BMW Continues to have Great News! Rewards Program Extended

Looking to purchase a new BMW? You're in luck. BMW CCA has extended the Rewards Program through December 31, 2005; all vehicles qualify except the Z8. Check it out in your monthly *Roundel* or the BMW CCA website at http://www.bmwcca.org/services/svcfset.shtml The basic guidelines remain the same – one must be a member in good standing of the BMW CCA for at least one year continuously prior to purchasing your vehicle (please do not contact BMW CCA about back dating memberships, they will not wavier on this issue), and one must file the documentation within 60 days of taking delivery of the vehicle. We have not received the updated forms yet, but understand that BMW NA has also included the Z4 in the program. Anyone purchasing a Z4 after January 1, 2005—and fulfilling the other program requirements—can apply for the rebate.

Matt's Laguna Seca Blue M3 with black Kidney and side grills

Our September **Car of the Month** comes to you from Erie, Colorado belonging to Matt Puccio, Matt writes:

y current BMW is somewhat of a compulsion – nay, a sickness. For several years I owned a 2001 330ci which I bought used in 2002. I'm not sure when the bug bit me, but within a year I wanted something more. Not that I knew how to use it – the autocross and driving events that year surely taught me that. But the poison was in my veins and the only antidote had 333 hp and came in Laguna Seca Blue.

My particular brand of poison took me a few months to find. I started looking in June of 2004, right about the time early E46 M3s were coming off lease. When I started looking last summer, there was literally a glut of Laguna

Seca Blue (LSB) 2001 M3s on the market, so I had a lot to choose from. Not that I wanted a leased car – far from it, who knows how such an unfortunate car was flogged by its over-zealous owner.

Don't tell my current car, but I even considered the various metallic grey colors (although silver, being the color of my 330ci, was right out). During my search I had become enamored with LSB. As it turns out, many of the early E46 M3s the dealers received were LSB, most of which were demo or press cars. At any rate, I found a large number of them for sale on the web, and finally found one in Wichita, Kansas that had the mileage and price range I was looking for.

A Club member referred me to a gentleman in Wichita who was the safety steward for the Kansas City chapter.

He graciously agreed to inspect, and test drive the car, he reported back that it looked in great shape. I suddenly found myself in a rental car driving across Kansas toward the cure for what ailed me. The next morning I woke early and could fairly smell the LSB paint from across town.

After having the car checked out by a local independent BMW shop and proclaimed her in good health. I found myself drooling over the bulging power dome of the hood, smooth grey leather interior, and dual exhaust tips...ah. Before I knew it I found myself doing something SLIGHTLY over the speed limit on I-70 back toward Denver, grinning like a fool each time I was mysteriously compelled to pass a semi, minivan, or late-model Honda. Yes, the LSB paint was flowing through my veins now, and there was nothing to stop it.

The car was a dealer demo, production date 02/13/2001. She came fully loaded with luxury package, 6CD changer, cold weather package, xenon's, upgraded stereo – pretty much everything, as most demo cars were spec'ed. After some research I've since discovered that she is a VERY early production car – according to one internet source regular production started on 2/12/2001 and her VIN proves that she is within the first 300 of the public production run. Whether this is a good thing or not is still up in the air, but so far she's turned out to be without any extraordinary problems. She avoided the first rod bearing service action which affected the October 2001 cars on. She did get caught in the recent recall that affected most all of the E46 M3s. She's been in for a few other minor issues, mostly cosmetic in nature. Overall she's had fewer problems than the 330ci of the same vintage.

Since getting the car I have done a number of primarily cosmetic mods to her. I've eliminated most of the chrome and amber plastic parts on her exterior. She now sports black side gills, body-colored bumper reflectors, and black kidney grills with body-colored surrounds. Silver vision bulbs replace the stock amber. Body-colored Hamann fog light ducts complete

the front end. An AC Schnitzer roof spoiler balances the back. A wonderful piece of technology from Valentine keeps a watchful eye out the front windscreen. A UUC short shift kit smoothes out her shifting, and 18 inch SSR GT3 wheels support her. A pair of Schroth clip-in harnesses is fitted during track events and a number of other interior touches have been added, such as a UUC shift knob, e-brake handle, and Alcantara shift and ebrake boots. Her next "real" mod will probably be a suspension

upgrade, although for my level of expertise she is already more than enough for me to handle.

