 1983 he became World Champion. The ninth and final BMW turbo victory was claimed in Mexico in 1986 by Gerhard Berger in a Benetton BMW. At the end of 1987, BMW halted its F1 engine production. New regulations had come into force and the era of sheer turbo power was over.

In 1997 BMW announced it would return to Formula One in 2000—with a three-liter normally aspirated V10 engine and with WilliamsF1 as its partner. It turned out a textbook comeback: third in the World Championship in the debut season, second in 2002, and a title contender right up to the final in 2003. 2004 proved a lean year, with no victory forthcoming until the final race. The BMW Formula One engines were designed and built in Munich from the outset and, including BMW's own engine management system and foundry, and in close alliance with the BMW Research and Innovation Centre. BMW's Formula One division currently employs 300 staff. BMW Motorsport has a workforce of 350.

#### Sauber Motorsport AG:

Peter Sauber founded PP Sauber AG, later renamed Sauber Motorsport AG, in Hinwil in 1970. In the early years, the qualified electrical fitter built competition sports cars for entry in the national car championship. The Swiss racing team first attracted international attention in 1976 when Herbert Müller gained overall victory in the European Interseries driving a Sauber BMW C5.

In the mid-1980s, Sauber became the Mercedes-Benz works team for the World Sports Car Championship. The climax of this partnership was a one-two win in Le Mans in 1989 and two successive titles in the World Sports Car Championship (1989, 1990).

In 1993 Sauber moved up to Formula One and managed to gain two world championship points in the very first race, the South African GP in Kyalami. SAUBER PETRONAS emerged as one of the most successful private teams, claiming a total of six podium places. In 2001 the Swiss team came fourth in the Constructors' Championship. MSR

ince you can get far more detailed and accurate coverage of the actual race from about 76,000 enthusiast web sites, this article is more along the lines of a bunch of loosely organized thoughts about and impressions of a fan's first Formula 1 race.

First: The sound. TV doesn't convey it. It's loud. OK, it's more than loud; it's full-body physical assault. But sheer volume isn't the only reason no home theatre system can ever do it justice. If you have enough wattage, that 19,000 RPM shriek at the end of the straight would come through well enough, but there are gut-churning, sub-sonic components that get lost. The downshifts are like getting cuffed upside the head by an orangutan and 12,000 RPM backfiring when the traction control kicks in is a continuous peal of thunder.

Next, the speed — 190 MPH on TV looks pretty fast. When you're 40 feet away, you realize its crazy fast. If you're near the fence, the only cars that are recognizable are the Ferraris (they're red) and the Jordan's (yellow). The acceleration out of a corner is awe-inspiring, and the braking is unearthly. Our seats overlooked turns 6 (a 2<sup>nd</sup> gear left-hander) and 7 (2<sup>nd</sup> gear right hander). We'd see the cars come down the straight towards us at about 160MPH, and appear to instantaneously knock 100MPH off to make the turn. Coming out of 7, I'd swear they were rippling the asphalt as they were doing their best Millinium Falcon imitation.

You also realize how had those guys are working. As they're braking, you can see the car hunting and squirming around, as if it's saying, "yeah bucko, you better hold that wheel straight, or I'm gonna pirouette on ya." They don't corner like they're on rails, either. You can see the front wheels sawing back and forth as the driver looks for the edge of understeer. When they get back on the throttle, the tail end gets just a little sideways, even with all those traction control CPU cycles trying to keep the rear tires somewhat in check. Not surprisingly, the really fast guys (Schumacher, Alonso, Raikkonen) look a lot less dramatic than some of the others. And should a tire lock up on braking you see a big puff of smoke as everyone in the stands groans.

Speaking of fan reactions, M. Schumacher is not universally adored. Before the race, the drivers were paraded around each sitting up in an Austin-Healy (a side note, just as I was thinking to myself "How are they going to get 20 Austin-Healys to run at the same time?" The car Barichello was supposed to ride in failed to start). As Schumacher went by, the crowd was evenly split between the applauders and the boo-ers.

