

Car of the Month



Robert's 1988 Alpineweiss modified 535

U october **Car of the Month** comes to you from Boulder, Colorado belonging to Robert Giannandrea, Robert writes:

Two years ago I decided that I needed a BMW hobby car to restore. My E39 540 was wonderful and the best car I have ever owned, but needless to say, there is not much tinkering to be done on the car.

My next decision was to find a car. I thought about various 3 Series, but after some soul searching decided that I was more of a 5 Series kind of person. Not as nimble as the 3, but a great touring ride with handling that will shame most vehicles. I looked at and drove numerous E34's, 535s to 525s. My budget probably couldn't take the costs associated with an E35 M5 especially getting into a possible engine rebuild.

CALLING ALL PARTICIPANTS "Car of the Month"

"Car of the Month" is a series in which Club members will have a chance to showcase their pride and joy in the MSR. Our membership will see the variety of BMWs and the level of personalization that makes each car unique.

Each month throughout the year we will feature a "Car of the Month". Any car owned by a Chapter member is eligible. Just send several photos (they will be returned to you) of your car, along with a written description about the vehicle. But wait, there's more, in the February issue you will find a ballot to choose from the 10 Cars of the Month, and a Car of the Year will be announced in a future issue. There was something about the E34 that didn't quite move me. The car was a little too large and the steering was somewhat flat. The stock suspension wasn't that crisp, admitting that most of the cars I looked at, to be kind, were "beaters". I then decided to look for an E28, talk about beaters. Most everything on the market was probably a little more than one week from the scrap yard. I looked at probably 5 cars, nothing popped up. I did like the steering on the E28s and even though most of these wrecks needed suspension work, I somehow felt that under the filth and ruble lurked a real BMW.

One day while looking at the classifieds I noticed an ad for a 1988 535 with 106,000 miles. How could it be? The mileage was so low. I went to take a look at the car and it was

lying under a tree and had been for some time, it was filthy with bird droppings and tree sap. The driver's seat leather was cracked, the plastic bumper covers were cracked, and the delivering dealer 18 years ago forgot to clean off the Cosmoline from under the hood. What a mess. The car started right away but ran rough. I drove it several miles and found no leaks, no smoke and the body looked straight. Four thousand dollars later I was driving it back to Boulder.

The first job was to remove all the dirt from the paint. Several detailing and polishing sessions later the paint emerged from 18 years of hiding to reveal a sparkling Alpineweiss body. I then replaced all the chrome and front windshield. Next was to recover and rebuild the driver's seat. Apparently not many people sat on the other seats because after some Zymol cleaning and conditioning the seats looked great. A local upholstery restoration shop here in Boulder managed to find half a hide of cardinal red leather that had been sitting in a shop in New Jersey for 18 years. He bought it for me and rebuilt the seat fixing the headrests which apparently never worked. The leather was a perfect match down to the grain.

The next step was to bring the car to my friend Bruce Felix owner and operator of *Flying Horse Motorwerks* in Longmont. Bruce rebuilt the front end, installed Bilstein heavy duty shocks, Brembo rotors with Pagid brake pads and drained all the car fluids. The TRXs (wheels) were tossed, I hope whoever invented those wheels is no longer doing that kind of work, what a difference in appearance with those gone. I also had to get rid of those stock park bench bumpers; Bruce collapsed the shocks on the bumpers and moved them in several inches. I found new spoilers from several dead "is" models had them repainted and installed. After a can of BG44 (fuel treatment) new plugs and valve adjustment, the engine ran almost as smooth as my 540. I couldn't get the Cosmoline off and found a shop in Boulder that did bead blasting and





had the entire engine and compartment blasted. It now looks new.

I've purchased many cosmetic items from Gebhardt BMW and am grateful for the discount they give to CCA members. The E28 is now about as close to new as it can be and I am amazed at how fast, solid and agile these cars were back in 1988. The car is a joy to drive both around town and on trips around Colorado. It's as stable as my 540 at over 100 mph, and returns 30 mpg on the highway. It is absolutely bullet proof, and most

things can be fixed without a computer. Now whenever I see one of these dieing E28s shuffling around town, I know that under that mess is a really wonderful car. MSR

Formula BMW World Final In Bahrain: December 13-16, 2005

Drivers from all four Formula BMW series compete for a Formula One test drive

MANAMA/MUNICH. The championships of the four Formula BMW series have not yet been decided, but preparations for the season's highlight are already running at full throttle. From 13th to 16th December, the first Formula BMW World Final is to be held on the Bahrain International Circuit.

Racing in a tournament format, the young drivers of the four series will be competing not only for a US-Dollar 60 000 purse but also for the winner's prize: a Formula One test drive. Below is a summary of the key features of the event.

Date: 13th to 16th December 2005.