Perhaps my favorite non-driving modification is the Dension ICELink iPod adapter. Connected in place of the CD changer, this allows me to have my entire library of music onboard, and controllable from the steering wheel. Hidden inside a stealth euro-tray in the center console, 20 gigabytes of music is enough to get you across the country (several times, at that) and pops easily out of the car to take with me.



Laguna Seca Blue is certainly a color you either love or hate. My dad thought I was insane to buy a car this color. But on the other hand, I've had many people stop me and ask "What color is that?" and compliment it – everyone from the neighborhood kids ("your car is cool!") to a construction worker ("that color is awesome") during stop-and-go traffic. And ultimately, what's important is that stomping on the gas (er, Mark, what I really just said was "smoothly but briskly accelerating") brings a grin to my face. And walking out to the garage to see the LSB paint gleaming in the Zaino-scented morning air sure helps get me motivated on those days when I'm not looking forward to making the commute.

Mini Performs Hollywood Stunts On High-Speed Roller Coaster

The Italian Job(TM) Stunt Track Opens at Paramount's Kings Island

CINCINNATI, OHIO - May 19th, 2005... MINI is once again the star in a Hollywood spectacular that comes to life with the debut of Paramount's The Italian Job^(TM): Stunt Track. This new fast-track-roller coaster experience opens May 20, 2005 at Kings Island theme park and is the first time MINI is featured on a roller coaster of this caliber. The Italian Job^(TM) Stunt Track also debuts in Toronto at Paramount Parks Canada's Wonderland Park.

Based on the high-action finale of Paramount Pictures' The Italian Job (2003) starring Mark Wahlberg and Charlize Theron, the new ride takes visitors on a high-speed stunt car adventure through movie sets and scenes inspired by the film's climatic chase sequence.

Park visitors will experience what it's like to be a Hollywood stunt driver behind the scenes of an action movie. Riders board their very own MINI Cooper S, each one realistically modeled as a 75% scale replica of the red, white or blue MINI Cooper S's that saved the day in the hit film. The MINIs are tricked out with working headlights and sophisticated audio special effects, creating an exciting, multi-sensory experience.



Once riders are strapped into their custom stunt car, the rubber meets the road as the three MINIs peel out to begin their chase sequence. The MINIs twist through a parking garage, dodge near-collisions, race down stairs, chase through tunnels and narrowly escape massive explosions triggered by gunfire from a menacing helicopter. Tires skid out one last time as the stunt cars crash through a billboard and splash down into a Los Angeles aqueduct concluding the chase sequence and the riders' screen test trial as a stunt driver.

Designed to provide 800 riders per hour with an extreme MINI adventure, the cars reach speeds of 40 miles per hour. Riders embark on a two-minute thrill ride that speeds them on 2,000 feet of track through 53 feet of elevation change and around turns banked up to 88 degrees. The ride is expected to attract close to 1 million riders per year.

The multi-million dollar roller coaster took a year of planning and six months to build. Paramount's engineers received technical advice from MINI to help replicate the legendary

handling of the MINI Cooper S. Each car on the ride has also been engineered with a feature that simulates an expertly executed parking brake slide.



The Italian Job film – a MINI blockbuster

The Italian Job film was released in 2003 and earned nearly 100 million dollars in the US alone. The film was inspired by Paramount's 1969 release of the first Italian Job film, starring Michael Cain and-of course—three red, white and blue Minis. Fans of Mini and the 1969 film have since propelled the movie into cult status.

With the highly anticipated launch of MINI in 2001, interest in recreating the action-pack thriller

was a natural. MINI partnered with Paramount in 2002 for the filming of the movie and provided 32 cars to create the hair-raising chase scenes. Three MINIs were even converted to be electrically powered for filming the rather tricky tunnel scenes. MSR

Hungarian Grand Prix - Race July 31, 2005

Weather: Sunny, dry. Temp: Air 34-35 °C, Track 44-47°C

Budapest (HUN) On an extraordinarily hot day at the Hungaroring, both the BMW WilliamsF1 team drivers made the best out of their race and scored some valuable points. Nick Heidfeld finished 6th and Mark Webber 7th having started 12th and 16th respectively.