The supporting races are fun too. The F1 cars are totally awesome, but on another planet from anything I'm ever likely to drive. If I got behind the wheel of one, I'd be lucky to make it to the first turn before I kissed a wall. Now the Formula BMW cars... I'd give one a shot. Those guys were a hoot - they went at it like maniacs. There was at least one spin somewhere on the track every lap. It was interesting to contrast the lines from our vantage point. Most of the drivers were taking a similar line to the F1 guys - try to keep the speed up through 6 by bouncing over the curb, lift a touch

and turn into 7. The 1st and 2nd place guys realized that doing so upset the car, and left it rotated a little to the left at the entrance to 7. And the cars didn't have the down force or power to make up for it. So, they'd come into 6 a hair slower, and take a slightly longer line, just touching the curb. That had 'em pointing into 7 at a better angle, and they'd be on the power as they were turning in - almost a car length ahead of where the "bang over the curbing" guys could get on it. A classic case of sacrificing the first turn of a combination to maximize your exit speed at the end. Oh yeah - Formula BMW best lap was 1:47. The F1 guys were running 1:15. Shows you what 8x the power will do.

I do know the job I want. I want to be the guy who drives the pace car. When you see it on TV, it doesn't look like he's doing anything impressive, but since those F1 cars don't like going slow, they tell him to HAUL. Yes, it's an AMG Mercedes, not a Bimmer, but I'd suffer.

What would I do different next time? Bring a portable radio with ear buds, as the commentary on the PA sounded like this, "And we see that...BWAAAAAH-POP-POP-PO Fisichell...BWAAAAAH...pit strategy...BWAAAAAAAAAAAAH!" I'd also bring more water. It was in the mid 90s, and the stand we were in faced south. But it was worth it. MSR

# BMW Team PTG M3s Finish 1-2 in Brumos Porsche 250 Hand and Marks Score 50th Win for M3 Racing Program, Auberlen and Milner Second

DAYTONA BEACH, FLA. - JUNE 30, 2005... Joey Hand and Justin Marks, driving the No. 16 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3 led a 1-2 BMW M3 GT-class finish in tonight's Brumos Porsche 250 to score the team's fourth win of the season and the 50th victory of BMW of North America's M3 racing program. Having to start at the rear of the 28-car GT field because of an engine change, they completed 67 laps of Daytona International Speedway's road course in the twohour-and-forty-five-minute contest, finishing four seconds ahead of the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3 of Bill Auberlen and Tom Milner.

The No. 17 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3 of Kelly Collins and RJ Valentine finished eighth, completing 66 laps. The No. 22 BMW Team PTG M3 of Chris Gleason and Ian James was involved in an accident and did not finish.

The win consolidates BMW's second place position in Manufacturer points, moving seven points closer to first. Hand and Marks move to third and eighth respectively in Driver points.

The race began under dry skies although the track was still slick in spots from a heavy afternoon downpour. The No. 16 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3 of Justin Marks and Joey Hand enjoyed a trouble free race after losing an engine in qualifying. Required to start at the rear of the field after the engine



change, Marks stood in third position at the end of the first hour. Hand guickly took over the second position, but the race was not decided until five laps from the finish when the No. 14 Porsche had to pit for fuel. Turning his fastest lap of the race on lap 62, Hand kept the No. 16 M3 in the lead for BMW Team PTG's fourth win of the season.

Tom Milner moved the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3 forward from his fourth starting position. By lap seven he was in second and Auberlen inherited the lead on lap 22 after Milner pitted during the race's first caution period. Just before the green flag flew, the No. 26 Porsche hit the left front of the No. 21 M3, spinning Auberlen into the wall. After a quick pit stop, he rejoined the race in fifth. The experienced veteran was able to drive through front end damage to finish second.

Round eight of the Rolex Sports Car Series, The Porsche 250, will take place on July 31st at Barber Motorsports Park. The race is scheduled to be televised live on Speed Channel beginning at 1:00 p.m. ET.

JUSTIN MARKS, DRIVER NO. 16 BMW TEAM PTG F1 AIR M3 (first): "I won here last year so this is a very special race for me. To win again, and win the 50th for PTG, is awesome. I can't believe how hard the team worked to change the engine and give us a perfect M3 for the race."

JOEY HAND, DRIVER NO. 16 BMW TEAM PTG M3 (first): "Justin and I only got three laps each in practice and not one in gualifying. Justin had to start the race without even an installation lap on the new engine and he did a great job. At the end of the race I heard over the radio that I was only 14 seconds from the leader so I just stood on the throttle."

BILL AUBERLEN, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3 (second): "I can't believe I was hit before the green came out. Before that the No. 21 M3 was awesome. Dave Gahagan (No. 21 car chief) always gets it right on the mark for the race. He made one change before the race that was right on. After I was pushed into the wall, it was all I could do to hold the car straight."

TOM MILNER, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG M3 (second): "I couldn't be happier for the team. We got lucky at the end, but we were there to take advantage and gain second place. You can feel PTG's momentum growing again. We'll be back on top of the podium before you know it."