Circuit: The Bahrain International Circuit (BIC) was built between 2003 and 2004. 4th April 2004 saw the first Formula One Grand Prix of the Middle East held there. The BIC is both host and promoter of the event.

Eligible drivers: The Formula BMW series are now held in 14 countries across three continents. This year sees 87 drivers from 31 nations competing against each other. In principle, all drivers involved in any of this year's four Formula BMW series are eligible to compete in the World Final, i.e. drivers in the Formula BMW ADAC Championship, the Formula BMW Asia Series, the Formula BMW UK Championship and the Formula BMW USA Championship. Each driver must have previously taken part in at least three Formula BMW race events.

Format: The event takes the form of a tournament which will give drivers numerous opportunities for competitive racing. 180 minutes of Free Practice will enable them to familiarize themselves with the circuit in detail.

For each Qualifying Session, entrants will be divided into four groups within which drivers compete against each other. A points system calculates an intermediate score for each driver. The highest scorers qualify directly for the Pre-Final.

Another group competes in the Second Chance Race, in which the best finishers can still secure a place in the Pre-Final. The results of the Pre-Final determine the grid line-up for the Final, which takes place on the Friday and sees only the best of the drivers competing against each other.

Prize money: US-Dollar 60 000.

Winner's prize: Formula One test drive with BMW managed Formula One team.

Testing opportunity: From the publication date of the World Final Regulations (27th July 2005) through to 12th December 2005, a test ban is in effect on the circuit.

After the World Final, teams can make the most of the mild climate in Bahrain (between 16 and 22 degrees Celsius in December) for up to four days of Formula BMW test drives. Support: BMW will provide support for the teams in the areas of freight logistics (shipping of Formula BMW cars), finding hotel accommodation, visa applications, organizing hire cars and other travel formalities.

Venue: Bahrain is an island state east of Saudi Arabia in the Persian Gulf. The country consists of 33 islands, covers an area of 712 km² and has a population of 680,000. The capital city Manama has around 200,000 inhabitants and is the island state's largest city.

Italian Grand Prix - Race

Weather: Sunny, dry. Temp: Air 28-29°C, Track 45-46°C

MONZA (ITA) Thanks to a strong drive and a good strategy, Antonio Pizzonia scored two points for the BMW WillaimsF1 Team, by finishing seventh, having started 16th on the grid. Pizzonia stood in for Nick Heidfeld, who withdrew yesterday after a crash in testing. Team mate Mark Webber was unfortunately caught in an accident at the first corner, which forced him to pit for a new nose and front wing which compromised his race.

Antonio Pizzonia: 7th

Best time: 1:22.870 (lap 21, 6h overall)

Chassis: FW27 03 / BMW P84/5 Engine: 1st GP

I am very pleased with this result on one side but I am also slightly disappointed on the other because I think that I could have done even better if I had been at my top form, as I haven't tested recently and I am out of practice. Considering the whole situation, we scored two valuable points and my car was strong today.

Mark Webber: 14th

Best time: 1:22.935 (lap 40, 7h overall)

Chassis: FW27 04 / BMW P84/5 Engine: 1st GP

I had a really good start and when I was going through turn one I was telling myself "Take it easy, take it easy!" but then I think someone moved on David Coulthard and he slowed rapidly in front of me and I damaged my front wing. I had to come into the pits to change it and after that it was basically all about recovering from nowhere. It's a shame for the team, as everyone did a fantastic job this weekend and we deserved to have both cars in the points today.

Sam Michael (Technical Director, WilliamsF1):

It was a good drive from Antonio, a fantastic result considering he did not drive the car for some time until yesterday morning. It is a shame that Mark damaged his front wing in the first corner. It became clear as the race unfolded that we have improved the car's pace compared to other teams around us. The gap to McLaren is still our biggest focus. Unfortunately due to the qualifying order we did not maximize the potential of our cars today.

Mario Theissen (BMW Motorsport Director):

Antonio did a very good job. Just one year ago he had to stand in for Ralf Schumacher here at Monza and since then he has not raced at all. Today he managed to recover from grid position 16th to finish 7th without any mistakes. Unfortunately Mark had a coming together at the first chicane after the start and had to change his front wing. From then on, until his first pit stop he got stuck in traffic and had practically no chance to improve his position. We had no mechanical problems today.

No. 21 BMW Team Ptg M3 Takes Emco Gears Classic GT Class Victory; BMW Team Ptg M3s Finish 1st, 7th & 16th

LEXINGTON, OHIO - AUGUST 27, 2005... The No. 21 BMW Team PTG F1 Air M3 of RJ Valentine, Kelly Collins and Tom Milner drove from the last starting position to take the GT class victory in today's Emco Gears Classic at Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course. In winning BMW Team PTG's sixth race of the season, Collins and Milner (Valentine did not drive) completed 91 laps of the 2.258-mile, 13-turn circuit, finishing five seconds ahead of the second place Pontiac.