Nick Heidfeld: 6th Best time: 1:22.053 (lap 53, 6th overall) Chassis: FW27 03 / BMW P84/5 Engine: 1st GP

The initial start was poor, a lot of cars went by but I made a good move under braking into the first two corners and gained a lot of positions there. After that I had big problems in the first stint. I had to turn down the engine power to the lowest settings we had because our temperatures increased after my car picked up some debris from the track. The balance of the car wasn't perfect but still quite good. I caught Button up after the 2nd stop but it is too difficult to pass here. Overall I am very happy with today's result, especially because I have collected some points.

Mark Webber: 7th Best time: 1:22.453 (lap 47, 9th overall) Chassis: FW27 04 (T-Car FW27 06) / BMW P84/5 Engine: 1st GP

I started on the dirty side of the track which wasn't ideal at this place but then I had a fairly good race. Collecting some points today was really good. Also it's a good moral booster for everyone who works flat out back at the factory; finally we had some good news for them too.

Sam Michael (Technical Director, WilliamsF1):

We are definitely making progress on the car. We did not choose the best pit stop strategy - Nick should have done a 3 stop, Mark was okay on a 2 stop due to his earlier qualifying yesterday. We went longer than anybody else before the first stop, so we had the most fuel on board in qualifying. On Nick's car we had to turn the engine down during the entire first stint due to some debris in the water radiator duct, which was removed at the 1st pit stop. Most encouraging is the pace improvement of the car. We have been running within 0.8 seconds of the fastest cars on this maximum downforce circuit. Well done to the people who have worked so hard in Grove to contribute to improving the car, we look forward to more.

Mario Theissen (BMW Motorsport Director):

We should be satisfied having collected some points after starting from positions 12 and 16. The race gave the explanation for our qualifying positions, since our drivers had the highest fuel load. Still, in the race they were able to climb up the field. Nick had a problem with the engine water temperature because after the hectic first lap he picked up some debris and partly closed the airflow of the radiator. This forced Nick to race at lowered power until his first pit-stop, when the airflow was cleared. Apart from that, both the drivers didn't experience any problems.

Hand and Marks Drive BMW M3 to Porsche 250 Victory

BMW Team PTG M3s Finish 1st, 3rd, 6th & 7th

BIRMINGHAM, ALA. – JULY 31, 2005... Joey Hand and Justin Marks, driving the No. 16 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3, put on their own driving clinic in winning the GT class in today's Porsche 250 at Barber Motorsports Park. The win was the second consecutive victory for the duo and the 51st for BMW of North America's M3 racing program. The victory was the fourth of the season for Hand and third of the season for Marks. They completed 89 laps in the two hour-and-forty-five-minute contest, finishing less than one second ahead of the No. 80 Porsche. Winning from the pole, they also collect an \$8000.00 Acxiom GT bonus.


Hand moves into a tie for second in Driver Points and Marks moves to fourth. BMW consolidates its hold on second in Manufacturer Points, gaining three points on first.

lan James and Chris Gleason, driving the No. 22 BMW Team PTG M3, finished third. Kelly Collins and RJ Valentine, driving the No. 17 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3, finished sixth and Tom Milner and Bill Auberlen, driving the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3 finished seventh.

The race began under bright sunshine and Marks, making a great start from the pole, immediately took control of the 26-car GT field. Kelly Collins, in the No. 17 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3, and Ian James, in the No. 22 BMW Team PTG M3, took the second and third positions. Tom Milner, in the No. 21 BMW Team PTG M3, followed in fifth.

The four M3s continued to lap smoothly at the front of the field for the opening hour of the race. Only Milner's No. 21 M3 ran into a problem with a spinning competitor causing moderate damage to the front of the No. 21 M3. Marks stayed out front until almost the one-and-one-half hour mark when he pitted under the fifth caution period of the race. Hand entered the M3 on lap 43, in the third position. As a light rain began to fall in closing minutes of the race, Hand took over second from the No. 22 M3 and proceeded to chase down the leader. In the last five minutes of the race he took the lead for the win. James, back in the No. 22 M3 after Gleason's middle-stint, held the third position at the checkered flag. Two laps behind Hand and Marks, Collins brought the No. 17 M3 home sixth. Auberlen finished seventh in the No. 21 M3.


Fall Fun Run: Saturday, October 15, 2005 (no points, just for fun!)