TOM MILNER, OWNER BMW TEAM PTG: "We can't get much luckier than we did today. Bill was almost taken out of the race, but came back for second. Joey and Justin did a great job to come from the back to win. Everyone worked hard and I am proud that we could deliver the 50th win for BMW of North America's M3 racing program."

LARRY KOCH, BMW OF NORTH AMERICA MOTORSPORTS MANAGER: "About midway through the race it looked like it was not going to be our day. We lost the No. 22 car and things were starting to look down, but PTG is never down for long. A 1-2 BMW M3 finish is a great way to win the 50th of our program." MSR

#### A MEETING OF THE BMW CCA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Was held June 3-5, 2004 in Portland, OR. The minutes are out to the Board for approval and will be posted to the website as soon as they have been approved.

Because the club's rumor-mill seemed to have been working at double time prior to the meeting, Scott Blazey began by reading the following statement into the record:

"I would like to take this opportunity to make a statement for the record concerning the timing, location, and purpose of this Board meeting. I consider this necessary because in recent weeks I have read and heard some incorrect information.

First, the location: We rotate the locations of our meetings so that members of our Board have some variety in travel time; so that the same members aren't traveling the longest distances for every meeting. We also like to give members around the country the opportunity to meet their elected representatives and see how we conduct our meetings. Finally, visiting different areas gives the Board insights on the advantages of holding regional or national events in those areas. At our previous Board meeting in March we decided to hold the June meeting in the Pacific Northwest, since it is a nice area and we have some great members here. Seattle was one option, and we had a great experience meeting many of the Puget Sound Chapter members when we held our meeting there in 2001. We opted for Portland because we had not yet had a Board meeting in this city, and we knew there were some enthusiastic BMW CCA members in this area and we always like to meet enthusiastic members. We had received some inquiries from local members about forming a BMW CCA chapter in Oregon or the Portland area, and as volunteers are the heart of any chapter, it might be an opportunity to meet some potential chapter volunteers and maybe answer some of their questions firsthand.

I would like to address some of the rumors or incorrect information I have heard recently. First, it is not now, nor has it been our intention to seek or initiate a merger with the Portland Chapter of the BMW ACA. They are an independent, unaffiliated BMW club and we have no designs on their organization. As fellow BMW enthusiasts, I wish them well. As a courtesy to them since we are meeting in their area, I extended by e-mail to their President an invitation to attend our Board meeting and to be our guest at dinner. It was an invitation to socialize, not an invitation to merge.

I would also like to emphasize to the members of our Puget Sound Chapter, that the BMW CCA Board is not initiating an action to split the Puget Sound Chapter. That is neither our prerogative nor our place. When we receive inquiries from local members about forming a chapter, we provide them with information about the procedures. Our Regional Vice Presidents are charged with assisting in the formation of new chapters once enough members meet the prerequisites. The Pacific Region has a great Regional Vice President. Eddy Funahashi cares about all his chapters and I've known him to always work for what's best for everyone.

Finally, I'd like to go on record to dispel some misinformation that at least a few people have about BMW CCA. First, we do not require that our members own BMWs. We are a BMW enthusiasts' club, not a BMW owners' club. Second, BMW CCA does not restrict our driving events to BMWs only. Chapters are free to place restrictions on the brands of cars they allow into any of their events, but BMW CCA, the national organization, does not.

Finally, I want to reiterate that what is important to us on the Board is that our BMW CCA members are getting a good value for their dues, that they have every opportunity to enjoy the camaraderie and events with other Club members, and

that Club is doing the kinds of things that will make BMW enthusiasts want to join us."

Later in the day the guests in attendance were offered the opportunity comment or asked questions of the Board. Doug Goodrum, President of the Portland ACA, took the opportunity to discuss their Chapter's history regarding membership in BMW CCA.

Their Chapter has reviewed the issue frequently over the years, most recently in 2000. They always came to the conclusion that it would not be financially beneficial and there it would require additional administrative resources. They have recently created a committee to revisit the issue again.

Having read a recent draft of the BMW CCA operations manual Doug had several questions and a discussion ensued covering some of the driving school minimum standards, insurance costs, membership dues, and member services and benefits.

Doug observed that with the new understanding there was enough apparent common ground to continue their review. Eddie Funahashi and Wynne Smith will be their point of contact for additional exchange of information.