While the No. 21 M3 enjoyed an excellent day after having to relinquish its fourth starting position following postqualifying inspection, the two other M3s ran into their share of bad luck in the second hour of today's race.

With Ian James behind the wheel, the No. 22 BMW Team PTG M3 he would share with Chris Gleason and Bill Auberlen led the first hour of the race. An incident with a Daytona Prototype car on Iap 56 during Gleason's stint cost the trio three Iaps while a broken right front steering arm was repaired. Auberlen drove the final 20 Iaps of the race, finishing seventh. The No. 16 BMW Team PTG M3 of Justin Marks and Joey Hand experienced electrical problems on Iap 34 and had to be brought to the garage for repairs. It was a disappointing day for the two young drivers as Hand took over from polesitter Marks after repairs, ultimately finishing 15 Iaps down to the No. 21 M3 and dropping out of the top-five in Driver Points.

A yellow flag on the very first lap of the race set the tone for the first hour of the race as an additional two caution periods slowed the pace of the contest, allowing only 30 laps to be completed in the opening sixty minutes. James and Marks paced the field for the first hour, but problems developed with the No. 22 and 16 M3s. Milner took over for Collins in the No. 21 M3 on lap 40 after the experienced veteran had come from last to fifth place.

The race was not decided until the final 20 minutes as Milner raced in third place with Auberlen in the No. 22 M3 in 13th and Hand, in the No. 16 M3 16th. With 10 laps remaining the leading No. 64 Pontiac fell victim to a suspension problem and the second place Pontiac pitted for fuel during a caution period. As the race went green, Milner took over the lead and held on for the final eight laps.

Round 11 of the Rolex Sports Car Series, the Phoenix 250 will take place on Sept. 8 - 10 at Phoenix International Raceway.

KELLY COLLINS, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG F1 AIR M3 (first): "We got yellow flag after yellow flag early in the race and that allowed me to pick off one car after another. At the end an hour and a half we were in fifth place. Tom did a fantastic job to bring it home for us. In a very generous move for the team, RJ declined to get in as an extra pit stop could have cost us the win.

TOM MILNER, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG F1 AIR M3 (first): "I knew it would be very difficult to catch the No. 64 car at the end because we had lost so much track position. I kept focused on running quick, clean laps - hoping we would

get lucky. We did, but we had raced hard all day to be in a position to take advantage of those breaks."

RJ VALENTINE, DRIVER NO. 21 BMW TEAM PTG F1 AIR M3 (first): "Unfortunately, I did not get a chance to contribute in the race, but my teammates carried the day. For me, this is an entire team effort and I am proud to be part of it."

TOM MILNER, OWNER BMW TEAM PTG: "Certainly the odds were against us today. We were not the fastest car, but we raced hard and won our sixth of the year for BMW. Kelly got us into the top-five and Tom drove the fastest he had all weekend to seal the victory. I am very proud of everyone's effort today."

LARRY KOCH, BMW OF NORTH AMERICA M BRAND AND MOTORSPORTS MANAGER: "We had couple of tough breaks today with the No. 22 and 16 M3s, but BMW Team PTG always seems to find a way to race the M3 to the top of the podium - even if there is only one left with a chance to win. At one point, the No. 21 M3 was almost one lap down to the leaders, but they got it done. Win number 52 of our BMW M3 racing program is a testament to why BMW Team PTG is the best."

For example, participants will handle a corner at a quick speed, and then keep the vehicle on course as they brake heavily for the second turn, while easing off the throttle and transferring the weight of the vehicle.

BMW instructors give instant feedback on a two-way radio system, so participants can find out how to improve or correct their driving as they prepare to go back around the course.

Other exercises include heel-toe downshifting, autocross driving maneuvers on the banked track and car control lessons on the skip pad. The VIR circuit features 17 challenging turns and 130 feet of elevation change on which participants will drive the 400 horsepower M5 and the 333-horsepower M3 Competition Package.

BMW CCA MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

We've been watching our membership numbers creep downward for about a year now and so it's time to implement a membership drive! The strategic plan for the club calls for us to grow the club in size by offering real value for members' dues dollars and by expanding member benefits. Our goal is to create a home for as many BMW enthusiasts as possible by meeting their BMW information and activity needs. As you know we're actively pursing these goals.

When you consider the services available, the club offers a great deal for just \$40 per year. You are all familiar with the benefits, but to help you pitch the club, check this refresher:

Roundel is filled with feature articles, monthly columns, product reviews, and technical information. Members may place two free thirty-word ads or one free fifty-word ad per month in the magazine's popular classified-ad section and post them directly to the newly revamped national web site.