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



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

A Colorado Holiday by Rick Meinig

The BMW Vintage & Classic Car Club of America Tour of the Rockies

ULY 5-10, 2005. The clink of toasting wine glasses echoed in the air as the first whispers of a Colorado escapade circulated among the tables. The setting was the closing banquet of the 2004 Vintage Marathon in Spartanburg, SC. Spirits bordered on elation. The inaugural event of the fledgling BMW Vintage Marathon and Classic Club was an unqualified success. For two weeks in September 2004, 75 years of Munich heritage traversed the East Coast—from the New England seashore to hurricane battered Appalachia! Cars were as old as the Dixie and as new as the Z1. Participants came from Germany, Holland, UK, Switzerland, and the US. The event was an epiphany for most of us first-time participants. It is more common in Europe as a result of geography, vintage car density, and a Teutonic proclivity for organization to see large scale events featuring "Old-timer Cars" on the road. The American model tends more toward car shows and boulevard cruises than arduous road tours. For US vintage and classic BMWs, the concept of a rolling revue has taken root. The final banquet was the genesis for this year's Colorado Holiday.

The Colorado contingency at the 2004 Vintage Marathon fielded 5 cars. We had the critical mass in terms of cars for another drive. Perhaps more importantly, Goetz Pfafflin, who was a principle architect of the Marathon organization, was now firmly transplanted to Colorado. The Colorado "Gang of 5" next conspired at the Rocky Mountain Chapter of the BMW CCA holiday dinner. Our gang consisted of Jerry and Heidi Lynch (Veritas), Decker Swann (328), Star and Bill Young (M1, 507, 503, CSL, and more!), Goetz (327/8 coupe) and me (Z1 and 327/8 Cabriolet). A week-long summer tour through the Colorado Rockies seemed like a natural encore. Goetz had his consensus—the rest would soon be history!

By Spring 2005, a 5-day tour through Colorado had been mapped out by Goetz with superlative roads and accommodations arranged. Our outing would culminate in a Concours d' Elegance co-hosted with the Rocky Mountain Chapter of the BMW CCA. The Youngs provided 5 outstanding cars to the event to entice global participation! It takes a strong will to turn down an M1 or 503 coupe ride. The final grid consisted of an enthusiast's dream: 1936 319 Cabriolet, 327 coupe,

507 roadster, 503 coupe, 1800 TISA, 2000CS, 3.0CSL (even a UK RHD!), 2002, M1, and Z1. What really made this kind of event memorable was not so much the cars, but the drive and especially the drivers....

Our adventure began on July 5 in Vail. I was excited to see Jim and Gloria Smith from Sonoma, California arrive. On their trailer was Jim's 319 Cabriolet which he had recently taken out of 5 years of storage. Jim is perhaps one of the few enthusiasts in this country who is capable of taking a mothballed prewar car and flogging it flawlessly for more than a thousand miles up and down the Rockies. Interestingly, on the same rig was Jim's next project: a derelict BMW consist-

ing of a pre-war frame, 2002 motor, a smattering of original BMW bodywork, and some seemingly random pieces of Ford bodywork. Only a master mechanic, body shop visionary or perhaps a madman would tackle this daunting project. As I would come to know, Jim is certainly a master of many trades. By late afternoon, the remainder of the cars arrived via Interstate 70 and Loveland Pass. Our event packets promised adventurous and spirited driving over the next 4 days.

From Vail, we headed along the headwaters of the Colorado River to the western slopes of the Front Range and the "backside" of Rocky Mountain National Park. Most of us lunched in the small town of Grand Lake and braced ourselves for the justifiably famous Trail Ridge Road. Grand Lake is a scenic town and natural lake that is 8400 ft. above sea level. Trail Ridge Road would crest at 12,183 feet. For carbureted motors that are 30 to 60 years old, this was a challenging altitude change. The road was, by itself, a complete tour of Rocky Mountain ecosystems as we traversed through warm, lush forested lowlands of Grand Lake and arrived at the windswept alpine tundra above timberline. The driving at times was spirited as there were many sweeper switchbacks. The "driving fun" was punctuated by the many lumbering RVs that were crawling both up and down Trail Ridge Road. There were plenty of opportunities for scenic stops prior to making a long descent into the bustling tourist town of Estes Park. It was a relief to put Estes Park, with its stop-and-go traffic, in the rearview mirror.

The "Peak to Peak Highway" was relatively un-crowded and took us by the former mining towns of Blackhawk and Central City. A short westward excursion on I-70 deposited us at the base of Loveland Pass. I shared some memorable curves with the Young's CSL as we crossed Loveland Pass on Route 6, a classic mountain pass. By 6 p.m., all teams had arrived in Keystone, a scant 40 miles east of Vail. Approximate mileage via our round about route was 260 miles!