Scott Blazey also presented a **proposed by-law change**. The goal of the change would be to allow the Club the flexibility to modify its organizational and membership structure to allow for non-geographic-based chapters. This would further the strategic objectives of growing the club and providing a home for BMW enthusiasts, including those enthusiasts whose interest is mainly expressed through non-traditional – usually electronic – means. The Board had only minor changes to the proposed language. Scott Blazey will discuss the background and thrust of these changes in an upcoming President's column in Roundel and then they will be put on the ballot in January 2006 for membership approval.

Sunday morning the Board revisited the club's strategic plan and discussed the Strategic Decision to Expand and improve events and programs.

The objective of this part of the plan is to develop an optimal mix of national and regional events and programs that meet the needs of our members. We are working to develop a mission statement for all national and regional events, to better to foster wider diversity and greater inclusiveness.

In that context, Mark Jon Calabrese will host a meeting with SIG groups to discuss how the club can work together with the SIGs to grow their events and improve our events.







# When Good Dogs Are Bad!

'm usually the last to admit to my own stupidity but I recently had an incident that has to be one of the stupidest things I have done. Looking back I can laugh, just like those that witnessed the whole event were doing.

A couple of weeks back my wife and I took a short road trip east to Toledo Bend. We had decided that on this trip that both of our dogs would be traveling with us. Our lodging in Toledo Bend allowed dogs to stay and so I made the proper adjustments to the shop wagon (540 touring) to take both Jesse and Beemer, our dogs, along with us. Those of you, who have been to the shop, are familiar with both of my 4 legged employees/shop dogs. Both are harmless, although Jesse thinks she's ferocious, and usually encourages Beemer to get involved. Both are great dogs that have mixed backgrounds. Jessie is a lab/rottie mix and has the best of both in her personality and Beemer is what I like to call a "happy dog"! Beemer found us a year or so after we opened the shop and adopted us. Since I spent a considerable amount of money at the veterinary to clean him up, get his shots and emasculate him, he has become my shadow. He is happy to be along wherever I go. Both are large dogs, approximately 70 Ibs each and both are an Irish setter red in color (you would swear they are related). Of the two, Jesse is the more intelligent. My wife tells me that it's because we've had her since she was a puppy and has had a better upbringing. She might be right or Beemer may just be a little thick between the ears.

But what he lacks in smarts he makes up for in personality and affection.

Getting back to our trip.. We left at 6:30 p.m. on a Saturday and it should have been uneventful for the entire 4 or so hours and if it had, I wouldn't be writing about it. We were about an hour or so east of Dallas, headed east on I-20 when a gentleman driving a pickup truck about 4 or 5 car links ahead of us lost control of his truck at about 80 MPH. Along with flipping and rolling his vehicle he made contact with an older Corvette which immediately brought all east bound traffic to a standstill. The pick-up truck came to a rest with the bottom of the truck/undercarriage facing eastbound traffic across part of both lanes leaving only the right shoulder to get by. The left shoulder contained the Vette that was involved in the accident. My shop wagon has many emergency lights installed in it that very rarely get used (more of a marketing/promotional tool) but under the circumstances I figured it would be a good idea. We were stopped in the passing lane with only one car in front of us that was about to move on, so on went the flashers, emergency lights and rear directional flashers to hopefully keep this night time accident from causing anymore. I figured as soon as emergency services or the troopers showed up we could move on.

After setting the parking brake Patricia and I decided we would go check on the accident victims and make sure that the other people that had stopped had it under control. Plus

I figured I would make sure that the truck that was lying on its side wasn't leaking anything flammable. (Here comes the stupidest thing I could have done) So with the car running (AC on for the dogs) we exited the car and approached the accident. Patricia went towards the Vette to check on the young woman and her little boy who were in it, and I headed for the truck on its side.

The just off of work construction worker was pinned in his pick-up but was not in any danger at the moment and did not appear to have any major injuries. But his tools (power and hand), tool boxes, extension cords and various other construction needs were scattered over about 40-50 yards and with how dark it was you couldn't see them very well. So I figured while we were waiting for the emergency workers to show up I would walk back to the Touring and get a flash light and collect the tools of this guys trade and pile them up in one place.