Technical Service Advisors provide assistance to members confronted with technical questions. The TSA's have years and years of background and experience in the care, maintenance, and repair of BMWs and many own or manage independent shops.

The Club Ombudsmen serve as intermediaries for members unable to resolve problems with manufacturers, dealers, repair shops, parts suppliers, and others.

The **Club Library**, located in the National Office, offers a range of BMW-related information in a variety of media—all available by e-mailing or calling the National Office.

Many BMW dealerships and Independents offer **discounts on parts and service** to BMW CCA members.

Special Interest Groups and Registers are independently organized to provide information about specific or rare BMWs. Activities provided by the **SIG**s range from driving events to web-based digests to publications and news bulletins. Listings of these groups can be found each month in *Roundel*.

Friends of BMW, the Club's glove-box guide, lists volunteer member's worldwide offering help to the traveling member who encounters difficulty on the road. BMW dealers throughout the US are also listed. Friends of BMW can be a real lifesaver and is available from the National Office for a modest fee to members only. Premier events such as **Oktoberfest** and **TechFest** are open to all members—both national club gatherings offer technical sessions, vendor displays and presentations as well as plenty of socializing with fellow members; and Oktoberfest has the additional advantage of offering a variety of driving events.

Our **Chapters** are our best advocates and just about everyone who joins lives in a chapter area. Our chapters publish newsletters at least quarterly to inform members about upcoming events. Most chapters host monthly meetings and also offer driving, technical, and social events. Chapters also act as members' liaison with local dealers and independent shops, and, as noted above, can assist with obtaining discounts on parts and services.

2005-06 BMW CCA MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

The BMW CCA Membership Drive is from September 1, 2005 to July 15, 2006.

This membership drive is open to three categories of participants: 1) current BMW CCA members, 2) current BMW CCA members who work for a BMW dealer or independent BMW shop, and 3) BMW CCA chapters. To be eligible, BMW CCA members must be paid members; (that is, they may not be members by virtue of being "comped" by BMW CCA or a BMW CCA chapter).

The program differentiates between BMW CCA members who work at BMW dealers or independent shops and those who don't. This reason is that those who work at places where BMWs are sold, serviced, or repaired are assumed to have a much greater opportunity to meet BMW owners who may not already be members of BMW CCA. While all BMW CCA members have equal opportunities to receive the membership extension reward, they will only be competing against other members in their own category for the additional prize drawings and grand prizes.

There are three reward categories of this incentive program that correspond to the three categories of participants: 1) rewards for current BMW CCA members who refer new members; 2) rewards for BMW dealer or independent BMW shop employees who refer new members; and 3) rewards for chapters that achieve a designated level of new member activity.

In addition to ongoing incentive rewards for each member referred, BMW CCA members who refer new members, and BMW CCA members who are employed by BMW dealers or independent BMW shops and who refer new members will be eligible for drawings for a variety of additional prizes at the end of the membership drive. These drawings will take place at Oktoberfest 2006. Winners need not be present at Oktoberfest to win. The prize list will be published on the <u>www.</u> <u>bmwcca.org</u> web site as prizes are added.

A new membership is defined as a membership for an individual or business that has never before belonged to BMW CCA, or a membership for an individual or business that was a previous BMW CCA member but whose membership lapsed at least six months prior to the date of the new membership.

A new membership with a corresponding associate membership counts as one new membership.

All new member applications must be received by the National Office no later than July 15, 2006 to be counted. If referred by a current BMW CCA member, a new member application must contain the name and BMW CCA member

number of the referring member in order for the referring member to receive credit. Credit may not be applied retroactively.

If a new member cancels their membership within three months after joining, the referring individual will lose credit for that membership.

If a new member is referred by a current associate member, the associate member will receive the ticket for the prize drawing; however the membership extension credit will be applied to the associate member's corresponding primary member.

BMW CCA members who are members of the National Board of Directors, paid employees of BMW CCA, *Roundel* senior staff, and members of their immediate families or households are eligible for referral reward incentives, but are not eligible for the prize drawings at the end of the membership drive or the grand prizes.

Lifetime members who refer new members may designate their extra months of membership earned to be added to the membership of a friend or family member.

Referral credit will not be given to applications received without the referring member's BMW CCA member number. BMW CCA members will be able to track their referrals by accessing their personal information through the BMW CCA web site. Individual membership extensions awarded under this program will be applied at the time of the member's normal renewal, and/or within 30 days after the end of the membership drive, whichever comes first.