Our second day would be the longest day of driving. We headed west from Keystone to another skiing venue, Copper Mountain. From Copper Mountain, we climbed to the 11,318 ft. Fremont Pass. I made my customary midmorning espresso stop in the mining town of Leadville. I soon caught up with the Neue Klasse group that was following the Dethlefsen's 1800 TISA. It was a beautiful drive along the upper Arkansas River with a 2000CS and two '02s setting a brisk pace. We then headed west on Route 50 over 11,312 ft. Monarch Pass. The pace was hampered by road construction on the downhill side of the pass. After descending Monarch Pass, it was on to Gunnison and a trip north to the former mining town of Crested Butte.

Crested Butte revels in its reputation for being a bit eccentric. Most of us basked in the pure blue skies while eating lunch at one of the many outdoor cafes. There was some concern that the next leg would be hot, slow, and arduous the unpaved Kebler Pass Road—but this turned out to be one of the most memorable roads of the trip. There were fields of wildflowers, rugged peaks, aspen glades, and an un-crowded twisty road! The Smith's pre-war roadster and Miro Stromar's 2002 til carved a blistering pace through the backcountry. There was no doubt as to the origin of the "fruede am fahren" slogan. Resuming our tour on pavement as we descended into Paonia and Hotchkiss was a bit of a disappointment! From Hotchkiss, there was a 90-mile stretch of road without a gas station. The driving was spectacular along the north rim of the Black Canyon of the Gunnison. Most everyone was literally fried by the Colorado sun as the rally convened for the evening in Montrose.

Montrose is the gateway town to the San Juan Mountains of southwest Colorado. The San Juan's are arguably the most rugged and beautiful mountains in the US. We would see plenty of them on Day 3. From Montrose, we drove into the town of Ouray. Ouray is blessed with a number of hot springs

and good coffee cafes. In the winter, Ouray is an ice climber's paradise as the box canyon in town features multiple natural and man-made ice falls. I sipped yet another mocha as I watched our group pass through Ouray and climb the switch-backs of Red Mountain Pass. I joined Otto and Mark Lies who were driving the M1 for the uphill slalom over Red Mountain Pass. Most of our group took a break in the old mining town of Silverton. Yet another pass was negotiated on the way to Durango—the 10,900 ft. Molas Pass. The passes not only provided dreamy roads, but the cool air was welcome as there had been scarcely a cloud in the sky for the preceding three days.

In Durango we congregated as a group to meet up with club member and Colorado summertime resident Ed Giller. Ed has the unique distinction of having owned his 328 roadster since January 1946! (Ed shared his history: in the first months following the war, the 328 was discovered abandoned in a Luftwaffe hangar. There were no wheels for the car and the owner was long gone. The wheels were located in the nearby village and a local mechanic got the car running. Ed bartered his Army Air Corp flight jacket for the car and he shipped the 328 back to the U.S. for \$75, where the car remained in its original state.) Decker Swann parked her white 328 next to Ed's green 328 for a rare photo opportunity!

Decker's 328 might have been the first mechanical casualty of the event as the rear differential leaked all its oil. Fortunately, a parking lot inspection revealed that the housing bolts were loose. The bolts were retightened and oil added—no leak!—and impending disaster had seemingly been avoided. After lunch it was a drive to Telluride via Mesa Verde National Park. A cursory view of some of the more accessible cliff dwellings only confirmed that this would be a destination for yet another trip. Mesa Verde was oppressively hot. The drive out of the lowlands followed the Delores River. Many drivers felt that this was perhaps one of the finest drives of the trip. It was certainly a relief to regain altitude, crest Lizard Head Pass at 10,222 ft. and descend into Telluride.

The Wyndham Peaks Resort served perhaps the best meal of the trip. It was probably the longest and most enjoyable evening yet. At this point, everyone was acquainted on a first-name basis. We shared a common history of some 800 miles of driving in the last three days. As there were no break-continued next page

downs, and we had a relatively "flat" drive into Vail, there was a sense of anticipation that everyone was going to make it back to Vail incident-free!