I get back to the Touring and pull the handle... Beemer is sitting in the passenger front seat and in the process of jumping from the back of the vehicle to the front he has stepped on the door locks and locked the car, with it running. No problem Patricia is out of the car and will have her keys..., wrong. Her keys are in her purse in the car, that is locked, with both of my dogs inside, running, with all of the keys locked up for safe keeping. Sweat is now forming on the window where the AC is hitting them because I'm sure it's nice and cool in there. And no matter what we do, we can't get Beemer to step on the lock button again. By now all of the emergency vehicles are showing up. And would you believe that with 4 troopers, two fire trucks, two ambulances and two wreckers not one has a coat hanger. Although the wrecker driver had a long rod that he wanted to shove between the door and jamb to reach the unlock button. I had limited choices at this point and it was looking like a brick was going to be the answer. I had a thought though and it was an outside chance but I needed a hanger. Patricia found the antenna that had broken off of the truck that was overturned and I fashioned a hook like shape in it, which isn't easy with an auto antenna and no tools (if I could only get to the tools in the Touring). I pulled the rear plastic license plate and holder, installed behind the license plate on US Tourings, are the studs that hold the plate holder to the body of the rear door, there are holes that come in close proximity of the emergency trunk lid release. After a few minutes of finagling I was able to snag it and maneuver it in such a way as to release the latch on the rear hatch. And presto, an hour after being locked out, we were no longer locked out.

By this time some of the emergency vehicles were actually leaving. The Texas State Troopers that were aware of our situation were quite amused and I'm sure it's a story they now tell often. And honestly I think it's funny at this point also. Needless to say, the dogs, or more specifically Beemer no longer gets to sit in a running car when a human isn't present. And I have learned how to break into my own car, so if my good dog is ever bad again, at least I can get back into my car. Drive Hard, Be Safe... MSR





# **BMW Group Reports First-Half Sales for 2005**


WOODCLIFF LAKE, NJ - July 1, 2005... The BMW Group (BMW and MINI brands combined) reported year-to-date sales of 144,843 vehicles, a slight increase (0.8 percent) compared to the 143,646 vehicles sold in the first half of 2004. The BMW Group also reported June sales of 26,999 vehicles, a decrease of 3.3 percent from the 27,909 vehicles sold in the same month of 2004.

#### **BMW Brand Reports Sales**

BMW of North America, LLC reported a 6.5 percent decrease in June sales of automobiles and Sports Activity Vehicles, to 23,392 vehicles compared to the 25,013 reported in the same month last year. Demand for the allnew 2006 3 Series, which went on sale May 6th, is robust but inventory remains low as the company builds production capacity of its highest-volume model.

Year-to-date, sales of BMW brand vehicles were down slightly (2.4 percent) from last year, for sales of 122,864 vehicles compared to 125,834 vehicles sold in first six months of 2004.

"This year is one of transition for the BMW brand in the U.S., with 60 percent of its products affected. In the past few months, we've introduced all-new 2006 3 Series sedans, just voted "America's Best New Sedan" by readers of AutoWeek. The planned changeover has gone extremely well, and we're



delighted with the strong customer demand for the new 3 Series, and the accolades from the automotive press," explained Tom Purves, chairman and CEO of BMW in the U.S.

"Later this year," he continued, "BMW will introduce more 3 Series variants — a new sports wagon and all-wheel-drive models."

The launch of the new 3 Series sedans is the highestvolume introduction, but other important new models have been introduced this past spring - the 2006 5 Series sports wagons and all-wheel-drive models. The new 2006 7 Series also went on sale this past spring, with new engines and fresh design updates.

The new product introductions will continue this fall, with the new 2006 M5 and the 2006 550i sedan, powered by a new V-8 engine.

"We are on track to end the year with another record sales performance," Purves said.

#### **BMW Automobile Sales**

BMW's June automobile sales were 17,456 cars, a 1 percent dip versus 17,710 cars sold in the same month a year ago. Year-to-date, sales were down 7 percent, to 90,597 automobiles compared to 97,606 in the same period a year ago.

#### **BMW Sports Activity Vehicle Sales**

SAV sales were down 19 percent in June for 5,936 vehicles, compared to 7,303 vehicles sold in the same month of 2004. Year-to-date, sales of BMW's two SAV models are up 14 percent, to 32,267 vehicles compared to 28,228 in the same period of 2004.

#### Certified Pre-owned

BMW also reported its strongest June ever for sales of Certified Pre-owned BMWs. Monthly sales of Certified Preowned vehicles were 6,483, up 6 percent over the 6,110 vehicles sold in the same month last year. Year-to-date, BMW CPO sales were up almost 2 percent, for 36,412 vehicles over 35,855 in the same period a year ago.

#### **MINI** Automobiles

Strong demand for MINI brand automobiles continued in June. MINI USA reported that June 2005 sales increased 25 percent, with 3,607 cars compared to 2,896 sold a year ago. Sales of MINI automobiles in the first six months of 2005 are up 23 percent with sales of 21,979 cars over the 17,812 cars reported in 2004.