Chapter membership and renewal rate numbers will be updated monthly and sent to chapters with News From National. Monthly updates will also be posted to <u>bmwcca.org</u> New members can join:

- by calling 1-800-978-9292 to submit their application and credit card information over the telephone. The referring member's name and BMW CCA member number must be provided at the time the call is made.
- by visiting <u>www.bmwcca.org</u> and submitting an application online. To receive credit, the referring member's name and BMW CCA member number must be entered in the appropriate space on the online application form.
- 3) by mailing a membership application to the National Office. In order to receive credit, the referring Member's name and BMW CCA member number must be written on the application. Membership applications/BMW CCA brochures are available from the National Office by calling 864-250-0022 or sending an e-mail to <u>mmitchell@bmwcca.org</u>

Category 1. Current BMW CCA Members (not employed by a BMW dealer or independent BMW shop): For each new member that joins, referring members will receive a onemonth extension of their existing BMW CCA membership, and one ticket in the prize drawing.

There is no limit to the number of extensions a member may receive based on new member referrals.

In addition to the prize drawings, there will be grand prizes

for the three BMW members who refer the most members. The First Grand Prize is a trip for two to visit the BMW Manufacturing plant and Zentrum in Spartanburg, SC. The Second Grand Prize is a Lifetime BMW CCA membership. The Third Grand Prize is a \$250 shopping spree in the BMW CCA store. These winners will also be officially recognized in *Roundel*.

Category 2. Current BMW CCA Members employed by a BMW dealer or independent BMW shop: For each new member that joins, referring members will receive a onemonth extension of their existing BMW CCA membership, and one ticket in the prize drawing.

There is no limit to the number of extensions a member may receive based on new member referrals.

In addition to the prize drawings, there will be grand prizes for the three BMW members who refer the most members. The First Grand Prize is a trip for two to visit the BMW Manufacturing plant and Zentrum in Spartanburg, SC. The Second Grand Prize is a Lifetime BMW CCA membership. The Third Grand Prize is a \$250 shopping spree in the BMW CCA store. These winners will also be officially recognized in *Roundel*.

Please note that memberships purchased by dealers for their customers are not eligible for the one month extension reward or tickets for the prize drawings. This exclusion is in effect even if a current

BMW CCA member is listed on the application as a referrer.

Category 3. Chapters: Chapters are eligible for rewards based on an overall increase in their total membership and their renewal rate. Both are important for continued growth of the Club, since renewing members are more likely to stay in the Club for more years, while new members are needed to replace those members who don't renew. Only primary chapter memberships will count toward chapter goals, dual chapter affiliations will not accrue towards the goals.

To be eligible for rewards, chapters must be in good standing. Chapters that are officially on probation during the period of the membership drive will not be eligible.

The basis for chapter goals for new members will be the total number of primary members as of the official close in the National Office on August 24, 2005.

The goals for chapters that gain or lose members due to chapter realignment or the creation or dissolution of chapters will be revised so that they maintain an equitable basis for rewards.





Exit at Jackson Gap and turn right (south). Jackson Gap Road will turn to the left (east), and become East 71st Avenue. When you reach Robertsdale Road you will see the lot to the southeast at the intersection of 71st and Robertsdale Road. To get to the entrance, turn right (south) on Robertsdale Road, left (east) on 68th Ave and left (north) again on Valley Head Street. FROM THE PASSING LANE

Last month I wrote about the ANSA exhaust system I purchased last spring. Since last writing, I have had the system welded twice, then two days ago as I was driving west on I-70 I heard a couple of clanks, then some strange noises. I thought it was the beater Datsun in the next lane. But as I looked in my rear view mirror I saw the rear section of the system bouncing down I-70. It broke in two on the far side of the rear end. 


"YOUR CAR IS ONLY AS FAST AS **ITS** BRAKES" by "The Kid"

A driver always wants to have an edge over his opponent; Karl Bosch had it at Second Creek Raceway on July 27, when the Sports Car Club of America had held their Regional Competion. His 2002ti had been running well all morning; after taking a few runs, he had qualified for the pole position in the GT3 class-ahead of a 911 and a Datsun Z, both of which are in the faster(?) GT2 class. In the opinion of this writer, the brakes on the ti were all the edge that Karl needed to take away a victory from the Corvair in the same class with smoldering brakes. (photo)

The brakes on the ti incorporated the use of vented discs with til struts up front, and using disc brakes in the rear (it's a mystery to me; but if I find out what they are off of and how much it costs to convert them, I'll let you know.) The vented discs in front are cooled by using a flexible hose leading from the front of the car to the discs on either side- very much the same way that Joe Lavonas's 1600 is (photo.) This set-up is inexpensive and relativly easy to install; the only expense is the hose, and the only labor is removing a part of he backing plate to expose the rotor. When asked about the effectiveness of the t-system, Joe replied, "...never had any more problems with fade or overheating." Joe finished a respectable second place in the "Improved Touring Class B"; he has given thought to going to a 2liter for next season, and maybe getting a friend involved (name unknown) and starting a team. The only other club entry was Bill Schaffer, he was driving Chapparel powered Formula 440. Bill was doing well until he encountered technical problems during qualifing; another F-440 hit his rear axle, causing him to spin, then hit him again, causing him to roll-over. He was a little shaken-up, but he was 0.K. The F-440 suffered a Broken rear axle, **causing** him to drop-out of the race.