The route from Telluride to Vail was by no means flat. We discovered one of the nicest roads in Colorado was the Paonia-to-Redstone leg. The road was in immaculate condition with a beautiful, but relatively low pass—McClure Pass—a mere 8755 ft.! From McClure Pass, it was a stunning descent along the pristine Crystal River. We lunched en masse at the Redstone Inn. Redstone is a beautiful, one-street community


sandwiched between red sandstone cliffs and the whitewater of the Crystal River. After lunch, I clambered down the embankment of the Crystal River to the "penny hot springs", but the river was running too high to enjoy these natural springs. Before dinner, I had the special experience of a parking garage apprenticeship. My 327/8 was sidelined with a horrendous case of backfiring. Jim Smith proposed that we tackle the problem in the hotel parking garage. With a few tools and in under an hour, I was looking at the pushrods and tappets of my 65-year-old motor. We found that a pushrod had jumped its tappet. With a quick valve adjustment, my motor kicked over, and I was back in business.

Saturday night, we had a final, sumptuous dinner with the Rocky Mountain Chapter of the BMW CCA. There were again whispers of next summer's drive—and it was <u>not</u> just the Colorado people.... MSR


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WE NEED YOUR HELP



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e've got enough on our hands with everyday life. It's tough to think about the "what ifs," yet less than a half-hour of preparation for an emergency breakdown could turn a scary, unpredictable situation into a non-event.

There's no way to guarantee personal safety if you're stranded on the side of the road, but anticipating your actions beforehand can help you make quick, smart decisions despite the stressful circumstances.

Consider the following suggestions:

- If possible, get your vehicle as far off the road and away from traffic as possible.
- Make your vehicle visible to other drivers. Raise the hood and turn on your hazard warning flashers. If you have flares or reflective triangles, place them behind the vehicle, at least 50 feet away, to warn others and direct traffic away from your vehicle.
- If you think your vehicle may be struck from behind, get out of it and move to a safe place away from the roadside. Do not stand behind or in front of your vehicle where it can be difficult for other drivers to see you.
- Safety experts agree that under most circumstances if you are able to park away from traffic, it is safest to remain in your vehicle until a law enforcement officer or towing provider arrives.

- Politely decline an offer from a stranger to give you a ride to a phone. Instead, ask the person to call and request road service on your behalf.
- Take note of your surroundings. Look for street signs, mile markers, buildings, or other landmarks. When you call for help, give the call receiver as much information about your location as possible.
- If you fear for your safety for any reason, make sure the call receiver understands this.

To serve you best, the call receiver also needs to know your cellular phone number if you have one, and a description of your vehicle. Be sure to tell the number of adults and children in your vehicle that need to be accommodated and if anyone has special medical needs. Check your owner's manual to see if there are special towing requirements for your vehicle. The call receiver will need this information, too.



The more mentally and physically prepared you are to meet unexpected challenges, the lower the toll on your personal well-being.

It will be helpful if you

have scoped out repair facilities in advance and know where you want to have your car towed. Give this information to the call receiver.

Inclement weather conditions or a remote location may mean that road service could be delayed. In this situation, ask to have the highway patrol or local law enforcement send a vehicle to assist with traffic.

For your reference and records, get a receipt from the tow service provider.

You can do many things to keep your car in top running condition and avoid an emergency breakdown situation, but some vehicle difficulties may be unavoidable. The more mentally and physically prepared you are to meet unexpected challenges, the lower the toll on your personal well-being.

Both versions of this top-down convertible replica feature the distinctive BMW front-split kidney grille and a metallic red, painted steel frame with sturdy, plastic body construction. The plastic parts are de-burred, so there's no risk of kids encountering sharp edges as they climb behind the wheel and gear up for adventure.

Young drivers can create their own "street" with an assortment of international toy road and traffic signs. The battery-operated traffic light (\$30) features a weighted base and flashes from red to green, helping drivers handle any oncoming traffic flow, and the pylon traffic cones (\$8 each) can create a fun autocross or a parking area for drivers and their playmates. The hazard, parking and right-of-way signs come as a set

of three for \$25. The stop, caution, and no parking signs also come in a set of three for \$25.

The electric car's dimensions are 55 inches by 21.5 inches by 21 inches, and weighs approximately 37.5 pounds. It operates on 12 volts — two 6 volt batteries, and retails for \$425. The pedal model, which retails for \$250, is 55 inches by 21.5 inches by 21 inches with an approximate weight of 22 pounds. MSR





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
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