Burnin' up the Track

N ot many women over the age of 50 can boast pushing a BMW to excessive speeds, avoiding wall collisions and watching time trials with eagle eyes, but that's just what Superior resident Patty Tunnell lives for — the thrill and speed of professional autocross racing.

With ten national amateur championships and four professional national championships under her belt, Tunnell thrives on competition and does extremely well in the male-dominated sport.

Though her husband, whom she touts as one of the best professional drivers, loved the sport, Tunnell didn't have an interest in strapping herself in for wild rides.

That all changed as soon as Tunnell discovered in 1985 her thirst for competition and drive to win.

"I got completely hooked," Tunnell said.

The couple owns a service and maintenance shop in Broomfield, BimmerHaus Performance, which focuses on maintaining, building and improving the overall quality of BMWs.

Tunnell has come a long way from her first race car, a 1985 Sirocco.

Now, she races many of the fastest cars in the world including a 2005 Mini Cooper S and a 1995 BMW M3, to which Tunnell refers to as "totally tricked out."

While Tunnell and her husband love the sport, they do occasionally race for money and Tunnell said that one race netted a \$10,000 purse.

Though not every race brings in the big bucks, Tunnell said the money is a bonus to doing something she and her husband truly enjoy.

"It's a lot better than we've done fishing or golfing," Tunnell joked.


Tunnell specializes in two types of racing, road racing and Pro Solo Series racing.

The difference between them, Tunnell explained, is road racing involves strategy, higher speeds and increased danger while Pro Solo focuses on small road courses made for nearly any type of car, from expensive imports to the neighbor's sedan.

"You run what you brung," Tunnell said, referring to a saying heard among Pro Series drivers.

Solo Pro Series races, which occur in nearly every city all over the country, offer an added bonus of a Ladies Class, where women can race against other women.

"In road racing, being female, I definitely think you have

to earn the respect of the guys," Tunnell said. "I think they definitely try and intimidate you on the track."

Tunnell recalled one race where she and a male competitor were headed into a turn, nose to nose, that was only big enough for one car.

Tunnell's car was ahead, but her opponent thought that she would back off and collided with her when she held her position.

Though Tunnell has earned the respect of the men, she said women racers demand just as much of their colleagues.

"The nice thing about the Ladies Class is the camaraderie," Tunnell said. "I've raced with men and women and the women are very, very good — I've made friends all over the country."

Four years ago, while playing competitive racquet ball, one of Tunnell's other passions, she was struck in the face by a racket and received a severe brain injury.

Learning how to drive again and race again was a challenge she devoted herself to overcoming.

"I remember during one race, I looked down and panicked because there were three pedals and I only had two feet," Tunnell recalled. "I didn't know what to do."

In their careers, Tunnell and her husband have won two Drivers of Eminence awards, an honor that spotlights racing achievements, and the Johnson Spirit of the Sport award, given to those that have the most fun.

"They used to call me Patty 'Tortilla' Tunnell because I always threw tortillas all over the track," Tunnell said with a smile. "And I always have a squirt gun."





News Release to CAMA Members July 15, 2005

When or and the provided to announce the completion of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that lays the foundation for a new "home track" for amateur road racing in the Denver metro area. Colorado Amateur Motorsports Associates, LLC (CAMA) has signed an MOU which will enable Sutton International Motorsports, LLC, and an affiliate of Centrix Financial, LLC, to build and own the new track project we undertook two years ago. Sutton Motorsports has expressed a genuine interest in the health and growth of amateur road racing in the area, and it's their intention to build a facility that will surpass our wildest dreams. They have contracted CAMA to be their "anchor tenant" in the project and will be designating portions of the facility that will serve as our "home track".

Unlike most motorsport facilities where individual clubs have to compete for dates, the Sutton Motorsports facility will be available to CAMA with long term guarantees which will allow CAMA to control scheduling, rental fees and types of use, so long as we collectively meet our annual lease commitments. Sutton Motorsports is involved in auto racing ventures on a variety of levels, and hopes to provide opportunity for more people to realize the race experience. It has long been Sutton Motorsports' dream to build a first-class road race facility, not for professional spectator events, but rather for the entertainment of their customers, for professional motorsport testing and amateur use.

They are genuinely enthused about this usage model and we feel it presents an opportunity to market Colorado road racing on a national level and build the memberships of our amateur clubs.

In 1998, five area groups joined together to purchase the lease of Second Creek Raceway (SCR). These five were:

Rocky Mountain Vintage Racing, Ltd. (RMVR)

Motorcycle Road Racing Association Inc. (MRA)

Rocky Mountain Region Porsche Club of America, Inc. (PCA)

Colorado Region Sports Car Club of America, Inc. (SCCA)

Multi-Car Club Alliance Inc. (MCCA)

(The MCCA consists of eight clubs, including: Alfa Club of Colorado; Audi Club North America–Rocky Mountain Chapter; BMW Car Club of America–Rocky Mountain Chapter; Shelby American Automobile Club–Colorado Regional Chapter, Lotus Colorado; Mercedes Benz Club of America–Mile-High Section; Viper Club–Colorado Region; and Z Car Club of Colorado.)

These five "charter member" groups provided an initial investment of \$20,000 each and a commitment to improve and utilize the SCR facility. A committee of representatives of each of the five clubs was formed to provide the oversight and management of the track. The track was resurfaced and the facilities expanded over the next few years, and our motorsports community has enjoyed the use of a vastly improved Second Creek Raceway from 1999 through 2005. We all owe a great deal of appreciation to the people whose efforts made this possible: John Arnold and Jerry Schouten, CMC; Jim Christian, SCCA; Denny Burke, MRA; Chick Misura, PCA; John Obialero, RMVR; and Todd Eyster, MCCA.

When discussions to replace SCR began in early 2003, many options were presented. Ultimately, it was concluded that the new facility should be held by a separate entity and, in December 2003, CAMA was incorporated with the same five equal members (partners). CAMA made progress throughout 2004, cementing organizational structure and pursuing properties within our geographical goals. We lost a valuable motivator to our cause with the passing of Danny Collins who had served as the first official Manager of CAMA. In January of 2005, we were able to secure a contract for a 320-acre parcel, which we believe has the perfect zoning environment for our facility. This land is near the Front Range Airport, surrounded by commercially zoned land and a short (25 minute) drive from the Mousetrap. (Please don't visit the site until we complete permitting, which could stretch into early 2006-it is still a working farm with residents, and any irritation could affect the permitting process.) The five member groups have made and will continue to invest funds into CAMA, primarily utilizing excess rents generated by SCR and returned to the clubs for the intention of growing motorsports in the Denver area. The future usage of these funds will be at the direction of the five clubs and is yet to be determined. Possibilities envisioned include marketing efforts to promote our sport; providing security to our lease commitments; and accommodating other amateur club needs at the new facility.

Early on, we concluded that a "mirrored replacement" for SCR (short track length, no room for expansion or additional revenue sources) would not provide sufficient cash flow for debt service. Consequently, the CAMA plan grew to encompass multiple uses on the grounds so as to maximize revenue. While the CAMA representatives worked for two years to develop realistic operational and financing models, the reality was that owning a first-class facility close to Denver was slightly beyond our reach. The relationship with Sutton Motorsports ensures that we will have long term use of a first-class facility with multiple circuits, national visibility and reasonable rental rates. We see this relationship as the road to a new level for amateur motorsports in Colorado.

The agreements encompassing the "anchor tenant" program with CAMA will provide a continuation of the weekend scheduling so successful at SCR. This agreement also ensures that all clubs, large and small, have access to the facility. Further, the agreements give the CAMA clubs longterm security through financial or ownership changes. We even have first rights to buy the facility if such an opportunity were to develop down the road.

The CAMA management team and the Boards of all the member clubs are very excited about our new relationship with Sutton Motorsports.

We are confident that we have found a relationship to provide our new 'home' for many years to come.

Racetrack May Be Around Corner

Sutton International Motorsports, an affiliate of Centrix Financial, is tentatively planning to build an amateur racetrack on 320 acres south of Front Range Airport in Watkins.

Centennial-based Centrix is the owner of this weekend's Grand Prix of Denver race and a major NASCAR sponsor. The company's chief executive, Robert Sutton, is an amateur race-car driver who has twice won the Baja 1000.

"Bob Sutton is passionate about motor sports, but this is a business decision," said John Frew, the company's legal counsel. "He believes that if done right, this is a good longterm investment, both in the land and in the facilities."

The farm property is under contract with the Colorado Amateur Motorsports Association for an undisclosed amount. Sutton is in negotiations to take over the development rights.

Tom Ragonetti, a representative for the association, speculated it would cost up to \$10 million to buy the property and build the track.

The track would be a replacement for the Second Creek Raceway in Commerce City, which is closing in November.

Tentative plans call for two tracks totaling 4 miles to be used by auto clubs and private groups. It would not be open to a professional racing series such as this weekend's Grand Prix of Denver. "It won't have the infrastructure to handle large numbers of spectators," Frew said.

If the deal goes forward, the track could open in the spring of 2007.

Dennis Heap, director of aviation at Front Range Airport, said he would welcome a racetrack in his backyard.

"A racetrack would be a great benefit for us because there is a lot of crossover between car-racing enthusiasts and general aviation enthusiasts," he said. "And airports and racetracks both make a lot of noise, so those two land uses are very compatible." MSR

Does Your Sport Package Have a Wumpa-Wumpa?

ur 2001 530i Sport had an annoying habit of making a strange wumpa-wumpa-wumpa sound as it moved down the road. The noise started after just 4,000 miles of ownership but improved with the replacement of the first set of tires. Seven thousand miles later it was back. Sure enough the tires were wearing unevenly in such a severe fashion the tires were out of round. Unfortunately the initial diagnosis was - 'all Sport Packages do that'. From talking to a number of you it appears many of them do. But there is a solution. It involves a new set of tires and a proper four-wheel alignment of the car by a dealer or independent BMW shop that understands the Sport suspension. I don't want to blame BMW but I would hazard a guess that the factory isn't setting them up right or they are getting tweaked on their trans-Atlantic voyage. But don't expect BMW to fix it for you. For all BMW wants to know you knocked the alignment out by hitting a curb three or four times.

In our case the camber and toe settings were nearly off the chart. So far off that even my race car doesn't get those kinds of numbers. I am now happy to report that the Sport Package is a dream to drive and quiet as a Bavarian mouse. If you are experiencing this problem you might try my solution. I hope you get the same result. My final piece of advice is to buy a smooth tread pattern tire. BMWs come with Continentals or Michelins with smooth patterns and the suspensions are tuned with those tires in mind. My current set of tires is the quiet riding but high performance Michelin Pilot Sport A/S. MSR




V10 High-Performance Power Unit Featured in the BMW M5/M6 Is Awarded the Title "Engine of the Year 2005"

In addition to first prize as "Engine of the Year", awarded today at the Engine Expo 2005 in Stuttgart to the 373 kW (507 bhp) V10 high-performance engine powering the BMW M5 / M6, BMW engines also managed to scoop the following awards:

- V10 5.0-litre engine in the M5/M6: Best New Engine 2005
- V10 5.0-litre engine in the M5/M6: Best Performance Engine 2005
- V10 5.0-litre engine in the M5/M6: Winner in the class exceeding 4.0 liters
- 3.0-litre 535d Variable Twin Turbo-Diesel: Winner in the class 2.5 to 3.0 liters
- 3.2-litre six cylinder engine in the M3: Winner in the class 3.0 to 4.0 liters.





BMW Group in the U.S. Reports Best Month Ever for BMW Brand BMW Group Sales up 18 Percent for August; Year-to-Date Sales Rise 4.3 Percent

WOODCLIFF LAKE, NJ - SEPTEMBER 1, 2005... The BMW Group in the U.S. (BMW and MINI brands combined) reported impressive August sales of 28,879, an increase of 18 percent over the 24,501 vehicles sold the same month last year, for its second best month ever. The BMW Group also reported year-to-date sales of 200,562 vehicles, up 4 percent over the 192,233 vehicles sold in the first eight months of 2004.

BMW Brand

BMW reported its best sales month ever, with 25,537 vehicles sold, an increase of 15 percent over the 22,167 sold in August 2004. Previously, the best month for the BMW brand was December 2004, when sales of 25,482 BMWs were reported.

Year-to-date, BMW brand sales were up 1.2 percent, to 171,579 compared to 169,480 in the same period last year.

"Strong sales across all models, including BMW's new 3 Series and 7 Series automobiles, contributed to this recordbreaking month for the BMW brand," according to Tom Purves, chairman and CEO of BMW (US) Holding Corp.

August sales of BMW automobiles were up 13 percent, to 17,254 cars, compared to 15,305 sold in the same month

BMW Sports Activity Vehicle Sales

SAV sales were up 21 percent for the month to 8,283 vehicles, compared to 6,862 vehicles sold in August 2004. Year-to-date, sales of BMW's two SAV models are up 11 percent, to 47,173 vehicles compared to 42,595 in the same period of 2004.

BMW Produces 500,000th X5 Sports Activity Vehicle

SPARTANBURG, SC... BMW Manufacturing Co. produced its 500,000th X5 Sports Activity Vehicle June 10, 2005, just five and a half years after its market introduction.

The milestone vehicle is an X5 3.0d, equipped with a 3.0-liter inline six-cylinder diesel engine and outfitted with Midnight Blue exterior paint, Walknappa Champagne leather, Mahogany Maritime fine-wood trim, and light alloy V-spoke 19-inch wheels. The 500,000th X5 was shipped and delivered to a customer in Hamburg, Germany.




